Dear Mr Gillespie:

Thank you for sending the copy of the will of Thomas Belknap of New Windsor.

May I ask you a question about it?

The date of the will itself -- in last two lines above the testator's signature -- is Oct 14 1797.

The date of probate -- in the certificate attached to the will -- is the same day: Oct 14 1797. *Reply says 30 May 1798*

As one thing I'm trying to establish is the date of his death, this identity of dates may be helpful if it means that he died on the day he signed the will. But I have no notion of the nature of the probate process at that time. So I don't know whether things could move so rapidly that a will could be probated on the day of death. All I know is that I haven't come across any other instance of such speed, in my work in genealogy.

Enclosed are some things just received from Salt Lake:

-- Copy of a letter dated Nov 14 1933 from Veterans Administration to Andrew K Smith (asst administrator of Salt Lake Genealogical Society at that time).

This gives much confirming data and additional data on the Thomas who served in the Revolutionary War. Most important new statement is "resident of Kingston, Ulster Co. N. Y." This should help in tracing his parentage.

-- Set of copies of sheets on file at Marmen church. These are hard to read, as very dim copies sent to me -- but can be read with aid of a reading glass, by anyone familiar with the names. Please check against your records and tell me what differences you find and what doubts about accuracy you may feel. (Such records at church HQ are often not very reliable.)  
at Salt Lake

-- Note ~~xxx~~ my red question marks on sheet numbered "1". If it can be proved that the Thomas ~~xxxx~~ Belknap of New Windsor NY, born 1729, was the father of your Rev War Thomas (as that sheet says), the line back to Abraham is plain. BUT all evidence yet found (by me) on this ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ New Windsor Thomas indicates that he never married and had no known children. He lived alone; and named no children in his will. The sheet numbered "1" cites no source for its data. (Other red notations are my copies of notes attached to sheets sent to me.)

So I have to keep on trying.

You'll note name of Emsey Fisher is given as "Melvina" (sometimes with "Emsey" in parenthesis). My guess is that her christened name was Melvina and that she acquired a childhood nickname based on initial "M" -- ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ "M-sie".

In second page of letter from Vet Admin 1933 (which is a typed copy, not the original) I've marked in red a sentence obviously not in the original letter but inserted by someone later on.

### THE WEST VIRGINIA BELKNAP FAMILY

I'm most grateful for all the material you sent on this family -- sheets for Velma Mansfield and Eliza Belknap Alpert -- and especially the copy of letter from Veterans Administration, 1933.

This letter may provide a clue to the problem that thus far has evaded me: the parentage of the Thomas who served in the Revolutionary war and married Naomi Dare.

Both Mrs Mansfield and some other descendants say that this Thomas was son of Thomas born Weburn Mass 1729 -- and give birth date as 1755, New Windsor, N Y.

All other records that I have seen say that Thomas 1729 never married, and lived alone at New Windsor. His will (I have copy) bequeaths all property to his brothers and sisters -- and mentions no children.

The letter from Vet Admin says the Thomas who served in Rev War enlisted at Kingston -- which is not far from Newburgh and New Windsor. But this is, so far, the only reason I have found for thinking him to come from the Newburgh Family, to which Thomas 1729 belonged. (I haven't found any Belknaps living at Kingston. Have you?)

Mrs Mansfield and others give no evidence supporting the parentage they show -- nor any evidence for date and place of birth they show -- and they do not give name of a wife of Thomas 1729. So their claim looks suspicious, on the face of it.

Was this attribution of parentage just one of the many erratic guesses that Evans made? The records put together by Mrs Mansfield and Hallie Belknap Weese seem to have been based in part on work by Evans -- which of course makes them questionable.

So I have to keep searching. Next step, when I can find time, is to locate a Newburgh Belknap who has records of that family -- beyond what has been published in the past. Meanwhile, I'll keep asking Mrs Mansfield, etc., for the missing evidence; but I doubt this will do much good. So far, they just don't answer this question of mine. If I ever get this one questionable point settled, we'll have scores of names to add to our records. For the present, I cannot accept the ~~XXX~~ parentage ~~XXX~~ shown by Mrs Mansfield, etc.

