BY-LAWS OF THE

BEINAP OR BELKNAP SURNAME ORGANIZATION

- I. The name of this society shall be "Belnap and or Belkmap Surname Organization."
- II. Any direct descendant of a Belnap, whether the name is spelled Belnap or Belknap shall be eligible to membership in this organization.

III. IV. The organization badge to be worn is a miniture of the original "Coat of Arms" of the Belknap family.

V. There shall be a Board of Directors of this Organization consisting of one member of each of the following families:

VI. There shall be a President, First and Second Vice-Presidents, a Secretary and Treasurer, and a Historian all to be selected by the group at large at one of their regular meetings. There shall also be a genealogist too be chosen by the Board of Directors. There shall be a Temple committee, chosen as above set forth consisting of a Chairman, a Genealogist and a recording secretary. The officers mentioned in this paragraph shall be chosen at any annual meeting by the group at large and in order to qualify must be a direct descendant of a Belnap and / or a Belknap, and shall hold office for a period of one year or until their successors are elected and qualify.

VII. All records accumulated by the Association shall be the property of the Organization.

a. The Organization shall provide a suitable place and files for the protection and perpetuation of its records.

VIII. The Board of Directors may include a representative from any other Belknap family not mentioned in Article V. above.

IX. The Board of Directors shall automatically become members of the Temple Committee.

X. In the event of the death of the President, the First Vice President shall act and so on down the line of officers, and the Board of Directors shall appoint a new director when a vacancy occurs.

XI. Any direct descendant of a Belnap and or Belknap family, or one who is married into the Belnap family, and or Belknap family, shall be allowed to vote at any general election held at a reunion.

XII. All meetings of the group shall be subject to the call of the presedent. Any three directors may call a meeting by giving notice through the Secretary.

XIII. Membership shall be one dollar per year per family.

XIV. Organization expenses must be approved by the President and Secretary before payment may be made.

XV. The Board of Directors and elective officers shall study the Utah genealogical family organization together with other sources and adopt for the next year ensuing regulations defining the duty of each officer.

The regulations as adopted shall be submitted to the next regular meeting at a family reunion for approval.

When lunch had been served the different family groups assembled in their cars and went to the Ogdon City Cemetary where they placed flowers on the graves of Gilbert Belnap, the Utah Pioneer, and his immediate family.

One of the most interesting parts of the program was the Historical Sketch of the Belnap family given by Hyrum Belnap, son of Gilbert Belnap, which was as follows:

"Mr. Chairman, and fellow kinsmen: The purpose for this gathering of all those who bear the name of Belnap or Belknap from many of the States of our Union is to promote fellowship and renew acquaintance among each other and to instill into the hearts of the coming generations, who bear our name, the ideals and principals of honor, integrity, and good will toward men that we have so long cherished and practiced."

"When the Puritan fathers were making their struggle for religious tolerance in England, they were compelled to cross the channel to Holland to obtain peace. The whole European country practically being under the control of royalty satisfaction was not obtained here in Holland. In 1620 these Pilgrim fathers boarded ship and came to america. This little band of people who had put personal welfare second and community interest first, soon posted high on the hill tops, "this is the land of the free and the home of the brave, and hold it self evident that all men

"Among these people who first planted their feet upon American soil, were, Abraham Belknappe, his wife Marky, four sons and one daughter. I have learned through research and travel that we who are gathered here are the descendents of this good femily. Some of the Belknap femilies that I have met spell the name Belknap, others spell it Belnap and still others spell it Bealknap. Each and every one of them who have kept records, claim to have come from some one of these four brothers above mentioned."

"History pertaining to different spelling of the name Belnap is this: Shortly after the death of Abraham Belknappe in September 1645, his children discarded one P and the E. leaving it spelled Belknap. Gilbert Belnap, my father, went east in 1873-74 and visited his relatives in Michigan, Chio, Pennsylvania, New York and Canada. Upon his return he told this story; that there were two brothers living in the New England States that desired a distinction between their families. One lived up in the northern part of the New England States. The other one left the K out of the spelling, making it Belnap was Jesse Belnap who was born in Hebron Conn. August 21, 1760. He joined the Revolutionary Army at Hebron, Conn. in 1777, and in 1779 while the army was camped in Reding Conn, he married a resident girl there by the name of Eunice Hall. He was released from the axams army in 1780. Later he moved to western New York and then to North East Erie, Penn. This information is on file at Washington, D. C. in affidavits xmax made by himself and others, and was filed in 1832. He died at North East Erie, Penn. when 94 years old."

"Gilbert Belnap also stated that when about eighteen years old that he visited his grand father. Jesse Belnap, at North East Eire, Penn., where he saw their large Bible containing a record of the marriage of his grand father and grand mother as well as a record showing that three brothers that came from England were their encestors. His uncle, David Belnap became heir to these records which were later destroyed by fire."

"In 1908 I visited Hebron, Conn, looking up records and found that the court house had burned down some Tifty years was before. Then I went to Washington D. C. in order to find great grand father Jesse Belnap's parents names from his enlistment papers in the Revolutionary Army in 1777. They too advised me that the Capitol was burned in 1812 by the enemy and they could do nothing for me. I returned to Hartford, Con. and found in the will of one Samuel Belknap who married Mary Dickson, July 9th, 1723 the following childrens names: March 3, 1724 1-Mary Belkap, born 7, 1726 2-Simeon " June Uet 29, 1728 June 13, 1731 May 15, 1734 93 3-Job 4-Ebeneger 5-Samuel " 费费 Sept 15, 1736 April 9, 1739, at somers, Conn. The \$ 2 92 6-Able 발분 records show that this Jesse only received some personal property, as his share of the estate."

"I traced this Jesse into Caselton, Vt., where he was chosen town clerk, who's duty it was to record all births, deaths and marriages. Here I found his own records in the hands of Judge Clark. Jesse Belkmap records that he came there from Connecticut in 1771. In his own hand writing he records the following: My wife Eunice died July 25, 1774. My eldect daughter Bette by my wife Eunice died Sept. 17, 1777. My third daughter Clive by my wife Eunice died Sept. 25th, 1777. Judge Clark said, 'there must have been some contagious discuse here taking so many away at the same time.' Besse Belkmap them married one Beborah Hathway, and he records; Ruth from my wife Deborah was born Nov. Al. 1782. My second son Jesse was born May 21, 1784. My third son augustus was born June 29th, 1787, etc. I employed a historian in Hartford, Conn. and he later informed me that Somers and Hebron are a few miles apart, and from the research that he made, that Jesse Belkmap born in Somers in 1739 was the father of Jesse Belmap born Aug 31, 1760. That the son of Jesse Belkmap from his second wife Deborah Hathway born in 1782 and the son from the first wife Eunice, born in Hebron, Conn. Aug 31, 1760 are the two brothers that made a distinction in their names by the Hebron Jesse leaving the K from the spelling of the Belkmap name."

"The Newburgh record written in 1875 informs us that our American Belknaps can be satisfactorily traced back to Sir Robert Belknappe who was Chief Justice in England in 1375. When I was in bondon in 1913 looking over the records they disclose that the Belknappe's came down to England with the Normans in 1066 when William the Conqueror overpowered that land. There are several Belknap's who have held very prominent places in England."

"Some of the Belknap's who deserve honorable mention are; Abraham Belknappe, his wife Mary, who came from England, and their children, Abraham, Jr., Jermy, Joseph, Samuel, and Hannah who married Christopher Osgood. These people cut down the timber, cleared the brush and made ip possible for those who followed to enjoy this good land. Jermy Belknap wrote the New England history. Dr. Belknap was referred to frequently by Webster when complise compiling the Webster Dictionary. Isaac Belknap, and army officer, fought side by side with Washington in the Revolutionary War. Washington chose his daughter, a school teacher, to march with him at the head of that march in the great ratification dance at the close of the War. W. W. Belknap afrancaskapida was secretary of war in the cabinet under Pres. Grant. Belknap of Grand Rapids, Mich. an officer in the Civil War was chairman of the commission who placed the battle ground markers at Chattanooga, Tenn. and the surrounding country. Judge Belknap, associate justice in the Nevada Supreme Court.

In this western part of the United States. California, Oregon, Washington, Nevada and Utah, belknapds were among the early pioneers. In this city where we are enjoying ourselves, Gilbert Belnap was her first Marshal in 1850; later attorney and County Commissioner. For 20 years he was Bishop of Hooper, Utah. His wife was at the head of the Rolief Bociety organizations. His children are leaders in every district where they live. There are many others deserving of mention."

"Fellow kinsmen, in closing permit me to talk to the young folks. Honor the name you bear; do not be one that will bring repreach upon the name Belknap. Respect your parents; honor the aged, for true it is that one cannot live in happiness without the aid and association of his fellow men. To illustrate let me tell a story:

One time when we were traveling in Henderson County, Tenn. we stopped with zem Judge Read. Passing the time looking over his large bible we saw on the front lead In the center was a circle enclosing a clean white a picture. surface. This represented a plain where a new babe was born. On the one side was a stair leading up to another plain on which was an alter. A man was kneeling at the alter receiving a crown from the hand of an angel. The stair way leading to the alter had seven steps on each of which was written a word. Beginning at the bottom they read, virtue, knowledge, temperance patience, Goddiness, brotherly kindness and charity. On the other side of the plain where the babe was born and reared to manhood, was another stairway leading down to a pit. This too, had seven steps. Beginning at the top and going down were the following words: UnVirtue, lack of knowledge, intemperance, impatience, ungodliness, without brotherly kindness, without charity. Under this picture was written, 2nd Peter Chapter 1, verses 1 to 11. Live the principles named on those steps leading upwards and we one and all will go step by step higher and higher until we reach that beautiful alter where God our Father and our Mother dwells. There to associate with our elder brother Jesus Christ. For 'God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.' Believe me, those who walk down those seven steps into the pit will there meet there fellow mate, the ape, the monkey, Lucifer, whom they descended from, there to suffer eternal punishment."

"I am so thankful that my name is beloap and that I had the privelege of coming through such a noble race of people. Yes. I am doubly thankful that I was raised by such parents as my father and mother. They taught me all my life to climb the ladder going up to that higher plain. They advised me to avoid the ladder leading down into the pit, as I would an adder. Again, be thankful for the name and your parentage. And though obstacles be purposely placed in your rath, follow the Saviorr's pattern, "forgive them, for they know not what they do."

REUNION--August 6,1932

An officers meeting of the Gilbert Belnap family organization was held Saturday Oct. 13, 1956, at 7.00 p.m., in the 20th Ward Chapel, Ogden, Utah.

The purpose of this meeting was to meet with the retiring officers to review what has been accomplished during their term of office, and to acquaint the new officers with their future duties.

Elmer Belnap newly elected president of the Gilbert Belnap family organization presided and conducted.

President Belnap expressed his appreciation for all that had been accomplished during the time that Lester Balnap was president, and called for a vote of thanks.

