THE BELKNAPS IN RENNSALAER COUNTY NY -- John, Eli, Asa

In your letter 25 Jan you speak of difficulty in following what I said about Eli Belkmap & Clarissa Lyman. This means that the memo I sent on Misidentifications by HWB wasn't detailed enough. So I'll try, now, to give you the full record. As it will have be rather technical, I hope you'll be patient with it. And I warn you that in order to understand the story you really need a good map, for I'll be talking about tiny villages that don't appear on such things as Rand McNally, maps -- but can be found on the better maps issued by gasoline companies.

I must begin by telling the beginning of my search, when I got in touch with John Sherman as the result of a letter he had written to HWB in 1934, showing that HWB was wrong in saying that John's ancestor Foris Belknap was a son of William Belknap (as he appeared on the HWB records in my possession). John responded by sending me a voluminous file of data he had accumulated since 1934, so that I could make copies for my files. . . So we began a collaboration that took five years -- in which lots of time was spent in going up blind alleys in order to say "No."

John's problem was that he had no documentary proof that the Foris who married Sarah Bateman in Ohio in 1813 was the Foris who was born in Holland, Mass. in 1788. In 1793, John Belknap Jr, father of the Massachusetts Foris, left Holland and vanished from all records that Sherman had found. The 20 year gap between 1793 and 1813 was blank. Till that gap was filled, Sherman had no right to say that his Foris was the Foris who was born in Holland.

Trying to plug that gap, Sherman had spent years and years digging up records on all unattached John Belknaps that he could find. None of them, thus far, had been proved to be the John Jr from Holland -- yet one of them might be, including one of the various John Belknaps on record in Rennsalaer County in the early 1800s. At this point, I came into the picture -- and, following that trail, came out with something unexpected: proof that HWB had been wrong in identifying the Eli who married Clarissa Lyman and the Asa who married Abia Deverix.

HWB had found in VR Peru, Mass., the marriage of Eli and Clarissa, and in VR Oakham, Mass., the record of intention of marriage (not the actual marriage) of an Asa and Abia Deverix. He had also found, in VR Brookfield Mass. the marriage of a John Belknap and Sarah Walker.

HWB had no reason to think that these three records were linked together. Sherman and I found the linkage by studying records that were not available to HWB-- the US Census records for 1790, 1800, 1810, 1820; and a fine little book published in 1947, Wright & Harvey. The Settlement and Story of Oakham. Mass., which is a collection of original records of that tiny village.

I'll summarize what we found, on the next page, so that you can see the whole picture at one time.

In naming sources, below, "W&H" means the book by Wright & Harvey. The three items known to HWB are indicated by (HWB) in the margin.

- (HWB) 15 Feb 1769 -- VR Brookfield, Mass. (a little west of Worcester) -- John Belknap m Sarah Walker. (Identified by HWB as son of John Belknap & Ruth Farr, of Westborough, Mass.)

 - 1784 -- W& H -- John buys land in Oakham, "The Elson Hapgood Place."
 - 1785 -- W&H -- He sells his farm in New Braintree.
 - 1785 -- W&H -- He is named Pound Keeper at Oakham.
 - 1790 -- Census, Oakham -- Shows 7 members in family, 3 sons and 2 daughters.

 " W& H -- Shows wife as "Sarah" and names 2 sons: Eli and Asa.

 (Census records, 1800 and 1810 indicate that Eli was born not later than 1774, and that Asa was born between 1774 and 1784, so it appears they were born at New Braintree.)
 - 1791 -- W&H -- John is named Fence Viewer.
 - (HWB) 15 Nov 1798 -- Oakham VR -- Intention of marriage, Asa Belknap and Abia Deverix

 "of Stephenton." (In his record, HWB added "Mass"

 though there was no town of that name in Massachusetts,
 according to NEHGS staff.)
 - (This record seems to mean that Asa had already gone to Stephen Town, NY, and that the intention was being published in his home town, Oakham, as required by church rules. The actual marriage presumably took place in Stephen Town, NY, Abia's home -- possibly by an itinerant minister, no church records available for that year.
 - 1 June 1799 -- W&H -- John sells his farm at Oakham. (No further record there.)
 - 1800 -- Census, Stephen Town NY -- Shows John, Eli, Asa on adjoining farms.

 (Stephen Town, in census record, was not the village of that name but the Town (township) in which these farms were located. Later records show that they were at or near the village of Nassau, which was in that Town. Census fagures for John agree with Oakham records.)
 - (HWB) 9 Oct 1800 -- VR Peru, Mass. (Called Partridgefield at that time) -- Marriage of Eli Belknap and Clarissa Lyman, "He of StephensTown." Again HWB added 'Mass." to name of place. (Obvious inference: Eli had met Clarissa on his way from Oakham to Stephen Town NY and returned to Peru -- a bit east of Pittsfield and on the natural way to Rennsalaer County -- to marry her.)