You mention existence of other Belknaps at Gassaway W Va. Any Belknaps now there are pretty certain to belong to this same branch. Fletcher Belknap, that town, does.

Incidentally, for your records. The name of the second wife of Thomas #2 above is commonly given as "Eusey" or "Eusey." I am fairly certain that she was christened Malvina Fisher, and that the "Eusey" was a childhood nickname based on ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ the sound of the letter M -- i.e., "Ma" then "Easy."

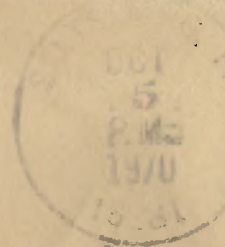

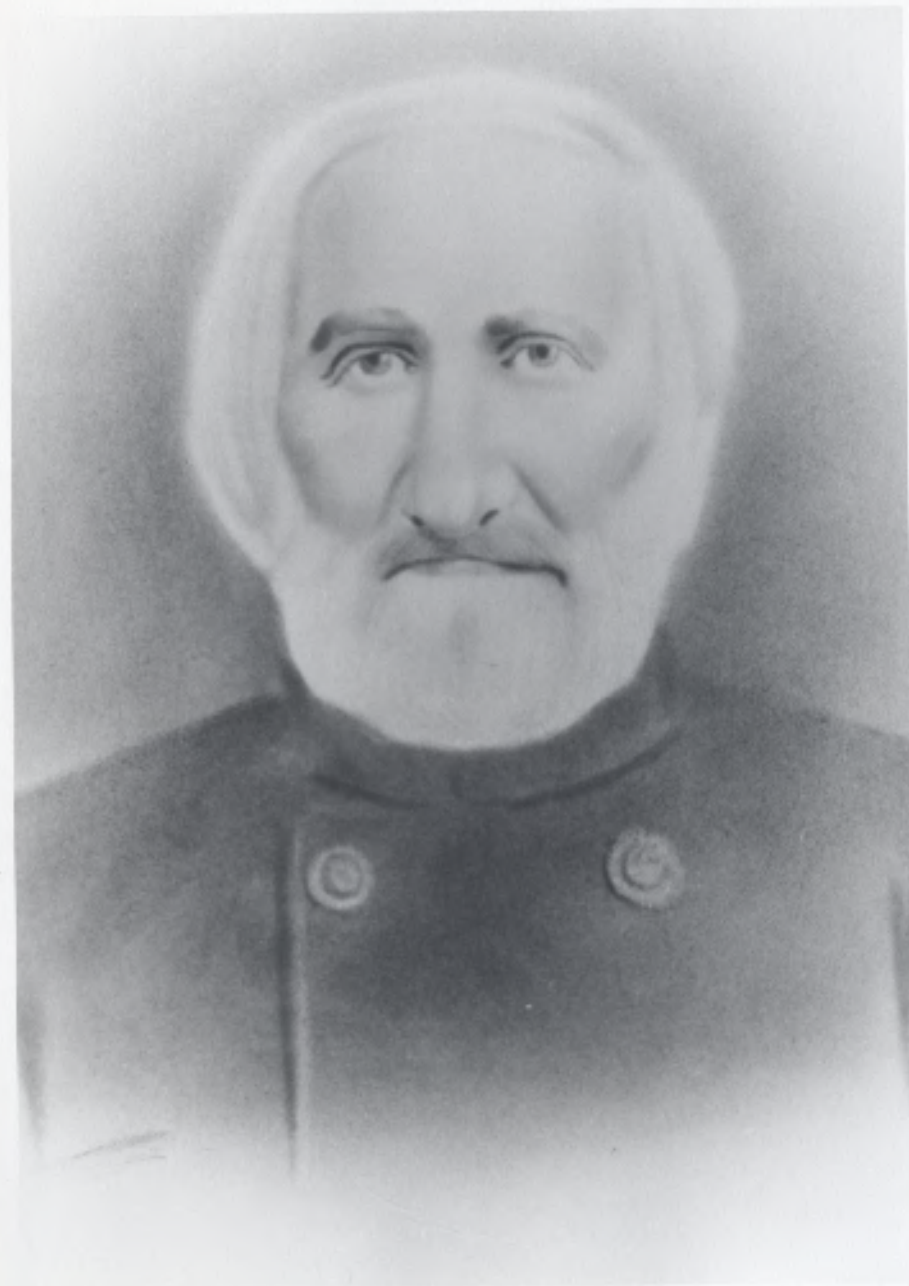

The note you mailed on Nov 23 makes me feel I should warn you against being too prompt in agreeing that Naomi Dare was the mother of the Texas who served in the War of 1812 -- unless you also agree that the family tradition that he was 104 when he died has to be abandoned. Another reason for writing this reply to your note is that I want to put a written record of the debatable points into my files, for sometimes a long time elapses before a puzzle is finally solved.