Volney Belnap, former 1st Vice President, then reported on what had been accomplished. Their aim had been to get as much data as possible on the Belnap family, then to have that information recorded in written form and by pictures. He reported the successful publishing of the Centennial Issue in honor of the Utah Pioneer Gilbert Belnap and the two succeeding supplements.

The Hyrum Belnap records, A, B, and C, books were copied and placed in the care of Genealogist Gilbert Mariott.

Lester Belnap, former President, agreed that the work of the organization had been successful and the publishing of the book outstanding.

Lester Belnap also acted as Director for the Oliver Belnap family and Volney Belnap acted as Director for Hyrum Belnap family.

Meeting of the Board of Directors

Elmer Belnap President read the By Laws of the organization, and pointed out places where the meaning is not clear. He suggested that revision be made.

A motion was put before the house to separate the office of Secretary and Treasurer and appoint a new Treasurer to take care of the money. The motion was made and seconded and carried. Arias Belnap, was chosen, dependent upon his acceptance, as he was not present.

Gilbert Mariott, genealogist reported that he has collected many family group sheets during his term of office. He said that he really did not have the time to do all that he desired and suggested that a genealogy committee be appointed to assist him. This suggestion was put in the form of a motion and the motion was carried.

The following committee was appointed; Gilbert Marriott, Chairman, with DellafBelnap Lilly Hale and Zeruah Thomson as committee members.

A motion was presented before the house that Gilbert Mariott be chosen family representative, and his name to appear on temple sheets instead of the heir previously used. The motion was carried and the secretary was instructed to notify the genealogical library of the selection.

A discussion as to what should be the amount of the dues was carried on and it was decided that it be left to the discretion of the officers and the necessity for funds.

Gilbert Mariott requested permission to use the \$50.00 available for genealogical purposes. The request was granted.

Those present were Elmer Belnap, President, Alpha Crow, Secretary, Arias Belnap, Treasurer, Marion Kerr, Historian, and Dellam Belnap, Genealogical Committee Member. Walter Kerr and Allen S. Crow, husbands of the officers were also present.

Opening prayer was offered by Arias Belnap. A brief report was given by those present. Arias reported that there now is \$256.67 in the Treasury, \$85.50 was from dues, the balance from the sale of books. Della reported that there are plenty of Centennial Issues of the history of Gilbert Belnap, also the two supplements. The complete book costs \$9.00. The percentage of those who pay their dues is very small. Marion Kerr gave a report on the clippings she has received and made notations on a number of other family accomplishments to be added to her history. She also reported that Victor Belnap has been searching the University of Utah Library and found a great deal on the Belnap family.

Next there was a general discussion as to ways and means of getting the Genealogical and Temple Committee to function. Suggestions were made that a paid genealogist be obtained, preferably a member of the family. It was suggested that there were courses that could be taken on the subject. The Belnap family directors meeting as held Aug. 15, 1959, at the 20th Ward Chapel, in Ogden, Utah.

Opening prayer by Lorenzo Belnap. The minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Secretary and were approved.

Marion Kerr spoke on clippings and asked for more pictures from each family. She reported that she was busy copying Flora's work.

Secretaries report

It was suggested that each family representative shoulder more responsibility in the Belnap organization, that because of the enormous size of the organization the President needs more help.

Wilford Belnap reported that their family has held 3 reunions. Also he suggested that the President, the Secretary and the Historian could organize to get newsof births, deaths, etc., to be published in a family paper. This paper to be sent to each family of the organization.

Della&Belnap, the researcher reported the selling of books. She remarked that a great deal of Temple work is being done that isnt reported or recorded in the organization and she suggested that money could be made by having more family pictures made and sold.

Elmer Belnap the president thanked all present for the success of the last Meunion. He reported a geneological film previously owned by Lillie Hale has been taken to Idaho Falls where some 16 pages have been copied. This film contains Belnap Family Group Sheets and short family stories.

DIRECTORS MEETING OF THE BELNAP FAMILY ORGANIZATION

A Belnap family organization directors meeting was held at the home of Wilford Belnap 11/14 West 1500 South, Bountiful, Utah on Nov. 21, 1959, at 1 p.m. Meeting was called for the purpose of discussing ways and means of getting the histories of all the grandchildren of Gilbert Belnap and his wives as proposed at the last directors meeting. BOARD MEETING BELNAP FAMILY ORGANIZATION

The officers and family representatives of the Belnap family organization met in the 20th Ward of Kdaho Falls, Idaho, July 16, 1960 at 2.00 p.m.

Elmer Belnap, President called the meeting to order. The opening song was Joseph Smith's First Prayer. Wilford Belnap offered the opening prayer.

Elmer Belnap spoke of the blessings that come from our association with one another and the love we gain in sharing.

Gilbert Marriott gave a report on the various methods of making copies of the Belnap Family Records. He said the Verifax method might prove too laborious, The Multilif method would cost about \$2000 so it isnt feasible. He is investigating the Bruunen method and thinks it might be feasible. This task of copying the family records as there are more than a thousand family group sheets, is a big project. However, it would help geneologists to get more work done if a record of what has been done were available. Gilbert promised to have more facts and details by the Reunion. If it were possible to borrow a Bruunen machine that would be a good plan. It was pointed out by Zeruah that carbon copies of typing get blurred very easily.

Wilford Belnap wished all family representatives to encourage their families to write their personal histories. He asked that besides the history which should only be a synopsis, not more than 2000 words be written and that a small picture of the person the history is about be submitted. They are to also send in a family group sheet of your own family, including you, your brothers and sisters. Be sure your address is included as well as all the others on your chart.

There should be a family organization in each unit of the Gilbert Belnap family, and each unit should supply a delegate to the Central Belnap organization. Money could be raised by each family group to promote a paid researcher.



Minutes of the business meeting of the Belnap Family Organization held Aug. 25, 1962. Meeting was held at the Gelande Lodge, located in the Snow Basin Ski Area, seventeen miles east of Ogden.

President Volney B. Belnap called the meeting to order at 10;30 A.M. The following officers were present, Volney B. Belnap, President, Aaron B. Ross, Vice Pres., Wilford Belnap Vice Pres., Alpha Crow, Sec., Arias G. Belnap, Treas. Marion B. Kerr, , Historian, Gilbert Marriott, Genealogist and Della Belnap, Researcher.

The meeting was called to consider any matters pertaining to the organization. There was a good attendance present. A family representative was present for all fifteen children of Gilbert Belnap, except the family of Rueben Balnap.

The first order of Business was a report given by Gilbert Marriott on the progress of one phase of our genealogy work, He reported that the officers, earlier in the year, had assigned him to get out a record of the ascending and descending lines of the Belnap family. This record to be so organized, in book form, that it could be placed in genealogy libraries where ever the family organization would want them.

He reported the organization suggested they be placed in libraries at Logan, Utah, Pocatella and Idaho Falls, and Boise, in Idaho. He said a similar record was already in the Salt Lake Library of the L. D. S. Church. He also reported he had made copies of the necessary sheets to complete one book but did not have it put together as yet. He had been assisted by Wilford Belnap and Rex Lindsay.

Henry Belnap then explained a ylan of having the name of Gilbert Belnap, our first pioneer, to enter the Salt Lake Valley, placed on a bronze plate located in the Memorial Theater building, in Salt Lake City, Utah.

It was requested that all those interested leave a contribution with Treasurer, Arias G. Belnap. All money donated was to be turned over to Henry Belnap to be used for the above purpose.

Next order of business was the report of the Treasurer, Arias G. Belnap, as follows:

RESOLUTION BY WILFORD BELNAP

RESOLUTION PROPOSING THE EXPANSION OF THE GILBERT BELNAP FAMILY ORGANIZATION TO GENERATE GREATER INTEREST, AFFORD INCREASED ACTIVITY AND MORE FULLY PROMOTE THE PURPOSES OF THE PATRIARCHIAL ORDER.

of WHEREAS, the descendants Gilbert Belnap now number thousands and divergent interests have scattered many families to all parts of the world, direct contact by the central organization has become unwieldy:

AND WHEREAS, equal representation of all family units is necessary to promote the intent of the Belmap Society, (a) by co-ordination and compiling of acceptable records, (b) unify research and tabulation by operating through a central clearing house, (c) establish research material in libraries convenient to families where feasible, (d) organize member-families under the names of the children of Gilbert Belmap with full complement of officers and committees as set up in the parent society, (d) provide adequate dues and research funds to effect genealogical motivation.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- That member families be organized as set forth above.
- 2. That times and places of meeting shall be set to avoid conflict with the central society.
- 3. Family members shall appoint a representative who may be a member of the genealogical, research, and temple committee; who shall be a delegate to the central society or other member units, where pertinent business is involved.
- It shall be the duty of the representatives to collaborate with the central executive committee to promote the purposes and business of the overall organization. Delegates shall have power to legislate; act as clearing-house agents, nominate elective and other officers of the parent society, and confirm same by majority vote as need arises.
- 5. When families hold reunions, singly or in groups, where important matters pertaining to all are considered, exchange of representatives should be encouraged both by family and parent society.
- 6. Training classes and work groups, especially for the youth, should be set up as a permanent program, under supervision of competent directors; to expand research and temple work, compile personal and family histories, promote executive ability to further the general program of the Belnap Society.
- 7. To effect the terms and conditions proposed herein, the president of the parent society shall appoint a committee to study the Constitution and By-Laws of the Belnap Society and adapt the same to harmonize herewith and conform generally with the Genealogical Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Mr. President, I recommend the adoption of this resolution.







BELNAP REUNION

Aug. 22, 1964

The morning meeting was in the form of a work shop. The opening prayer was given by Flora Dotson. Della Belnap gave a sketch of the first Belnap known in history.

In England our people were known as "Sir _____ Belknapp"- mobility and royalty.

In 1635 our family emigrated from Mertfordshire, England, landing above Boston and settling in Massachusetts. Asland grant furnishes this information. Gradually they have spread out over almost the far corners of the United States and also located in Eastern Canada. Our Jessie Belnap was in the Revolutionary War.

In 1750 Jonathan Belnap freed his colored slave, being one of the first to offer this. In 1770 a large group of the family settled in Newburg, New York. There is still a Fridge there called Belnap Ridge the Daughters of the American Revolution have preserved Isaac Belnap's house there.

From New York the Belnap's moved to Pennsylvania and finally into Ohio. Gilbert Belnap came out west with the pioneers, and arrived in Utah the 15 of September 1850. The first winter he dug, a dug out in the hill near where Bella now lives, later building a home.

Gilbert Belnap wasn't the first Belnap to come west. Earkier Belnap(s settled in Eugene, Oregon., and there is a Belnap town No 1 and No.2. The name Belknap is given to a town in Illinous also one in Ohip. There is one named Belknap in Vermont also.

Dn Ogden there is a Belnap plat and there is a street called Belnap Circle.