On his sheet for Eli and Clarissas Lyman, HWB continued to write Stephen Town, Mass. although showing simultaneously Nassau NY as place of residence. But his ignorance of geography was immense. I don't think he ever looked at a map.

When I had put together the record shown on the preceding page, I knew that I would have to remove Eli and Clarissa and some 60 or more of their children and grandchildren from the line in which HWB had placed them. But I haven't yet done the editing that is needed, on their records -- which have some details that require careful study. This task has been deferred because other jobs were more urgent.

Now the next point that troubles you -- the identification of John of New Braintree and Oakham as son of John Belknap and Ruth Farr.

HWB's final record on children of this couple differs from the one you have. It shows:

John.
Lydia b 1744
Joseph b 1745
Lucy
Stephen b 19 June 1757
Ebenezer b 27 June 1760

Only the last two of these dates are in VR Westborough. I believe this is because those VR did not start till about 1747. HWB's birthdates for Lydia and Joseph came from genealogies of the families of their spouses -- thus cannot be regarded as certain, but seem reasonable. He had no birthdate for John and Lucy. The Census figures for John seem to indicate that he was born about 1740 to 1743.

HWB's identification of John of New Braintree and Oakham was not made at the time when he found the record of the marriage to Sarah Walker. He made it with a pencilled note, at some later time -- without indicating a reason or a source. So I don't know how good it is -- and I see no way to find proof or disproof. Consequently, my record will show that his parentage (John Belknap and Ruth Farr) rests solely on an identification made by HWB.

Why do I do this? Because HWB twice made what I call an "Evans identification" based on nothing but similarity of name. Evans did this constatly, thus creating lots of problems for you and me. And HWB did it on Eli and Asa -- so, dammit, he may have done it on their father John.

While I'm on this subject, I invite you to look at the record of birth of children of Ruth Farr, as shown above. She m in 11736 -- then no known children till 1740 or a year or so later, then children in 1744 and 1745 and one (undated) between 1745 and 1757(12 years later) and finally one in 1760 -- a total of 6 in 24 years after marriage. Doen't make sense, does it? Makes me wonder if some of the early Belknaps not yet identified might be Ruth's children, not recorded in faulty VR Westborough. I think I've told you how experts in New England genealogy have warned me that the early VRs were often written up from memory or scraps of records, years late, and can't be trusted at all. Heaven knows, I've found errors in a number of them.

PS: As you know, John Sherman's problem was finally solved in 1973, when we found the Oneida County deeds for John Jr. John III, Eli. Timothy, and Foris -- which was still further proof that the Eli who married Clarissa Lyman wasn't John Jr's son, and wasn't the Eli who was born at Holland.

When filing my copyi of memo on the Rennsalaer County Belknaps, I recalled that Commander Charles showed documentary proof of the fact that John Belknap of Westborough and Ruth Farr had a son named John, who is not in your records.

So I enclose a copy of page 31 of his book on the Framingham and Haverhill Belknaps -- on which there's the abstract of a deed bearing the signature of John Belknap. <u>Jr</u>.

THE RENNSALAER COUNTY BELKNAPS -- John, Eli, Asa

In your letter 25 Jan you speak of difficulty on Eli, etc -- meaning that in the memo I sent along with sheets for Joseph and Prudence and some of their descendants I did net go far enough in explaining the Rennsatelaer County Belknaps whom nWB identified Today I'll try to make things a bit plainer.

The starting point, in your thinking as in mine, must be the proven fact that the Eli who was a descendant of Joseph & Prudence was in Oneida County in 1800 - thus could that possibly have been the Eli who was at Stephen Town in Renasalaer County in 1800 and 1810. When John Sherman and I reached this conclusion, in 1969 or 1970, we had the task of determining the ancestry of the Eli in Rennsalaer County -- for I couldn't just discard scores of Belknaps whom HWB' had wrongly identified. Eventually we found that this Eli must be son of the John Belknap who was at Oakham, Mass. in the " service of New Braintee 71947 Bosta)

Here's what we found on the record of that John: (I suggest looking at a map, to 15 Feb 1769, m Sarah Walker at Brookfield, Mass. follow the story)

24 July 1781 - YR New Braintree , Mass - a child of John Belknap dies. No name shown. (O that)

1784 -- John buys land in Oakham. ("The Elson Hapgood Place")

17%5 -- He sells his farm in New Braintree. (We conclude that he had into thom y lived at New Braintree in the 70's and early 80s.) (O HUT

1785 -- Pound Keeper at Oakham

1790 4- Census, Oakham -- shows 7 members in his family, including 3 sons and 2 daughters Co the records show wife as "Sarah" and name two sons, Elicand Asa.

I think that's far enough in the record to show why we identified Eli and Asa as sons of John of New Braintree and Oakham.

Thank you for your two interesting letters, and the return of the material I sent you. It was good of you, to answer the questions I posed, relating to various Belknap family branches. Thank you, too, for the information about Abraham Belknap.