To begin with, we can be virtually certain that the Rev War Thomas was the father of the War of 1812 Thomas. ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~  
~~XXXX~~ But if the War of 1812 Thomas was born in 1779 he could not have been the son of Naomi Dars, for she was married in 1789. . . If he was born in 1795, as Mrs Mansfield says, then he could have been Naomi's son, and was only 86 when he died.

There are some reasons for doubting that the family tradition of the age of ~~THOMAS DARE~~ of the War of 1812 Thomas is correct. . . . (1) His first child by Mary Friend was born in 1823, so he probably married Mary not later than 1822.... (2) If he was born in 1779, then he was about 43 when he married Mary, which is extremely unlikely if she was his first wife -- which she appears to have been, as you have no record of children ~~XXX~~ of his by any earlier marriage. . . (3) If he was born in 1795, then he would have been about 27 when he married Mary Friend, which seems much more likely. . . (4) If he was born in 1779 he would have been 33 when he enlisted in War of 1812, which is very unlikely -- but would have been 17 or 18 if born in 1795, which is a more normal age for enlistment. . . (5) The fact that he named his first child Naomi, as if after Naomi Dare, suggests strongly that Naomi Dare was his mother.

Meanwhile, let's hope that continuing search will bring documented evidence to answer these and other "Ifs."

Dear Della:

What a fine friend you are. I'm most grateful for all the time/ and effort you put into helping trace the possible parentage of the father of the ~~THOMAS BELKNAP~~ Thomas Belknap who was born in Frederick Co, Va. in 1779. . . As you noted, the material ~~XXX~~ you sent me is full of problems and contradictions; but I think it may lead to a solution. Here's a brief summary of my present thinking about it.

(1) Evans' confusion about John and Thomas as father of John Thomas can be dismissed as just one of his many blunders. The record of John b. 1734 is known and well substantiated. He could not have been the father of a John Thomas born 1755. ~~XX~~ If any of the Newburgh-Kingston Belknaps was this father, it would have to be Thomas b/ 1729, who did have a son named Thomas, born 1755.

(2) It is true that a Thomas Belknap married Naomi ~~XXX~~ Dare in Philadelphia, Pa., but the date was Oct 17 1789 -- not 1791. There is, as yet, no proof of his parentage. No evidence on this, in material you found.

(Hampshire Co and Braxton Co, Va)

(3) Places of residence named by Evans, for Naomi and her husband, make it seem probable that her husband ~~XX~~ was the "John Thomas" we are looking for. But Naomi could not have been mother of the Thomas born 1779. Might have been stepmother (2nd wife of the Thomas whom she married in 1789).

(4) The key question seems to be: Did the ~~XX~~ Thomas (John Thomas?) who married Naomi Dare come originally from the Newburgh-New Windsor-Kingston area? If he did, then he would just about have to be the Thomas born 1755, son of Thomas born 1729.

It may be that the military and pension records in Nat. Archives will supply the answer. So I'm sending for them.

I'll keep you informed. May be able to give you a lot of new names in several generations, to add to your records -- if Nat Archives supply the missing link..

I am writing to you because I have been told that you are a descendant of Thomas Belknap of ~~Wetmore~~ West Va., and his first wife Mary Friend.

In working on the preparation of a Belknap genealogy, I've been trying to establish the line of descent of this Thomas. If you can help me on this task, I'll be very grateful.

<sup>is</sup>  
I believe it almost certain that his father was the Thomas Belknap who married Naomi Dare in the Third Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia, Pa., on 17 October 1789.

And I think it probable that his grandfather was the Thomas Belknap (born 18 April 1789, in Woburn, Mass.) who was a son of Thomas Belknap and Sarah Wright. But I have not yet found any proof to support my belief.