Della also showed hereBook of Remembrance.

The next on the program was Merle Belnap and she showed her very complete and interesting Book of Rememberance. After her Jewel Van Orden showed a chart on the Beltoff original form of the name Belnapp.

The first Beltof was in Empirica. Bel means beautiful, and toft means hill, or the people of the beautiful hilb. In the 1400 they moved to France. There the name was changed to Belknol . Bell meaning beautiful and noll meaning hill. At the time the Hugenotts were being persecuted these people went to England. The name there being changed to Biknappe, but meaning the same as above. It was 1635 when they came to America, and settle d in Massachusetts. The p and the e were left off the name and became Belknap. It was Jesse in the family who left of the k, and thus it was as we now spell it, Belnap.

This chart was prepared by Charlene Belnap and Richard B Taylor, of California, whows fifteen generations of the Belnap family or a five hundred year period. Reprints of this chart can be had for \$10.00. The chart starts with John Beltoff of Austria and connects with Jessie Belnap.

Last on the program was Flora Dotson who took a few minutes to explain the quir contest that was to be conducted during the lumch hour.

MINUTES OF MEETING OF BELNAP FAMILY ORGANIZATION BOARD MEMBERS January 3, 1965

The meeting of the organization was held at Mrs. H. Earl Belnap in Ogden. President Lorenzo Belnap presided and Alpha Crow opened with prayer at 2:00 o'clock p.m. The main purpose of the meeting was to select a new vice president. The groupapproved to send a letter of appreciation to Ronald Belnap for his services.

President Lorenzo Belnap read from the by-laws the duties of the vice president and how he should be reappointed.

Four names, M. Wesley Cox, Max Belnap, Dr. Howard Belnap, Hal Belnap, were suggested and the motion was made by Ethel H. McEntire and seconded by Alpha Crow to accept these four names for consideration. Lorenzo suggested that we choose and alternate. By secret ballot Howard Belnap, with M. Wesley Cox as alternate, were elected.

A letter was read by Zeruah Thompson was Charlene Belnap Taylor and her pedigree chart was shown. Lorenzp proposed that we send her a Gilbert Belnap family book in exchange for a chart for the family library. The proposal was accepted and Delha Belnap was authorized to send the book.

In a report from Della she recommended that we call this the "Belnap Family Organization" instead of the "Gilbert Belnap Family Organization" so that research may be done on all lines. If necessary this may be corrected at the reunion next year.

Della has asked Mr. A. M. Colliard to compile the records and wills etc., and tie them together in the English Research. This will take more time and more money. They will be documented.

The Salt Lake Genealogical Library proposed that we take the \$50 Family Records to Dr. Delbert Roach and he will photograph it and put all of it on one film. MINUTES OF BELNAP FAMILY OFFICER' MEETING AT HOME OF DELLA BELNAP July 15, 1965 at 7:00 p.m.

Those in attendance were: Lorenzp Belnap, Keith Belnap, and Della Belnap. Mrs. Evelyn Belnap, wife of KE ith Belnap, was present and acted as secretary in the absence of LaRue Willis. Mrs. Willis was excused because of an emergency operation on one of her children. Flora Dotson was also excused.

Reply correspondence resulting from the newsletter recently mailed to the descendants was reviewed. Some twenty or more replies have been received to date, most of them containing contributions and/or orders for materials. The exact amount of money so received has not been tabulated but is in the approximate of \$100.

Della reported on her recent visit to Boise, and Rexburg, Idaho, where she met with hroups of family relatives and organized them into research groups, assigning them ancestral lines of our progenitors for genealogical research.

President Lorenzp gave a report on his attendance at the joint family reunion of the Mary Belnap Lowe and Adeline Belnap Lowe families, held at Franklin, Idaho. He also reported that he would attend the reunions of the Augustus Belnap family to be held in Salt Lake City, July 24. He said that he was royally received at Franklin and felt that he accomplished some good in explaining the objectives of our organization in furthering research and obtaining the descending family names for our records.

It was then discussed to some length how we may proceed to get the descendant families to hold regular reunions and organize themselves into effective organizations through which we can channel necessary information both to them and from them for a more effective workable organization. It was decided that a letter would be drafted by Keith and mailed to the family representatives and encourage them to hold reunions. It was felt that if we offered to give them help in setting up their organizations, and educate them to do research that we may be able to create interest in the genealogical work, and so obtain as a secondary effect more cooperation with the parent family and its objectives. An enclosure, a sheet of information setting forth helps in getting the individual's family group sheets, as per the request of the LDS church program, would be mailed with the letter.

A number of corrections were found necessary in the large family group record that has been published and sold to some interested family members and for placement in libraries. A compulation of the corrections will be made and forwarded to those who have the books. Along with this will be sent a complete index without charge.

A central commettee will be set up for the purpose of correlating the materials sent by the research groups and for other purposes that may come up from time to time. The following names were proposed for this committee to work under Della's direction: Margo M. Shaw, Wendell Belnap, Voletta Blanch and Charlene Simpson.

Della will get a group together in Boontiful, Utah, and organize them to to research. Lorenzo will see if one can be organized in Los Angeles area and will attempt to get a group tegether when he visits there in August.

I guess that this will bring you up to date on wht we are trying to get started. We had good sucess with the last news letter having had only 10 returns of addresses unknown. When you realize that our mailing list should be three times the number that we km now have to enable us to reach all the possible decendants one can readily see what a tremendous task we have before us to get a record of the decending lines complete. I feel that it is as important to keep track of the decendants as it is the ancestral lines, and if the organization is to live effectively we must obtain and keep a close relationship with the decending families, otherwise when the second generation families are gone we will be so widely scattered that to bring them together would be impossible, for the simple reas on that they would lose track of from whom they came. We find that that is the case in some instances now, for we have talked to some of the younger generation and they did not know who their great grand father was let alone who Gilbert Belnap was, who incidently would be their great, great grandfather. I would like to see each first generation family from Gilbert completely organized into a unit which would be able to keep contact with all of each ones decendants, and relay this information to the parent organization. The parent organization would keep them informed of the ancestral work being done and what is available to do, and so make assignments to those whom may desire to be actively engaged in genealogy research from the official records of the family. This plan would end the expensive duplications that we have experienced in the past and keep the program in strict order so that we would all know what had been done, what we were now doing, and what could be done for future activity for the entire family. Them our finances would be put to the most economical and effective use and every one would know that their efforts were going for the maximum benefit of the family as a whole.

This is the message that I am preaching to the reunions which I attend, along with a desperate appeal for financing, and the disposition of the materials we have available.

Thanks for all you have done, and I hope that all will be well with you.

- 7. Motion for appointment of Della Belnap as vice president to take the place of Ronald Belnap was made by Dr. Howard Belnap and seconded by Richard D. Belnap. Approved by the group.
- 8. Lorenzo called for recommendations for vice presidents for next year.
 Austin Belnap was nominated for any office. Della proposed and Knight Kerrecommended that the president be elected for two terms. Dr. Howard Belnap suggested that the first vice president (genealogical) remain.
- 9. President Lorenzo commended Della for the work she does.
- 10. President Lorenzo asked if it were desired that a committee be chosen to rephrase the by-laws. Keith Belnap made a motion that a committee be appointed by Lorenzo. Motion seconded by Della, approved by the group. A committee was appointed consisting of Knight Kerr, Richard Belnap, Ezra Belnap.
- 11. Keith Belnap reported that Joe Dial will take charge of reunion. Date, August 27. - 12. Lorenzo report on a chart that reveals that the whereabouts of about half of our living relatives is unknown. Dean Belnap stated that we have only one ancestor immigrant. Dean also advised that the temple was closed a few years ago because names were lacking. We can now extract all names of our kinfolk even though they may or may not be on our direct line. President McKay says that during the next ten years the Church intends to put us on a more patriarchal order. The time will come when a priesthood member will have to prove his priesthood before he can enter the temple. The vast majority of our ancestors, those of us in the church, from the present day back to the time of the Magna Carta, are willing and ready to accept the gospel of Jesus Christ in the Spirit World.
- 13. Dr. Dean advanced \$2.50 to John Stahles, Bountiful, to research family names from microfilm. The computer reveals that 25% of the parishes are on register on microfilm around Sawbridgeworth, England.

MINUTES OF MEETING OF BELNAP FAMILY ORGANIZATION OFFICERS April 2, 1966

The meeting was called to order by President Lorenzo Belnap at 2:30 p.m. Prayer was offered by Della Belnap.

Date of the reunion was discussed; two suggested dates were 27th and the 20th. The 20th was decided upon unless all the arrangements are made.

The group approved \$15.00 advance to Keith for rental of the hall.

Joe Dial cannot help with the reunion. Lester Belnap was appointed to check the building and facilities.

The problem of activating the family organization to do genealogy work was discussed. Lorenzo Belnap suggested that we call a meeting of the presidents of families, and familiy representatives of the family organization and heads of the research groups. Flora Dotson motioned that this meeting be held and all family officers, the board of directors and the heads of the research groups be invited, or done as a call. It was decided to hold the meeting, but work out the details in the next meeting.

Discussion was held regarding change in by-laws. The Committee's recommendations were discussed, and the by-laws were altered as follows:

Section 15: The President of the Gilbert Belnap family organization shall the permitted to remain in office for more than one term at a time; but may become a candidate for election to succeed himself, but for not more than three successive terms. president of

Section 16: The incumbents first, second and third vice presidents presidents shall be the only eligible candidates for office of the Gilbert Belnap family organization. The incumbent vice presidents may be candidates to succeed themselves as vice presidents.

Flora reported from a publication that a vice president be chosen from a certain area as well as the heads of the research groups.

Della reported that nothing had been heard from Colliard; that no word was received regarding the coat of arms even though the money had been sent.

There have been two films placed in the Los Angeles City Bibrary covering from Gilbert Belnap back to 1500 as the Gilbert Belnap organization record. Also in the Lansing, Michigan State Library and the Salt Lake library. In the Patronés file in the archives, the book has been placed in sheets in alphabetical order. This has also been done at the B.Y.U. library.

Reports from the research heads were read by Della.

Flora was appointed to select materials for publication in the Book of Remembrance.

Brother Frank Smith is proceeding energetically with his responsibilities and seems to have taken quite an interest in the work.

We are now restricting Brother John Stables to only direct line surnames in his ten mile radius extraction. This limits him to three surnames other than the Belnap surname, and will allow him to proceed mere rapidly.

A proposal was made by Dean Belnap that the present slate of officers remain in office by acclamation.

President Lorenzo Belnap stated that the chair rules that the motion can not be made until after the by-laws are changed.

It was moved by Garth Belnap and Seconded by Ethel McEntire that H. Austin's name be accepted as secondovice president by acclamation. Approved.

It was moved by Jewel Furniss and Seconded by Stokebrook that Gordon Belnap be accepted by acclamation as third vice president. Approved.