What I know about this Thomas (I'll call him Thomas 1729, to distinguish him from all the other Thomases in his line) is: (1) his birth date and birthplace; (2) that on March 8 1776 he wrote to General Lee ~~proposing~~ proposing the formation of a company of riflemen; (3) that he probably raised this company, which became a part of the 2nd Regiment, Ulster County Militia; (4) and that in 1782 he was Commissioner of Highways at New Windsor, N. Y.

What I do not have evidence for, about him, is that he married and had children.

On this score, all that I have found is some statements by recent and present day Belknaps, with no supporting evidence.

Unfortunately, genealogy demands the sort of evidence that I haven't yet found -- in order to say with reasonable certainty that Thomas 1729 was the ~~father~~ father of the Thomas who married Naomi Dare.

If you can tell me where to look for the proof that I need, I'll be deeply in your debt.

Thanks for the clipping about Hallie Weese. I had her marriage -- but not the names of her children. So it will add to the record of that Virginia family -- which I'll send to you when (and if) I determine the parentage of the ~~THOMAS~~ Thomas who married Naomi Dare.

From Nat Archives, I have received proof of his service in Rev War, ~~and~~ and copies of papers which indicate that he must have been the father of the Thomas (in Virginia) who served in War of 1812.

But I have not yet found any proof of the following points in Mrs Mansfield's lineage sheets:

- That the Thomas who served in War of 1812 was born 1795 and was son of Naomi Dare. (Other descendants say he was born 1779, ~~THOMAS~~ ~~THOMAS~~ ten years before Naomi's marriage,) in which case Naomi presumably was his father's second wife.)
- That the Rev War Thomas was born 1755 (which would make him 34 at marriage to Naomi in 1789, so an earlier marriage might be likely).
- That this Rev War Thomas was son of the Thomas born 1729, son of Thomas Belknap and Sarah Wright. (I have the will of this New Windsor Thomas. It names only his brothers and their children, and his sister Sarah -- no wife or children of his own are mentioned. So maybe he never married, which is the old tradition.)

So you see I have problems, before I can send you the record of the family from which Hallie Weese and Velma Mansfield come. Lots of names in it, for the second Thomas had 22 children by his two wives.

Had a nice letter from Mrs Mansfield, giving me the name and address of a niece who, she says, has all her records. I've written to the niece. No reply yet.

You mention a son of Mrs Weese who is not listed in the obituary: "the oldest one, who was killed in an auto accident." Can you give me his name?

Sorry to take so long to answer your letter. It seems like there is always a problem in every line you check. There is one in this line and I thought maybe I could get some correct information before I answered. I'll send what I have and maybe you can find more information on this line.

I'm enclosing a pedigree chart. Most of which was given me by Mrs. Velma H. Mansfield of Sacramento, Calif. And a little information I had. We thought it was fairly correct. After reading Glen Adams' record it's the same line only there seem to be a mix up in two Thomas'.

Mrs. Alberts of Tremonton, Utah use to come visit with my father. They tried to connect her family to our line, but they didn't find the connecting link. She was a relative of Mrs Hallie Belnap Weese of Ogden. A Mr Bailey Belknap of Virginia lived near me. He was from Virginia and was a cousin of Mrs Mansfield. He was not interested in family history and would give us nothing. He died just a few months ago. Mrs. Hallie Belknap Weese is also dead. She has children here some where, but have been out of contact with them. I have written many times to Mrs. Mansfield for more information on her family. She never did answer. She was very friendly while here and glad to obtain the information I had. Her letters are never returned, so I do think she is still alive.

Do you have a copy of Glen Evans record of Landsing, Mich. If so you will find that he agrees with this pedigree until we reach Thomas Belknap who married Mary Friend. He has 2 different Thomas that marry Mary or Mary Polly Friend and E. Fisher. One of the Thomas's father is Thomas and the other Thomas's father is John. Both Thomas and John are the sons of Thomas Belknap B<sup>1698</sup> and Sarah Wright. She was the widow of Isaac Hill. You will find what I have on this line in the books of Family Group Sheets I loaned you. I have marked in red the pages on the pedigree chart.

The connecting link according to Mrs. Mansfield was John Thomas Belnap and Naomi Dare. I have not done any research on this branch line as yet. I was in hopes our U. S. researcher would help us out. He has been so busy with his job and traveling that he hasn't done much.

Also enclosing what has been filed at the Salt Lake Gen. Library since 1941. If filed before that date it was an individual cards and not as a family. I spent yesterday at the Salt Lake Library. Didn't have time to do more than check the family sheets. To check by the individual name. A card has to be made for each name and it is mailed to you later. This takes a lot of time. Also I didn't have time to check out records on Virginia. One day does not give time to do much when there is so much material to go thru.

Hope this helps some or at least it will give you an idea as to where this line fits in. I sincerely hope our books have helped you some.

Have received from Atty Nuel Belnap of Chicago, Ill. a map of the town of Sawbridgeworth, Herts, Eng. His son had some made for him while he was in England. I haven't had time to study it thoroughly. If you would like one I think I could get one sent to you. He said he had some extra ones. I have also received copies of the original Wills of 3 Belnaps from Dr. W. Dean Belnap of London. A short version of these wills are in the New Eng Hist & Gen Reg. But I see in Henry Belnap's will in the New Eng. Reg. left out one child. I also was interested that the original Will of Henry, the name is spelt BELNAP. I'll send you a copy of these also if you would like to have them.

Thanks for calling my attention to page 774 to the mis copy of the death date of Thomas Belknap b. 1698. The record of H W B that I have says the first three children were of Newburgh, N. Y. I see Glen Evan Rec. said the children were born in Worburn. Page 806a Sarah Belknap does marry Isaac Belknap, only there is no marriage date given. Are you making these corrections or making notes of additional information on our record. It would help us if this was done in pencil, if this is not too much to ask. As I'm sending you all that I can find. Although it may not be too much.

Now to your letter to Mrs. Mansfield. I hope she has answered you. I have found that she is still living and was here last month. I was surprised that Mrs. Hallie Belknap Weese was alive until Oct 14, 1970. She is a relative of Mrs. Velma Mansfield. I have talked to Mrs. Weese's son Carl who lives in Ogden. He said his mother had many records and papers. He didn't know much about them but his brother Harry was the one that was interested in genealogy ~~had~~ and understood it. So he had his mother's records. I have written to him to see if he will help us or have it copied for us.

I didn't get to her services to meet her children or Mrs. Mansfield as I was at the hospital with my sister and didn't get to read the papers. I felt sorry that I didn't see the paper sooner. Then I haven't kept in touch with them since.

Dear Mr Harris:

I'm enclosing a set of the documents obtained from National Archives, in response to inquiries about the Thomas Balknap who has been said to be the father of the Thomas who married Mary Friend and Emsey Fisher. Please let me know if you agree that these documents probably confirm that parentage. The confirmation, thus far, rests solely on geography -- notably the fact that the elder Thomas was in Hampshire County at the time when the younger Thomas enlisted. The other place-names in the documents may strengthen the confirmation; but you can judge this better than I can.

This elder Thomas married Naomi Dare in the 3rd Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia, Pa., on Oct 17, 1789 -- according to the records of that church. Mrs Mansfield believes that Naomi was the mother of the younger Thomas, whose birth she says was in 1795.

As you will see, the enclosed papers (with one exception, which I'll discuss later) are records of applications made by Naomi after the death of her husband Dec 18 1835.

The one dated Nov 26 1839 is her application for a pension. Of special interest, here, is the portion of her marriage certificate, which can be interpreted to read that at the time of the marriage both Naomi and this Thomas were residents of Philadelphia.

remaining

The REMAINING papers (except the last sheet) deal with subsequent applications for bounty land as widow of a Rev War veteran. The naming of the warrant -- Bounty Land Warrant 32230-160-55 on the cover sheet -- indicates that her claim succeeded, thus providing firm proof of the Rev War service of her husband in case any of his present descendants wishes to join the D.A.R. or S.A. R.

The last sheet, about a Thomas Balknap who had served in Weissenfels' Regiment, troubles me a bit. There is no supporting evidence, as yet, to prove that this Thomas was the one who married Naomi Dare. And some doubt is occasioned in my mind by the fact ~~THAT~~ that this document appears in only one of the two files sent to me by National Archives. (Trying for further information, I made a second application with different wording and received the same papers, minus this Weissenfels sheet.)