Volney Belnap moved and Audrey Patterson seconded that the name of Coelin H Holbrook because president as secretary be accepted by acclamation. Approved.

The proposed changes to the by-laws were read by President Lorenzo Belnap/

Hal Belnap, Richard Belnap, and Herman Stoker were appointed judges of the election.

Comments by Keith Belnap were to the effect that he did not wish to act as president because of numerous other committments.

Della reported that the tax deeds had been sent to the church and photostated of the homeof Vinson Knoght in Nauvoo.

Because of the absence of Marion Kerr, historian, Keith read her report. He called for any contributions to the history of the family. The report was turned over to Lorenzo for the minutes.

Community singing, "Our Mountain Home So Dear" and "O Happy Home Among the Hills", and "America" were led by Garth and Velma.

The report of the descendants was given.

Keith introduced Dean Belnap as the speaker.

77 sheets have been cleared and placed in the Logan Temple 207 sheets were reported today -- sent in as a result of the research of John Staples.

Dean moved that the central family organization continue to Goordinate the genealony. Hal supplemented the motion to the effect that the second generation be made aware of this coordination and the officers of the second generation actively participate in the coordination. This motion was seconded by Gordon Belnap and Rex Lindsay and was approved.

Meeting adjourned.

DREAM OF PRESIDENT LORENZO BELNAP

The following treatise is a dream that was given to the writer the night of May 19, 1965. (Lorenzo Belnap) I had been chosen by election to be the president of the Belnap Family Organization at their bi-annual reunion held in August of 1964. The summer was approaching and I felt a need for activity of the family officers to encourage greater genealogical participation among the many families of our kin. I had offered to attend the reunions of the Children Families of the Parent Organization in an effort to explain our objectives and solicit their cooperation in a more complete and effective accomplishment of our goals. With this brief explanation I will now relate my dream.

"I was attending a meeting of some of our relative families and was asked to address the assembly. As I arose to speak it seems we were in a small auditorium which was well filled with a mixed group of adults and their children. I started my speech by expressing my feeling of honor that had been accorded me as being chosen for the leadership of our great family organization which numbered well into the thousands of descendants of our common progenitors.

Just as I was making that expression the rear wall and the side walls became invisible and I could wee beyond them where a large number of people were walking in small groups. Their faces were all turned in the same direction and they were all moving steadily along. I observed one of their number that was down on the ground vainly struggling to rise. She reached out her arms for assistance from those around her but they either could not see her or were unable to give her assistance as they completely ignored her efforts to attract them. When I concluded that none of those around her would give her aid I asked if some member of the congregation would please go to her and help her to her feet so that she could go with those of her group.

At that moment the area of vision expanded and I could see many thousnads of people, all determinedly heading toward some distant goal. This vista resembled somewhat anexpansive beach, the end of which I could not see. The light, as of a brilliant sunrise, glowed brightly in the heavens and the hordes of people were heading towards the light. Most all of them moved at a steady pace, seemingly oblivious of anything occurring around them, as they unhesitantly strode on to their destination. A few, that is a few in comparison to the many thousands which I could see, were like unto the first one I saw struggling to attain their feet, but could not of their own efforts. Their arms outstretched to the passersby begging for assistance, but being totally ignored in their pleas. I spok loudly and asked if someone would please help those poor souls to rise that they too could join the others as they so much desired to do.

I was deeply moved and somewhat perturbed at this conduct and I shouted, "Why don't you help those unfortunate souls?" A firm, strong voice came from somewhere and from someone I could not see and said, "You are the one who must help these people. You are not only the president of those on earth, but you are the leader responsible for all of your family kin. You are the one to whom they are pleading for help."

The dream ended here and as I awakened I lay for some time pondering its significance and I firmly resolved that while I served as president of our family organization that I quuld give my best efforts in the accomplishment of those duties expected of me.

Minutes of the Belnap Family Organization officers meeting was held at the home of President Della A. Belnap, 815 32nd St. Ogden, Utah, 5 November 1966 at 1:30 PM.

Those present: Della Belnap, J. Francis Belnap & Mrs. Belnap, Austin Belnap, Flora Dotson, Lorenzo Belnap & Vera, Henry Belnap, Coelin R. Holbrook.

Pres. Della presiding. Lorenzo Belnap stated that during the years 1965 and 1966. the presidency endeavered to set up Family Reunions of all branches of the Belnap families, during the opposite year of the regular reunion and of the 15 potential reunions only three were held; The Lowe Family, Francis Family and the Hammon Famild. He suggested the new officers push these reunions and more be held in 1967. He said the living posterity of Belnaps is around 5,000 with only 200 attending reunions encourage younger generation to grasp hold of this work, the 3rd generation of Belnaps

Pres. Della said Frank Smith, researcher in England had been paid \$200.00 and 161 new sheets have been sent in. James Parker, researcher was paid \$100.00. The August Reunion in Shelley wasn't too well attended and the expenses were \$149.00. Our fund bslance is low.

She also suggested that Dr. Howard Belnap be paid for the "Belnap Coat of Arms" that he had printed for the organization last year.

Three copies of the "Story of Gilbert Belnap" printed in 1950, 52 & 56 are left, and ask what should be done with them. A motion was made and seconded by J. Francis that we keep 2 copies in the files of the Belnap Organization for reference material and one be given to the new Genealogical Library located in the Old Tabernacle Bldg.

Keith & Austin Belnap were to contact Marian B. Kerr, Historian, and obtain a report of her activities and when she will complete her books.

New Officers worked hard to get out another Belnap Crier. before Christmas. suggesting that Coat of Arms, pictures, family group sheets, etc. be purchased from the organization and given as gifts at Christmas, birthdays, weddings, etc.

Flora Dotson was appointed as editor of another Crier to be published next fall. All present were given new copies of the names & addresses of members of the

Belnap families; Claude Mills did the printing and will make stickers for mailing purposes when needed.

Henry Belnap gave to the organization a copy of a contract, stating when Gilbert Belnap was bound out to learn the trade of a carriage and wagon maker. This contract has been entered in the files of the Belnap Organization.

AMinutes of Officers Meeting Oct. 22. 1967

Meetingheld October 22, 1967 at the home of Della A. Belnap 815-32nd St. Ogden Utah at 2:30 p. m. Those in attendance were; Della A. Belnap, President; Joseph Francis Belnap; H. Austin Belnap; Gordon L. Belnap. Excused were;: Coelin Holbrook, Secretary; and Artella Luthy, Treasurer. Those excused have been ill for the past months.

Prayer was offered by H. Austin Belnap.

Old Business; It was reported we have 6 sheets in with the pictures of the families complete. This assignment was given out to the members of the Family at the previous meeting to have this accomplished no later than November 1, 1967.

New Business:

The name of the Family Organization was questioned since it appeared in the constitution that Della Belnap received from the outgoing president that the name was the "Gilbert Belnap Family Organization." Dear Richard,

It was good to hear from you. I shall be very happy to go to the Royal Society of Genealogists and Royal College of Arms and see if we can't get to the root of the family crest coat of arms problem. I have been anxious to do this, and it serves as a good excuse to get me there in one of the future preparation-days that we have in the mission.

I am forwarding your letter to Brother Albert FIELD, our genealogy chairman for the British Mission. He is an expert genealogist, and will be happy to investigate your genealogy in the Kent area. He lives just north of London, so it will not be difficult for him to make the transport anywhere in the London area, which is Middlesex County or Kent, which is just to the southeast of us. He shall communicate with you directly, and will bill you for his services. I shall also try to get up to Tilty Abbey in Essex to make a brass rubbing of one of our ancestral peoples. Who is buried in the Abbey there. It would make an interesting addition to the family magazine.

I have had Frank SMITH, our director of research in the Genealogical Society, proceed with doing all of the peerage BELNAPS. Those are the ones from the 14th to the 15th century, which we cannot connect ourselves directly to, but nonetheless, we feel, are related to us. The Church takes it upon itself to do the royal and peerage lines. This about exhausts our efforts in Britain. As I visit in the area, I will go specifically to each of the County Record Offices wherever BELNAPS could possibly be found--Kent, Middlesex, Hertfordshire, Essex and Warwick--and see what we can discover. If nothing can be discovered through these sources, I believe we had better terminate our heavy investigations in Britain for the time being and concentrate on the descendant collateral lines of Abraham BELNAP, our common immigrant ancestor to the Colonies. There are literally thousands of sheets that can come out of that research, and therein lies our major emphasis for the future.


Please let me have a copy of each of the BELNAP publications. I would like to add them to my Book of Remembrance.



ATTENDEES: Joseph Francis Belnap and wife, Mabel, Richard D. Belnap, Della A. Belnap, Evelyn B. Galloway, Wendell T. Belnap, Joy M. Belnap and Gordon L. Belnap. Helene K. Smith was excused.

OPENING PRAYER: Richard D. Belnap

The new president, Gordon L. Belnap called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone present. Minutes of the last meeting held 17 June 1970 and the Reunion held 27 June 1970 were read and approved.

Gordon discussed the Family Crier - rather to continue or discontinue sending the Crier to those who have never paid for it. Frank suggested enclosing an envelope for payment at the same time as the Crier is sent, thereby encouraging response. All present felt the newsletter was very enjoyable and informative for the Family. Richard made the motion to continue as now outlined and Evelyn Galloway seconded the motion.

Gordon assigned Frank to continue researching for areas and things that have the name Belnap. Gordon assigned Richard to research all Belnaps who have been ministers or preachers and report on them for the Crier.

Richard read a letter from Dr. W. Dean Belnap dated 21 August 1970 regarding the Royal College of Arms. The Belnaps did have a Coat of Arms, but it has not been registered with the Royal College of Arms.

Gordon discussed the past reunion and asked for suggestions to help improve for the next one. Richard stated that the workshop was too long. Della commented that the committees were not organized early enough and were not ready to start on time. Frank felt the program was too long. Gordon suggested that the workshop and program might be held together next time instead of holding two different meetings. Joy felt that by having the registration table and the collection of money held in two different places it would ease the bottleneck at the door. The next reunion will be planned for Idaho. Flora B. Dotsun will find a suitable location.

At 7:00 p.m. Brother Frank Smith, the professional genealogist hired by the Family for research in England, arrived and was introduced to the group. He reviewed the Belnap line beginning with Henry and Elizabeth Beltoft. He said that up to 150 years ago there was no accepted spelling of names. People just spelled like it sounded. There are so many different dialects in England that there are so many different spellings of the same name. He explained names found in 1561 (10 generations back from Della) and also stated that record-keeping didn't start until 1538. He also discussed the line of Grace Adam. He brought out the fact that Stallion alias Butler found on some of our records could mean illigitimacy or it could have been used to establish one person from another with the same name in the same area. This one was married to Joan Delow in 1567. He also explained that the wives names are equally as important as the husbands names.