I'll be interested in your comments.

No real progress, yet, on identifying the parentage of this elder Thomas; but I'm still trying.

Dear Mr Harris:

Thanks for the additional sheets you sent to me of Sept 12.

I promised to tell you the results of my inquiry to National Archives, based on data obtained by Della Belnap from Mrs Velma Mansfield (born Velma Harris, at Trace Run, W Va, 3 June 1898), granddaughter of Israel Belnap.

The material received from the National Archives seems to substantiate Mrs Mansfield's statement that the father of the Thomas Belnap who served in the War of 1812 was the Thomas Belnap who married Naomi Dare in Philadelphia Pa 17 Oct 1789 (as reported in Pennsylvania Archives, 2nd Series, v IX, p. 517). Mrs Mansfield gave the date of this marriage as 1791.

The apparent link to the second Thomas is circumstantial and geographic. The documents in the file from National Archives show that Thomas and Naomi Dare were living in Hampshire County, Va, in ~~1835~~ 1835 -- the county in which the son Thomas enlisted for service in the War of 1812. And the full record on places of residence, as shown in these documents, makes it seem highly probable that the Thomas who married Naomi Dare ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ was the father of your Thomas:

1789 -- marriage certificate shows that both this Thomas and Naomi were then residents of Philadelphia.  
1810 -- they lived in Pendleton Co, Va  
1835 -- Thomas died in Hampshire Co, 18 Dec ~~1835~~ 1835  
1839 -- widow Naomi lived in Hampshire Co.  
1855 -- " " " " Braxton Co  
1857 -- " " " " Harrison Co

National Archives records indicate that this Thomas was the Thomas Belnap who served in Col Weisenfel's Regiment, New York Levies, in 18 1781 and/or 1782. Naomi, applying for pension as his widow, said he served "between eighteen and twenty four months" but did not know the name of his regiment. The file, as sent to me, ~~gx~~ contains no evidence supporting its identification of the regiment. As there is reason to believe that Nat Archives has further data on this Thomas, I'll write to them again.

For the moment, however, I want to deal with the question of whether Mrs Mansfield is right in saying that your Thomas was the son of ~~HEM~~ Naomi Dare. As Naomi married the elder Thomas in 1789, your Thomas could not be her son if he was born in 1779 (or 1778) as you have said. Mrs Mansfield says he was born in 1795 (or 1798). So I'm forced to ask you to tell me the source of your date, 1779 (or 1778). I'll also write to Mrs Mansfield, asking for her source for 1795 (1798) but I've been told that she no longer answers letters.

Also, please, the source of your date of 1783 for birth of Mary Friend. Mrs Mansfield said 1801.

The documents received from Nat Archives contain no clue to the parentage of the Thomas who married Naomi Dare.

Mrs. Mansfield has said he was a son of Thomas Belknap of New Windsor, N. Y., and was born in 1755. This may be correct, but I have no evidence supporting it. ~~THAT NEW WINDSOR THOMAS (WHO WAS BORN 1729 IN WOBURN, MASS.) IS "UNFINISHED BUSINESS" IN ALL RECORDS I HAVE SEEN, FOR NO ONE HAS A RECORD OF HIS MARRIAGE -- AND ONLY ONE INVESTIGATOR OF WHOM I KNOW HAS NAMED ANY CHILDREN OF HIS.~~ That New Windsor Thomas (who was born 1729 in Woburn, Mass.) is "unfinished business" in all records I have seen, for no one has a record of his marriage -- and only one investigator of whom I know has named any children of his.

That one exception was Glenn Evans, an employee of Mich State Library -- the most inaccurate and careless person who ever dabbled in genealogy. Twice, some years ago, Evans said that the Thomas born 1729 had a son Thomas (or J. Thomas) who was born in 1755 and married Naomi Dare. He gave no proof -- and did not name the mother. And he named no other children.

(At one point, Evans also said that the Thomas who was born in 1755 was son of John, a brother of Thomas 1729. But this was so obviously incorrect that I shan't bother you with the details of its errors.)

Much as I distrust everything that Evans wrote, I still find it well to try to track down anything he says, for once in a while he actually has something that no one else has found.

For the moment, I see only three things to do: (1) write to Mrs. Mansfield, asking for evidence, in hope of a helpful reply; (2) try Nat Archives again, as I've already said, and (3) send a copy of this letter to Della Belnap, who may know something I don't know. Other steps can be taken after I hear from Mrs. Mansfield.

Meanwhile, my thanks for the photos -- which arrived while I've been writing this letter.

PS: I enclose a page showing differences in dates for Thomas Belknap and Mary Friend and their children. I hope we get it straightened out, some day.

NOTE: In my letter Sept 14 I gave Kingston N Y as residence of the Thomas Belknap who may have been the father of the Thomas who married Naomi Dare. An error on my part. I was thinking, apparently, of the place where the second Thomas has been said to have died in 1776.

NOTE: ~~XXXXXXXX~~ given by Evans seem to have come from Mrs Mansfield and from ~~HALLIE~~ Hallie Belknap Weese. At one point in his notes, he repeats the tradition ~~XXXXXX~~ that Thomas was 104 when he died in 1883; but in that same part of his notes he shows Thomas born 1795, which would make him only 91 at death. In the section of his notes where Evans gives 1779 as date of birth, he adds a parenthesis saying that ~~XXXXXXXX~~ Thomas's pension application shows born 1795. Papers obtained ~~XXXXXX~~ by CYB from National Archives do not contain copy of T's pension application and give no indication of birth date. As Evans habitually relied on whatever anyone told him and seldom or never sought primary documentary sources, there is no reason to think that he himself examined any such pension application. If anyone has seen ~~XXXXXXXX~~ this application, it must have been Velma Mansfield or Hallie Weese.

Dear Mr Harris:

My thanks for the sheets showing descendants of your great grandfather Thomas Belknap. They are very welcome. But you seem to have omitted ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ one child in listing the 13 children of Andrew Harris and Elizabeth Belknap, for you named only 12.

worth it's ~~XXXX~~ tackling -- for he is (as far as I can find) the only Belknap known to have been in Virginia by 1800.

My first step was to look for a possible identification of his father -- whose name you said was also Thomas. But I could find no Thomas who could possibly have been a son Thomas in Frederick Co. Virginia in 1779. However, in a handwritten note enclosed with the sheets you have sent to me, you give his name as John Thomas Belknap. This offered another chance for search. So I looked for a John Belknap whose descendants have not yet been traced. And I found two possibilities.

(1) A John Belknap for whom there is no further record may have been born about 1737 in Westboro, Mass. But there is, as yet, no proof of his birth. There is only an unconfirmed family tradition, which seems untrustworthy. Yet, if he existed, he might have been the man we are looking for.

(2) A John Belknap for whom there is no further record was born in Boston, Mass. in 1710. He would have been 69 years old when your great grandfather was born in 1779. Too old? Not necessarily. Or he might have had a child whom he named John Thomas. What makes this man interesting is that his father, Samuel, was in the early 18th Century, the "farthest South" Belknap of that time. In 1721 and 1730 he lived in New Brunswick, New Jersey. A son of this Samuel might have gone farther south.

Of course these are only possibilities -- nothing more.

For evidence, it will be necessary to start at the other end -- in Frederick County and Hampshire County -- both in Virginia in 1779 and 1812.

As I have done no research in Virginia, I don't know what records are available there. But I'm hoping that two types of records available in other states may go back that far in Virginia. So I'm going to suggest that you write to the County Clerks (or whatever the right title may be) in those two counties, asking if they have the following types of records for the period 1750 to 1850:

(1) PROBATE RECORDS -- Wills, or abstracts of wills, may give good clues.

(2) DEEDS -- Records of land transactions often give direct evidence of parentage. I'm hoping that lists of deeds, showing dates and names of ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ grantors and grantees, may be obtainable -- so that we'll know what copies of deeds to ask for.

I'm suggesting that you do this, because your title will surely get you better and swifter cooperation than I would be likely to get.

As I am engaged in work on a Belknap genealogy, a letter from you to Charlene Belknap Taylor, in 1968, has been passed along to me.