Our direct line including wives is our most important obligation. An additional privilege is to collect those living in the United States who could be related, but only if we don't neglect the direct line.

Brother Smith was asked to prepare an index of 1969 of the number of Belnaps, including births, deaths and marriages, now living in England so it may be published in the Crier.

At the present time we have a \$195 deficit to Brother Smith. He was given the go-ahead to continue research in Essex and Hertfordshire and the Family will see that he gets a check for more money to continue research. He was excused at 8:25 p.m. leaving us all very much more informed.

Gordon read the financial report as of 1 January 1970 through to July. Wendell reported from July when he went in as treasurer to the present time. We have \$770.47 on hand. (See following pages.)

Reminders will have to be sent to those who have not paid for the Crier. Gordon suggested the price of the Crier be raised from \$3.00 to \$5.00 in order to meet costs. Wendell made the motion to this effect and Frank seconded it.

Richard was asked to set up a similar meeting as tonight with Brother Jimmy Parker, the professional genealogist hired by the Family for research in the United States. This meeting to be held either the last week in November or the first week of December, depending upon Brother Parker's schedule.

Frank made the motion that the Family guarantee \$1,000 per year for genealogical research to be collected through payment of the Crier. All officers to be responsible for this amount by contacting those who have not paid and seeing that it is collected. Richard seconded the motion. A vote of those present: 5 yes, I abstention.

Wendell was asked to mail a \$200 check to Frank Smith right away and state that another \$200 would follow soon.

HELD AT 7:00 p.m. 30 November 1970 AT THE HOME OF GORDON L. BELNAP

ATTENDEES: Della A. Belnap, Richard D. Belnap, Evelyn B. Galloway, Joy M. Belnap, Gordon L. Belnap and Special Guest, Jimmy Parker. Helene K. Smith was excused.

OPENING PRAYER: Della A. Belnap

President Gordon L. Belnap conducted, calling the meeting to order and welcoming everyone present. Joseph Francis Belnap and Wendell T. Belnap were absent. Brother Jimmy Parker, the American genealogist hired by the Belnap Family, was introduced.

Minutes of the last meeting held 30 September 1970 were read and approved. President Gordon asked Brother Parker how best the Family can continue with their research in America. Brother Parker reviewed all he has done from the beginning since Dr. W. Dean Belnap first approached him. He has documented all the Family records that were originally given to him with primary sources. He has checked the 1790 census index of the New England States and found all the Belnaps living at that time and started from there. He checked the Barbour Collection in the Connecticut vital records which are microfilmed records by Lucious A. and Lucious B. Barbour of town and church records in Connecticut. He also checked the Charles Hale Collection of newspapers and cemeteries. The Vermont vital records were checked finding 200 or more through 1870. He said the only multiple source you can use is on the direct line. In Maine he found Jeremy Belnap and family only, who was a minister. Brother Parker explained the records submission service and why it came about — so that single names can have temple work done without waiting for whole families.

At the insistence of President Gordon, Brother Parker recommended a good solid evaluation be made of all research before any more is done in order to know what is done and what is left to be done.

Brother Parker said there are 39 couples of Belnap women married to different surnames all in Vermont. He suggested the Family assign members to get children of these families from Vermont vital records. He also suggested that the Family publish a Family Genealogy in book form, but to be sure it is well-documented and well-organized.

To sum things up Gordon made the motion that we have an evaluation made of what we have done. Della seconded the motion. Brother Parker said it would take him approximately two months to accomplish this.

Another motion that Brother Parker prepare family group sheets of what he has found and send them back to the Family so we can tie material together was made. Richard seconded the motion.

Brother Parker left at 9:00 p.m. He stated that at the present time he does not need funds, as he is still using money from an agreement with Dr. Dean Belnap.

The next meeting was set for some time in the Spring.

OPENING PRAYER: Della A. Belnap

President Gordon welcomed all present. The minutes of meeting held 30 November 1970 were read by Joy and approved by the group.

Della reported on Frank Smith and English research. Money was sent to him before the postal strike. There has been a slow-up of research in England. Brother Jimmie Parker has appologized for not doing as promised, but has further church assignments that take more of his time. Six months have gone by without word from Brother Parker, so Richard took the assignment to talk to Brother Parker and clear the matter. If he can't handle the work, we would like what he has completed to date turned into us. Richard also took the assignment to check with Frank Smith on the derivitive of Belnap names and 1970 census of England of Belnaps still living in England. He is to ask them to furnish a report of what they are doing instead of hearing nothing from them.

Expenditures were approved of Belnap funds to xerox copies of missing Belnap family group sheets to bring family records up-to-date from personal records of Della.

Richard presented some more information on Annetta and Martha McBride Smith, born 17 March 1805, Chester, Warren, New York, sealed 26 January 1846 for time only to Heber Chase Kimball, plus 7 other women (widows of Joseph Smith). Gordon mentioned that a place for the 1972 reunion should be decided on before the publication of the CRIER. It had been decided on Idaho from past meetings (two in Hooper then one in Idaho). Shelley, Idaho Falls or Pocatello were suggested. Richard proposed it to be held at Shelley. Evelyn seconded the motion. A tentative date of 24 June 1972 has been set. Frank to check with Shelley people if all right to go ahead before we publish the CRIER.

A brief discussion about restoring the original cabin in Hooper was held. No conclusions drawn.

Gordon reviewed information for this year's CRIER. A phone call from Marion B. Kerr (historian 1958 to 1970) indicates she wants to give report to the Family in CRIER with pictures of her books and compilations. Cheever printing who has done the CRIER in the past has gone out of business. Richard will check with Hercules as to cost of printing.

Frank suggested matching numbers to be on the CRIER and remittance envelope as well as the card for drawing of prizes at the reunion. This to be put in both 1971 and 1972 CRIERs to instill remittance to be sent in.

This year's theme was "Migration of Belnaps to Idaho" with general chairman Lester Belnap and Garth Belnap as Master of Ceremonies.

Registration began at 9:30 a.m. and Belnap Family President Gordon L. Belnap called the meeting to order to begin the reunion at 10:30 a.m. The invocation was offered by Lawrence Belnap. The morning program consisted of: First, Boyd Belnap's daughters, Cheryl, Marlene and Serena, sang "Let There Be Peace" and "Too Many Chiefs and Not Enough Indians", accompanied by Velma Belnap on the piano. Then, Newell Belnap gave a talk "Reuben and Augustus Belnap in Idaho." Vere Belnap then did a novelty number with his puppet. Vere also gave a talk about "Gilbert Belnap in Limhi".

At 11:30 a.m. Della Belnap reported on the genealogy accomplished since we met last. Helene Kerr gave an appeal to get historical information turned in to her. Wendell gave a financial report to the family. Garth Belnap made a motion to accept and approve the aforementioned and Arias Belnap seconded the motion. OPENING PRAYER: Gordon L. Belnap

President Richard conducted and welcomed all present. He stated that the funds for Frank Smith are down to \$20 and if we are to continue our research in England, we need to send him another \$200 as per our commitment. Gordon moved that the Family Organization continue their research and forward another \$200 to Brother Smith. Dean seconded the motion. All present voted in favor.

The cost of the "Crier" was discussed. Costs are rising and less people are paying for their copy. If we stay with our commitment to Brother Smith of \$200 every quarter, more financial support is needed. The money the "Crier" is taking in is not enough. Della suggested that the names of those who are not paying for their copy of the "Crier" be taken off the mailing list. Gordon felt just the opposite. He said you never know who you will touch or when you will spark an interest in genealogy or the Family and felt that all should continue to receive the "Crier". Joy suggested that some desire the "Crier" but presently feel they could not afford it. Dean made the motion to send the "Crier" to everyone on the mailing list and keep it at the same price. Gordon seconded the motion. All were in favor. No one opposed the motion after all ideas were presented. Rather than raise the price of the "Crier", it was suggested that it be cut down a few pages to cut costs. Della mentioned that the direct line should be corrected from Henry Belnap to Lawrence Belnap and put into the "Crier".

Richard will draft a letter and have it printed to thank the Family members for their support and to remind them of their obligation to pay for their "Crier".

As discussed in the past, the possibility of having regional reunions and regional representatives was reviewed, thereby encouraging more participation and Family unity. Gordon suggested that the Family has outgrown its present organization because the families are getting too scattered around the country. Certain parts of the Family will never be included in a reunion due to traveling conditions if they are always held in Utah and Idaho. He felt they should be held in opposite years in four or five different locations, such as Idaho, Southern California, Arizona, Mid-West and East, so that those members of the Family can feel part of the organization as a whole. Dean moved to have the present officer system remain; in 1973 have 15 sub-Family reunions (each individual child of Gilbert); and in 1974 experiment with four, five or six regional reunions and to appoint a regional chairman to work with the officers of the Central presidency. Balloting could possibly be done by mail. Gordon seconded the motion and all approved. In order to be effective in this, all Family Representatives will have to complete their mailing lists of their immediate families and account for all children, grandchildren, etc. and send them to the Family Organization. President Richard stressed the importance of keeping a current list of names and addresses of each family. He asked each representative to find out if there are any on their list who do not want the "Crier", but to encourage them to receive it. We need financial support from the "Crier" as well as other donations to the Family Organization. Please find out who are not being accounted for, such as married children of relatives. Turn in your lists so we can include them on our mailing list. Also identify them by family as to grandchild, great grandchild, etc. so we know how they tie in. Richard showed them an example of his family how this can be done. We need them as soon as possible for the next "Crier", preferably by January 1, 1973. Gordon mentioned that from a census standpoint all adults over 18 or married should be on the "Crier" mailing list as they will become adult families. Dean mentioned that this is now the Church procedure. The Family Representatives were given the assignment to do this for the Organization and identify what family they come under.

Gordon mentioned he would like to follow up in the "Crier" one more generation down from Gilbert. Many, many names are missing.

Richard proposed a new numbering system. He will have one set up by the next meeting. This will help bring in the younger generations.

Some of the present Family Representatives need to be replaced - either because of age or lack of interest they are not participating.

The concept of holding Family reunions on a regional basis was explained as is previously stated above. There was interest shown in having four or five different locations in order to accommodate more Family members.

President Richard explained that we are hurting financially. The "Crier" is not bring in the needed funds for our commitment of \$200 per quarter for research in England, over and above the costs of printing and mailing the "Crier".

Suggestions concerning information to be included in the "Crier" such as more histories and more vital statistics. Dean brought out some very good points regarding building family histories and information for future generations updating direct lines, not collateral lines.

Dean mentioned he would like to set a five-year goal to get out a hard-bound volume of the Belnap Family at his expense to be in all libraries of the Church. All Family members would help to compile information.