If you wish, you<sup>and</sup> and I may be able to help each other. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~

I may be able to aid you by tracing the ancestry of your great grandfather Thomas Belknap. And you may be able to help me by providing information about his descendants.

As to the ancestry of Thomas, any hints you can give me from family tradition might be helpful -- name of his father, where he came from, and so on. Though family tradition isn't always reliable, it often suggests where to search.

As to his descendants, I'm enclosing a sheet on which I have tried to sketch what is said about him and his children in the three sheets that were attached to your letter -- numbered page 12, page 18, and page ~~25~~ 26. I'm sure that my effort must be full of errors, which I hope you'll correct -- for I found difficulty in determining (or guessing) which children belonged to whom. (For instance, was Ann Rebecca daughter of Thomas and Bessy? Or daughter of John? Or were there two Ann Rebeccas?)

I hope you'll be willing to take the trouble to straighten out that ~~sketch~~ sheet, and then go on to draft similar sheets for later generations -- the children of Thomas's children, ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ and so on -- for I'm trying to compile a record that brings the family down to the present time, including those now living.

I hope you be able to give me ~~XXXX~~ full dates as you go along -- not just the year. But whatever you can supply will be welcome. (I tried to work out a sheet for the children of Andrew -- but the information on this was just too thin.)

As no doubt you know, all Belknaps in this country are believed to be descended from the Abraham Belknap who came to Massachusetts in 1637. If I can trace the link from Abraham to your great grandfather, I'll be ~~XXX~~ able to give you your Belknap ancestry back to about 1500.

The Cemetery records are not complete either so I read every single marker in the Cemetery, I found where Simon T, Albert was burried in the Garland Cemetery the dates are born, Feb, 14, 1848, and died Jan, 20 1932. his wifes name is on the stone as Eliza Anne Belknap but no dates at all (I would assume that he died first and no one recorded her death date on the stone, you can tell there is a grave there besides his but is unmarked,

Mr, Albert owned a Hone that was located where our Present Church now stands, he sold his property to the Church.

The Mr, Johnson has been a harder task and I am not sure that I have your Great Uncle but it is all that I can find out,

There is a man and two wives burried here as fellows all were born in Denmark (The letter goes on to explain but my Opinion is that they are not my Relatives)

There are several People here who remembers a Shoemaker named Johnson who lived near the ~~SEKESSE~~, Alberts, I cannot find out if this Carl A, Johnson is the same as the Shoemakers or not, Maybee you will know,

The Shoemaker had a very long Beard. a Lady here has a photo of him. She says he was a very good Swimmer so her grandfather told her and when someone drowned in deep water they would get Mr, Johnson to recoverx the body some have told me that the Shoemaker left here and did not die here but could have been brought back for Burrial,

I hope this will tie in with what you have and be of help to you.

Dear Della:

Can I induce you to help link up a Belknap family that has not previously been known? It's worth doing, for it's the only Belknap family ever located in West Virginia, as far as I know.

The problem is to determine the immediate ancestry of Thomas Belknap, born 1778 (or 1789) in Frederick County, Virginia -- died 30 Nov 1833, Braxton County, West Virginia. (He may have been the son of another Thomas, born circa 1750, perhaps, but this is uncertain.) No known link to other Belknaps.

The only hope I can see, toward solving the puzzle, is that one of his daughters -- Eliza Ann, who married Simon T ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ Albert -- became a Mormon and lived and died in Garland, Utah. The grave of her husband, bearing his name and hers, was reported examined at Garland Cemetery in 1967. (He died 1932.)

I have what is obviously a set of fragmentary notes based on her Church genealogical records. These notes do not indicate whether or not she submitted any record farther back than her father. I'm hoping that she did. Can you find out for me?

This ~~Thomas~~ Thomas (1778) seems to have been quite a character. Had 12 children by his first wife, Mary Friend. When she died in 1830, he promptly married again: Emsey Fisher, aged 26 -- he was then 71. Had 8 more children by his second wife. Died at age 104.

The Alberts, at Garland, seem to have had at least three sons -- names not known to me.

Aside from the somewhat garbled data sent in by a descendant of Thomas (police chief in a small town in Pennsylvania), I have no other record of this West Va family.

I'll be grateful for your help -- I hope.