OPENING PRAYER: Della A. Belnap

President Richard welcomed all present and asked for a financial report on money coming in for the "Crier" from Della and Joy due to the absence of Wendell. A rough estimate is that we have taken in approximately \$1,481.00 since last August 1972. We have been able to keep up our commitment of \$200 per quarter to research in England. Another researcher has been added under the direction of Frank Smith. We now have Glenda Perkes in London, Albert Field in Essex and a non-member working also in Essex. Wendell will be asked to mail another \$200 to Frank Smith right away.

Dean mentioned that the church requires two dates for processing each name — the death date and preferably a christening date. There is a possibility of using marriage dates. The Laurence Belnap line needs to be reprocessed. It had gone in previously as Henry and all his family has been sealed to Henry. Dean suggested just sending them in again under Laurence.

Richard explained the numbering system he has established following the pattern of the military. He passed out a copy to each one of his plan.

The Glendex Coding System is a private industry for genealogical research. Dean will check with them and compare in order to set a standard numbering system for our Family. In cases of plural marriage should we use a dash or a paren to clarify? More thought will be given to this plan before it is implemented.

Gordon told of plans for the forthcoming "Crier". It will be approximately 20 pages on both sides. Dr. Howard K. Belnap requests his line of Joseph be included. He has gone to extensive work and effort to put this together and it is all ready to be included this year. It was approved as outlined by those present. The possibility of sending out two papers a year rather than just one big one was discussed. It was decided to stick to mailing only one paper per year and trying to keep it fairly small to accommodate the cost of mailing.

Della reported that 866 names have been sent in to the temples received from our English research.

Dean suggested Della pick up a research team to work on the American line to carry on where Jimmy Parker left off. Possibly use graduate students at the BYU under the direction of Jerry Wells of the Priesthood Genealogical Committee. The cost could be cut almost in half — about \$4.00 per hour rather than \$7.00 or even \$8.00 as is regularly charged by researchers. Carroll Y. Belknap in Connecticutt has been sending a great amount to the Belnap Family. Dean suggested he would send Della back to visit Carroll and collect all he has. He encouraged her to give it some serious thought. It would be at his expense. Carroll has done some valuable research on the Belnap line even though he is a non-member of the LDS church. Dean said he would also authorize the team from BYU and work out a financial schedule with them and notify the Family.

OPENING PRAYER: Dr. W. Dean Belnap

President Richard conducted and welcomed all present. He asked Wendell to give us a financial report since our last meeting. Wendell reported that the Belnap Family Organization has a balance of \$1,034.01 in checking and a balance of \$337.71 in the savings account. The possibility of becoming a non-profit organization was discussed. It was concluded that this would be feasible and that Dean would look into what has to be done and take care of the details. This would make contributions to the Belnap Family Organization tax deductible. Richard seconded the motion.

Richard will write a holiday letter similar to last year's to be sent just before Christmas thanking Family members for their support and reminding them to pay for their copy of the "Crier."

Della said that she has not heard from Frank Smith on English research for some time now but it is past time to send him his \$200. English research has almost diminished and it was felt by those present that we should wait until we hear from him before we send him any further money as he may not need it at the present time.

Dean reported on the Priesthood Genealogical Seminar where they no longer feel that researching on the collateral lines is important. The need now is to keep our responsibility to our grandmother lines and into further research here in the states. Carroll Y. Belknap in correspondence with Della and Dean reports that he would not be ready to meet with the family as mentioned in the last meeting. He suggested that next spring would be a good time. Research to be held off until we can compare with Carroll to keep from duplicating his work.

Dean enthused us all by stating that stories would be published from Gilbert Belnap's Journal (the red book) and will be incorporated into the new hardbound book that he is planning. He will instigate American research from Samuel Belnap's line to include four grandmothers' lines - Eunice Hall, Eunice , Mary Dickinson and Sarah Jones. Richard moved the motion and Gordon seconded it. All voted in favor. The agency from the BYU, Gendex University, will work with Dean/editorialize and do the printing and binding. Dean discussed his plans and dreams for the book. Additional information from Carroll will be included, as well as histories, stories, letters, genealogical lines, etc. The book will include down to Della's generation. Supplementary volumes will include down further to the present time. The first volume will be about 1,000 pages with a possible deadline date of Christmas 1974. The cost will be around \$5,000. He would like to place a book in each branch library (65 presently). Each Family Representative will be contacted to update the information on the 15 children of Gilbert. Gordon made the motion that Dean be granted permission to contact all representatives for this information. Richard seconded the motion and all present voted in favor. Joy will work with Max to update the family representative list with phone numbers for Dean. Max to be assigned to contact them and see if they will remain or recommend someone else to take their place on their line.

Richard discussed reunions - whether they are going to remain the same or go to a regional basis. A meeting to be set up in December for all family representatives. He will have Claude Mills prepare a listing of members according to states and prepare for a regional reunion. This next reunion is scheduled for Utah. Bountiful (possibly the Woods Cross and Bountiful Regional Center - or the old Valley Music Hall building) was strongly considered. Gordon made the motion to hold it in Bountiful and Joy seconded it. The second Saturday in August, August 10, 1974, was tentatively set. Gordon to see about door prizes. Dean to work on a program centered around information to be in his book.

Gordon mentioned again that the problem of sending the "Crier" continually to family members who have never ever paid one cent for it is getting worse. The cost of paper and postage is getting higher and the mailing list is larger every year - up to 650 now. Postage alone has doubled over when we started. It was felt that we would continue as presently doing in sending to all on the list. The 1974 issue will be published but in 1975, instead of a "Crier", push the book that Dean is preparing. The cost of the 1974 "Crier" will be raised to \$5.00 per issue.

The next meeting was set up for December 1, 1973 at 7:00 p.m. to involve the family representatives concerning what has been discussed this meeting.

OPENING PRAYER: Dr. Howard Belnap

President Richard welcomed all present and informed the group that they are the Board of Directors and have the privilege of governing the Family. He encouraged them to get together as a board and hold meetings.

Dr. Dean explained about his forthcoming book. It will consist of the main Belnap line with some collateral lines. Two chapters will deal with English history and the origin of the Belnap name. One or two chapters will be devoted to our descendent ancestor, Abraham Belknap, the first to come to America, down to the first convert, Gilbert Belnap. Extensive information of Gilbert and his wives, Adaline and Henrietta will be given, as well as a chapter on each of the 15 children. This will include three generations of detail and history with the fourth generation (to Della) listed by name. Histories and pedigrees will be entwined together with photos, etc. so not to lump all one type together. Expense of the first volume was discussed. It is hoped to do about 300 copies for about \$5,000 to cost about \$25 per book. It will be documented for accuracy both for the church and the Family. Representatives were given the assignment to get the information on their respective lines and furnish this information to Dean for the book. A working capital is needed. Dean, Wallace and Henry Belnap are furnishing funds and all others are invited to help.

Richard explained to the group about becoming a non-profit organization and asked for their ideas. This way our donations to the Family Organization would then become tax deductible. Dr. Howard made the motion to incorporate as a non-profit organization and Helene seconded it. All present voted in favor. Wendell and Joy to furnish Dean the information needed to carry this forth.

The Church is asking the youth to obtain oral histories from their grandparents using a tape recorder. Richard charged all representatives to look into this and work with the youth in obtaining their histories and not to try to do it all themselves. They should also work the histories over to make them factual and concise before getting them ready to print. Family Representatives were given the deadline of May 1, 1974 or sooner to get in their three generations from Gilbert with pictures and histories and the fourth generation listing children. Review the red book (Gilbert Belnap's Journal) and make changes and additions as necessary to update information received. As a prototype it will not be as expensive as it may seem. It will encourage more families in the Church to follow the same pattern and will be a very worthwhile genealogical tool.

Richard discussed reunions again. We feel we are not ready to go on a regional basis as was previously planned. August 10, 1974 will be the next reunion (tentative) in Bountiful. Richard to find a suitable place. Individual families are encouraged to hold their reunions on opposite years. At the 1974 reunion Dean will set up a display corner to instill interest in the book and various families will put on skits, plays, poems, etc. to further instill interest.

Our research in England has slowed down. Frank Smith has just about gleaned all he can. He is still working on the wives lines. The McBride and Richmond lines are doing well. Dr. Jerry Wells from the BYU, and his associates are working parttime on American lines and will visit Della after the holidays.

Della mentioned the response of money coming in on the "Crier". A very low percentage are paying for it. She charged the Representatives to find out who on their lines really want it sent to them and who just are not interested at all. Richard invited families to get their information sent in for the "Crier" as Dr. Howard did on Joseph's line in the 1973 edition. Richard plans to have Vinson's line ready for the next issue. Meeting was presided over and conducted by President Knight B. Kerr. Minutes of the meeting held September 11, 1976 were read and approved by Secretary Joy M. Belnap.

Secretary Belnap reviewed the finances of the organization. There is approximately \$900 in the Crier account and about \$60 in the Book account. Money for the 1976 Crier is steadily coming in, but the money for the book has slowed down considerably. The financial situation of the book was reviewed. Ideas were discussed to use as an incentive to get the loan of \$8,000 paid off. More planning will be done on this later. A car raffle was proposed.

Hal called Dean Belnap regarding the status of the Carroll Y. Belknap records in Connecticut. To this time no definite commitment has come of it. Dean will continue to follow through on this.

Family representatives need to be asked to help get the records up to date and to encourage members of their particular line to purchase the book. The 3rd vice president (Hal) has the assignment of working with the family representatives and to see that each family line has an assigned representative. Excused: Edith Ward, Ronald F. Belnap and W. Dean Belnap. The rest were not reported or represented.

The opening prayer was given by Max G. Belnap. President Knight welcomed all present. Joy read the minutes of the October 8, 1976 meeting and they were approved.

Della explained what the Carroll Y. Belknap records were. He has recently died and has a vast amount of Belnap-Belknap records which our Organization would like to have.

Hal discussed how to go about updating the family records, not only for ourselves, but as their priesthood assignment for the Church. He passed each one a copy of a family group sheet and instructions on how to fill one out. Many helpful ideas were discussed. Also the procedure was given on how to submit sheets to the Genealogical Society of the Church.

Gordon suggested having each Family Representative have his (or her) own copy of his particular family line so he knows what has been done and where they need to go from there. This idea was accepted by the Representatives because at this point they don't know where to begin.

Gordon and Joy to reproduce a copy of what the Belnap Family now has and get it to each representative.

Claude Mills to be asked to reproduce computer listing and addresses of all descendants and up date them.

President Knight referred to the Book account loan of \$8,000. Ideas were discussed as to how to instill interest in the family members to purchase the book. Family representatives were asked to set a goal to sell 5 more per each family line this year. Helene spoke on getting histories in from family members. This also to be included in the letter to be sent out before the holidays.

Max brought up a letter that several of the family members have received from a man in Provo who claims to have Belnap information for sale. We have everything he has for sale. His price is \$60 - our price is \$10. Della showed our packet and pedigree chart of just what we have. He only reproduces what is already on file in the genealogical society records. We have corrected and updated our material that he probably isn't even aware of. We hope family members haven't or will not be taken in by it. Our letter to the family should also make mention of this so they won't be deceived.

Research on the grandmother lines was discussed. More work needs to be done.

Max read a recount of a dream of former family president, Lorenzo Belnap, concerning how the family is all tied together and our responsibilities to them. This was written in 1965.

A meeting for the Belnap Family Organization officers was held October 14, 1977 at the home of Hal R. Belnap at 7:00 p.m.

Those present were: Knight B. Kerr, Max G. Belnap, Hal R. Belnap, Della A. Belnap, W. Dean Belnap, Gordon L. Belnap, Joy M. Belnap and Brent Belnap (son of Gordon). Excused: Helene K. Smith and LeGrande L. Belnap.

The opening prayer was offered by Max G. Belnap.

President Knight B. Kerr conducted and welcomed all present. Secretary Joy was called on to read the minutes of the March 11, 1977 meeting. They were read and approved by those present. The motion was made by Hal to accept the minutes and the motion was seconded by Gordon.

Gordon briefly discussed finances of the Family. About \$700 in bank. We have supplies left to be sold, Coats-of-Arms, etc.

A rough draft of the 1977 CRIER was handed out and gone over for approval. The CRIER will not be sent out to everyone this year — only to those who send in a card stating they desire to have it. Only about 500 will be printed. Membership cards were discussed — blue ink on white stalk. Everyone will receive one who desires to belong to the Family Organization.

The reunion next year will be held in Hooper. Max to make final arrangements and report back.

Youth Organization was mentioned. Notify secretary of interest.

New sheets have been added to the original packet and plans are being formulated to print these and make new packets for sale to the family.

The Constitution and By-Laws for the Organization were discussed and will be printed in the $1977\ \text{CRIER}$.

15 individual family books are now available and will be updated. One for each child of Gilbert Belnap.

Dean reported on his experiences with the late Carroll Y. Belknap's family in Connecticut. He was sent there to oversee the packing and bringing back the records given to the Belnap Family Organization (in care of Dean). He had to sign a commitment of custody when they gave him the records and want a report in about a year. Dean suggested to the officers that Della take the four file drawers of records and review them as Dean has not had the time for thorough examination. Material is not too well organized. He was very thorough in his research and has a lot of early records. The Stamford Public Library in Greenwhich, Conn. has a "Heritage With Honor" (Dean's Book) donated by Carroll Y. Belknap designated with a metal plaque.

Della mentioned receiving a letter from Frank Smith concerning research in England. He is down to \$50 in funds and has five more parishes left to search. We should give him the go ahead to finish these five parishes and send him more money. He is extracting grandmother lines as well in the 12-mile radius from Sawbridgeworth.

Dean suggested the Family Organization set the following priorities:

- 1. Get 5 parishes completed.
- 2. Have the 15 books completed and brought up-to-date.
- 3. Grandmother lines worked on.
- 4. Collect more information on collateral lines descending from Abraham Belknap.

The Research and Genealogical Committee (as mentioned in the Constitution) should be reinstated and have some positive direction in accomplishing outlined goals. Hal suggested that we mention in the CRIER that we are looking for people to help do the research and interested parties contact us to formulate this committee.

Dean mentioned that Claude Mills is losing his computer rights and we will be unable to run our address listings off. Hal, because he lives in Bountiful as does Claude, was given the assignment to contact Claude and see what can be done.

Reunion plans will be discussed at a future meeting to be set up with the Family Representatives. A meeting will be set for January 7, 1978 at 1:00 p.m. in the Relief Society Room of the Bountiful South Stake Center, 1300 South Main in Bountiful. Joy to send a letter to each Representative and the vice presidents are to call each one located in their vicinity. Hal to make these arrangements.

Family histories should be encouraged to be written by all members of the family and filed in a central location for value to the generations to come.

Knight mentioned that he had two restoration experts look at Gilbert's log cabin in Hooper for the purpose of restoration possibilities. It is estimated that only 2/3 of the cabin is original. The estimated cost to restore is too high a price for the family now - about \$4-5,000. Some of the logs are missing. Experts have not yet given final views on whether it would be worthwhile or not to restore it. If the State of Utah would do it, would the Family Organization be interested in donating it? "This is the Place State Park" is looking for a cabin built in this year (time period). They would dismantle it and set it up again in the Park. About 1/3 needs to be replaced. Windows have been enlarged using modern nails. The cabin is now on George Ellis Belnap's property in Hooper. He said he (Ellis) would deed a piece of this property to the Belnap Family - but the problem is who will maintain it and protect it after it is restored? After much discussion, it is the general feeling of those present that if the State of Utah doesn't want it, then to scrap the idea of restoration as far as the Belnap Family is concerned.

Meeting was conducted by President Knight B. Kerr and he welcomed all present and everyone was introduced.

The opening prayer was offered by Kenneth Lee Belnap.

Gordon was called upon to present the proposed budget for 1978 and to explain the financial statement for 1977. Everyone present received a copy of both statements. The financial report was accepted unanimously without correction. The proposed budget was discussed. The "CRIER" is not out yet but will be soon. It is presently at the printers.

Present: Max G. Belnap, Gordon L. Belnap, Della A. Belnap, Hal R. Belnap, Keith Belnap, Brent J. Belnap, LaGrande H. Belnap, Voletta Blanch and Howard K. Belnap.

Invocation was offered by Hal R. Belnap.

President Max said he had sent letters to all Family Representatives and some had legitimate excuses for not being present.

At the last meeting held November 3 approved present officers except Helene K. Smith as historian. Contacted all others and got their approval to serve. A replacement for historian in Helene's place has not been found. Want Representatives here to give imput - still searching.

Max reported that Knight Kerr had said the Vinson Knight home in Nauvoo will be completed next month and that by the end of this month they need anything that could be placed in the home. Theydesire articles, personal and time era, to be put in the home. Della has a Vinson Knight account book and mentioned that Zeruah Thompson has a quilt made by Martha Knight. Another sister has a black dress. Coolbear line has Martha Knight's wedding dress. Olive Jensen has some furniture of the period from Hyrum Belnap's home. Max suggested a liason person be appointed to collect things for the home. Keith has a hand-crank sewing machine from England over 100 years old. More will be done on this later.

The purpose of this meeting was to determine if the Family Constitution needs to be changed. At the meeting held for Representatives on August 12 at the reunion, Representatives were asked to contact family members for imput. Max gave a handout on Church policy regarding family organizations. Howard said he doesn't see anything he'd like to change. He wasn't sent a handout.

Review of handout was discussed by everyone: (Max used his family as an example.)

- Recommendation in 1977 to stress family organizations.
- Married couple immediate family organization.
- Grandparent organization formed when children are married.
- Gilbert Belnap ancestral organization.
- $-\ \mbox{In 1979}$ families will send in one 4-generation family group sheet that is fully accepted and corrected by family members.
 - Church will only accept sheets from family organizations.

Max read in the Belnap Constitution where it stated the purpose of the family, then referred to Ezra Taft Benson's talk at the last general conference. The ancestral organization should not interfere with grandparent organization.

Keith read the ancestral organization is only for genealogy gathering and filing, coordinating genealogical activities, catalogs, histories, journals, books, etc. Everyone agreed that our organization does this. Later read where once the objective is completed, the organization <u>might</u> be dissolved. Gordon said "might" does not mean "have to." Keith said we need to determine the extent our family now needs to cover and what we have accomplished as an organization. Have we fulfilled our objectives?

The new program now is to eliminate duplication and make family records more exact and complete. Beyond the four generations is optional.

The Belnap Family has put records in about 9 branch libraries. Della stated things in the records could now be updated and a lot more histories included. Keith said then that we haven't really fulfilled our objectives. Hal said that you could search for years — how long do you want to keep searching? The Family could become a hobby organization helping only others fulfill their goals. Do we want to do that? Hal said the new extraction program elimiantes identity of the family. Sealings put the families together. The extraction program will not put families together. Keith said then it appears the family has completed its goal.

Hal said we still need a depository for records. Said the Church has killed family genealogy work beyond four generations. He asked what is left that really needs to be cleaned up. Aren't we about as accurate as we can be? Keith summed things up by saying the extraction program will perform baptisms, endowments and sealings, but we must put them together as families.

Gordon said our Family is one of the leaders in the organizations of the whole Church. We have set the pattern. He said our Family is blessed to have been in the Church for a long time. He said that if we want to continue to lead, we must determine where we stand. New programs are for new converts to the Church. Ancestral organizations are not taboo. We still need to act as clearing houses. We still can have reunions. With new members joining the Church, the Family can take on a new stature.

Keith said we should keep the organization as a sort of "headquarters". Max said we do need this type of organization to draw on. Della said we need this to help others who are just starting. She read the letter from Van Orden that said to keep the Crier coming.

Gordon said we need our organization to make sure the younger generations hold their reunions and organize. He said we could combine organizations and still hold reunions. This was followed by extensive discussion.

Howard made the comment on his family (Joseph) how generations lower down lose interest in the larger organization.

Voletta said she is trying to decide between the two (Gordon and Hal). She said she thinks it should be kept and interest the younger ones.

LaGrande said he thinks we should follow Church policy. He said our immediate need is to organize younger families, but should still keep the larger reunion.

Keith suggested we get the feedback from the Family Representatives and act on that information concerning the Family Organization.

Max will send a letter out to all Family Representatives with minutes of this meeting with some instructions about building their own records of their descendants. Gordon said that if they had wanted to be here, they would have been. The Representatives have outlived their usefulness. Most of them are indifferent. That is why we should maintain the main organization. Some families have lost the level and are now ancestral levels. He suggested the Family Organization be:

- 1. A place to come to for records that are complete.
- 2. Insure that duplication doesn't go on.
- Maintain contact and encourage family members doesn't matter what level.
 Organize families even to the youngest level.

Keith said we need to decide mechanics at the officer level; take suggestions and weigh them and come up with a proposal as how to do things and have them voted upon by the group.

Max indicated that only two Representatives were here - should we go ahead with the meeting. Hal was here in place of Marvin Benson on Oliver line.

The Crier was the next point of discussion. Gordon gave a financial report. He indicated that more money was taken in this year than any other year before. He gave the reunion expenses. We now have \$2,500.07 on hand. Keith said this shows how interested the Family still is in the organization and reunions. Gordon said that there were 923 Criers sent out for 1977 (early 1978) and that only 159 were paid for - that is only 17% response. The mailing list has 1,057 names, with 79 names added this year, 18 names removed, 197 addresses changed or added. We have 66 unknown addresses, 9 this year who don't want the Crier sent to them. Over the years about 50 to 75 have refused the Crier. There were 12 books (Heritage With Honor) sold this year. There were 199 registered members in attendance at the reunion this year, hoping everyone signed. Gordon indicated the response is too low on the Crier and the materials sold at the reunions is way too low. He said he would like to be in charge of next year's reunion (1980). He would like to put out a Crier that is general in scope and then each family put in what they want to have printed. The families could send in what they want and how many ordered for their line. He said that several years ago a girl came back into the Church because of the Crier. He said what is the worth of a soul. We should keep the Crier going just for that reason. LaGrande said keep it going as long as we don't go in the hole financially. Howard said to keep it going even if they are the only ones interested. There is new interest in new groups by dropping down a level. center our attention on the next generation and continue as long as there is interest.

Max suggested each family form a committee and document four generations down from Gilbert and send into the Church. Hal said it would be too big. Max said if we do it again, it must be right. We could hire it done. It was unanimous that

three generations could be clean cut, or start from Rosel down four generations.

Keith suggested that because it was snowing they should wrap things up and dismiss.

A motion was proposed by Howard that the Organization remain in tact. It was seconded by Hal. All voted unanimously the affirmative.

A motion by Max to get a letter out and inform them of the Crier.

A motion by Howard to organize the Family at a lower level.

A motion by Gordon to carry down the lines only as far as the family is interested. This was seconded by Keith. He said we would act in our rightful role as an ancestral organization as long as the Family is interested.

A motion by Gordon to publish the Crier on a limited basis. Each family put information into it for their own family at our time of request. The master organization put out 10 pages of general information and history available to the mass mailing. The individual families pay for what they want sent out to their own members and charge their families only for what they want added. Still mail Crier to everyone. This was seconded by Keith. This was followed by a great debate. Howard said it wouldn't work — too hard and complicated. Said let the families print their own newsletters.

Motion that the Crier be published in March 1979 (approximately) with four generations from Rosel included. A final edition. Then abandon Crier and then have it come out under a different format and name. This was seconded by Keith and voted unanimously to the affirmative.

Max wrapped it up and proposed we perfect genealogy for 3 generations and request Family Representatives to give names for a committee to purify the information. Need a Historian - would welcome any suggestions.

The next meeting will be held January 5, 1979 (Friday) at 7:00 p.m.

Benediction was given by LaGrande Belnap.

Each family representative was asked to submit names for a historian and a member from their family line for a genealogy chairman for each descendant family line. Richard Belnap will be the genealogy chairman for the Vinson Belnap line.

Dean Belnap was approved for appointment as the family historian. Gordon Belnap was selected as the chairman of the 1980 family reunion.

The family organization will update and document the Rosel Belnap, James McBride and Vinson Knight family group sheats and publish these sheets to all family representatives as an example of the work which we are expected to do for updating the family group sheets for the 4 generation program. When these sheets are sent to the family representatives, the assignment will be made for eachdescendant family mit a group sheet for each descendant family head (each of Gillert's children as the father or mother) to the family organization, using the updated sheets as a guide for preparing the sheet which they are assigned to submit.

MINUTES OF BELNAP FAMILY ORGANIZATION OFFICERS

A meeting for the Belnap Family Organization officers was held January 12, 1980 at the home of Hal Belnap in Bountiful at 7:00 p.m.

Those present were: Max G. Belnap, Hal R. Belnap, Wilford Belnap, W. Dean Belnap, Phil McMullin, Maxine Belnap, Gordon L. Belnap, Joy M. Belnap and Della A. Belnap.

Excused were: LaGrande H. Belnap and Keith Belnap.

The opening prayer was offered by Gordon L. Belnap. President Max G. Belnap conducted the meeting.

President Max has drafted a letter to be sent only to the Family Representatives concerning the documented family group sheets. He read it to the group for approval. It was decided by the group to send this letter to all Family members and not just the Representatives. Max will rewrite the letter accordingly and see that it gets out.

A special guest invited by Dean Belnap, Phil McMullin of the Institute of Family Research, Inc., was introduced to the group. Brother McMullin explained that most people do not think of the family organization in a broad enough sense - the Family of Man, which a huge organization, all related to each other. Brother McMullin explained the computer print out program his company has and showed an example of part of the Packer Family and how it shows each generation from the original immigrant down to the present child. Three families are in a pilot program and he invited the Belnap Family to participate in this program that would be prepared for the Church to review. He indicated that on page 44 of the booklet, "A Nobel Son: Spencer W. Kimball", that the family of President Kimball ties into the Belnap Family and are cousins. This means that the Belnap Family has done work for the Kimball Family and President Kimball wasn't even aware of it. The Institute of Family Research, Inc. is a non-profit company that acts as a clearing house for family records. They put it on micro-fisch and send information to branch libraries. This also includes nonmember families. This program is not an official program of the Church, but one the Church would like to have. He suggested the Belnap Family be an advanced guinea pig for a study that he could take to the Church and show what well-organized families can accomplish. About 8 people are needed to set this program up: one person who can coordinate the project for about 2-3 months and have an assistant with genealogical experience to give their time on the CRT and program the information into the computer. He and Gordon talked about the mechanics of the hardware and the language the program is written in and just what the machine can do. Dean mentioned this would be a real service to the Church as well as to the Belnap Family. Max felt this program would speed up our objective of getting our information done. More discussion will be done on this before any decisions are made. Brother McMullin 1eft about 8:30.

It was felt by those present this would be a good step for the Family to take and the cost will be about \$250, depending on the set up. Dean suggested a meeting inviting the Family Representatives to present the information to them for their ideas and acceptance. Gordon suggested we be a pioneer in this field and go ahead and do it. Gordon motioned we do it and Hal seconded it. Max felt the Family Representatives should be counted in on the vote. The decision

should be positive, Gordon said, as we here are the governing body. It was voted all in favor of those present to get involved in the program.

Gordon reviewed the financial statement. He suggested that Dean be paid the money from the savings account on the book and that the Family authorize this. Max accepted the financial statement and approved payment be made to Dean. The Gilbert Belnap marker at the Ogden Cemetery has been re-engraved and the ball permanently placed back in place. The bill for \$448.00 to Bott's will be paid.

Gordon reviewed plans for the coming reunion. Several family members have indicated they do not want it to be held in Hooper again. A place needs to be decided upon. Many locations were suggested. The Institute at Weber State College or Ogden High School were pinpointed. Max suggested to compare prices to rent the facilities. Most present felt Weber State College to be the best location. Tentative date set for the reunion was August 9, 1980, on a Saturday. The World Record Conference is August 12-15, 1980, so we want to avoid that date.

A letter to invite the Family Representatives to visit the Institute of Family Research to view the program will be written and sent after Max can confirm a definite time and day for this. It was tentatively set for January 26, 1980 (Saturday) at around 1:00 p.m.

Crier material was discussed. The four generation sheets will be printed since they have been documented. This would be about 6 sheets. Then other information that we have accumulated will be included.

Claude Mills needs to be notified for a mailing listing. He was not at home when called.

The closing prayer was given by Hal R. Belnap at 9:30 p.m.

MINUTES OF THE BELNAP FAMILY ORGANIZATION OFFICERS MEETING

HELD AT THE HOME OF MAX G. BELNAP JUNE 6, 1980 AT 7:00 P.M.

President Max G. Belnap welcomed all to his home. Those present were: Max, Della A. Belnap, Gordon L. Belnap, Joy M. Belnap, LaGrande H. Belnap, Hal R. Belnap, Knight B. Kerr and his wife Pat Kerr.

The opening prayer was offered by LaGrande H. Beinap.

Minutes of meeting held January 12, 1980, were read and approved by Joy M. Belnap.

When !-

Max reviewed the work at the Family Institute of Research. Five families were represented. (Minutes taken by Brent J. Belnap January 26, 1980 at 1:00 p.m.) The families all supported the idea and moved to go ahead with the program on the computer. Max reported that 14 of the 15 books are now completed. Now we have to have an access number put on them for each family. This is needed to print family group sheets. We have had support from all the families except Augustus and Martha Jane. Max had his people do it. More hours and time were spent on this project than he thought there would be. Max has received the bill from the Institute for \$710.75 to the present time. We still have about 35 sheets left on Martha Jane family. Dr. Howard K. Belnap paid for his entire family (Joseph) alone. One computer broke down and lost the program. A lot, of time was lost as it had to be redone. This program has proven to be more expensive than ever anticipated. Max read a letter he has written to be sent to all family representatives concerning the "Who Am I?" print out; He showed an example of the Francis line.

Gordon moved we pay the bill of \$710.75 to the institute of Family Research and Knight seconded it.

A new setup will be laid out for the Gilbert Belnap Family Organization to modernize it. The family has outgrown the ancestral organization and it was suggested we go into a grandfather organization. Max showed material he picked up at the genealogical society concerning the Grandparent organization. Do we want to change the structure now and maintain only an advisory council for families on down the line? Hal asked what could we do as an advisory council. Max said they can come in and draw on what we already have on hand. Gordon said we should retain the Master Depository of data but not be responsible to get it out to anyone. The ancestral organization has lost its impetus because of the many families down from Gilbert. The family has grown too large. Each family should continue on now on their own and strengthen their own families. These families can get information from ancestral organization as needed, but he responsible to keep their own lines up. A lot of discussion back and forth was put out among all present. Gordon suggested the

past presidency be an advisory council to furnish information on a cost basis. All agreed it is time to disban the Gilbert line and move down to the grandfather lines. Max suggested these comments be accepted. Max moved to put before the next reunion a vote of dissolving the Gilbert Belnap Family Organization and Gordon seconded it.

Max discussed the process of how we need to send in our four generation group sheets and wanted to know if we should present it at the reunion. It was thought that they would all be receiving it in their wards and not needed at the reunion.

Gordon reported that the ship USS BELKNAP (CG-26) was recommissioned on May 10, 1980, and is sitting in the harbor at the Philadelphia Naval Shipyard. It will be homeported in Norfolk, Virginia. It is the first ship of her class to be modernized and equipped with Terrier SM-2(ER) long range missiles. Gordon's son, Brian L. Belnap, is serving a mission in Philadelphia and had the opportunity to attend and take a tour of the ship. It was a thrill for him and he was given special attention due to the fact that he had a nametag on that said his name was Belnap. This invited a lot of questions and raised eyebrows. The program booklet has a Belknap Coat of Arms on the cover that is almost identical to the one we have in the family.

Gordon reviewed the tentative agenda of the 1980 reunion to be held in Huntsville. It is hoped we can get in the building by 8:00~a.m. Max moved that the agenda be approved and it was seconded by LaGrande.

Gordon reported that the "CRIER" will be ready in a couple of weeks. Only 300 will be printed this year.

Knight mentioned that Dr. Richard Roberts of Weber State College is writing a history of Ogden. Could the family give him a copy of Heritage With Honor? Knight's wife suggested it be given to the College library rather than to him personally. All agreed this would be better then more could have access to it for research. Gordon seconded it and all voted in favor.

Material sent in for Dean's book can be picked up at the reunion; all manuscripts, etc.

The closing prayer was offered by Knight B. Harr and the meeting adjourned at 9:15 p.m.