In "The Settlement & Story of Oakham, Mass.," by Wright & Harvey, 1947, on page 418, is some information about a John Belknap. It is headed by Jio "Belknap of New Braintree." Belknap, John, bought land of James Blair in 1784, (the 1790 Census Mass., 230, Edson Hapgood Place). Sold his New Braintree farm in 1785 and sold his Oakham farm to Richard Kelley, June 1, 1799 (deeds) 99:93. His family consisted of seven members in 1790. Married ? Children: 1. Asa, m. Abia Deverix of Stephenton: Intention, November 15, 1798 (O.V.R. 58); ii. Eli, 127:594. 256

New Braintree, Mass., Vitals - Deaths: Beldknop, July 24, 1781.

Brookfield, Mass., Vitals - Marriages: Belnap, John and Sarah Walker, Feb. 15, 1769; Joseph and Sarah Walker, int. Feb. __, 1769; Nathaniel and Hannah Ayres, Aug. 31, 1777.

The above, would seem to be a lot of confusion. Did Sarah Walker marry Joseph, or John? And, who were other members of John and Sarah's family? Where did they go, after selling their Oakham place? I have a record, someplace, where John Belknap joined the Church, at Oakham. I thought, at first, this John, was the father of Foris! (Among my notes, is the information, that Jonathan Devereaux, a Revolutionary soldier, was buried here). Incidentally, those Devereauxs are a difficult family to trace. They appear to spring from an unwed pregnancy of Sarah Smith, with Jonathan Devereaux. This child, Jonathan, is said to have married a Seymour. They were parents of Joseph, who was guardian of Foris Belknap. I wish I had access to Rensselaer County Wills, and Deeds; although, I wonder if they would show much.

Do you think, that the John, buried in Barberville Cemetery, is the father of Foris? The age does not seem right. There could be another generation? These Johns are a confused lot.

Foris named a daughter, Lucretia D. Belknap; and I wonder if she was not named for Lucretia Hinds, (Foris' step-sister), who might have married a Devereaux?

In Washington County, Ohio, Robert Andrews, brother of Jason Andrews, (with whose family Sarah Bateman lived), in his will, named his nephew, Alanson Devereaux. I just do not have enough data, to form a clear picture.

Mrs. Jane Belknap, was distressed, when she visited the cemetery, at Alexandria, Ohio, to find that a cyclone had struck it - she said it was a mess. I suppose that Foris and Sarah's stone was carried aloft. I have a snap-shot of it - but not very good.

If I were in Columbus, Ohio, I am sure I could find information in the old newspaper collections, at the Ohio State Museum. I used to visit it, often, as a young boy, and counted Dr. William Mills, and Mr. Charles B. Galbreath, Librarian, among my close friends. Licking County records, were mostly destroyed, when the courthouse burned, some years ago.

Please excuse this disjoined letter. I have had to haul out a lot of records to write, and feel it is hardly worthy of the effort. There are a few records, which you might be able to add to your collection - perhaps some of them will fit into an understandable pattern - I hope so.

Again, many thanks for your interesting letters, and for returning the photo-copied material I sent you.

I shan't try to give you all the long and detailed evidence from wills, deeds, vital records, etc -- for that would take pages and pages. I'll just try to sum up what new seems to be the truth. Your sheet 489 contains this error -- which traces to errors by HWB and others,

Your sheet 489 shows children of two John Belknaps, not just one. And it shows only some of the children of each of the two. And it contains other errors or omissions, So here's what I now believe is right. in my judgment.

NOTE 2, ELI. Your sheet 489 shows marriage to "Cleracy Lynn." This presumably is the Clarises Lyman (nicknamed Cleracy) who married the Eli that HWB thought was sen of John and LITISHIX There is sound evidence that this Eli could not have been that sen. I believe him to be sen of the John Belknap who EME married Sarah Walker. That John wasprebably sen of John Belknap of Westbere Mass and his 2nd wife Ruth Farr (he is not shown on your sheet KHIX 443).

Incidental comments on your sheets 442 and 443:

Well, it looks very simple, when I sat it down. But I can't begin to tell you how much work went into this revision - beginning as far back as about 1930 when one of HWB's correspondents challenged his findings. It's only in the last few weeks that we have finally brought it this far, after 2 years work on my part.

I expect that you'll find the same basic error -- emission of the second John, who married Lavina Brock -- ne matter where you look. It has been a widely current mistake -- in everything I've seen. But if MME you'll look at that 10-year gap before the birth of the last two children on your sheet 489, you'll see that there was obvious reason to suspect a missing generation.

That second John — the missing one — left a clear trail ence we found it. He left Brimfield (Holland parish) MAEXIAX about 1800, extact date not kis known, and with his sens Eli, Timethy, Ferris went to Oneida County, H Y — where he died at a date not yet determined. I think his death at sens time between 1803 and 1811, probably about 1809 — but others do not yet agree with me, and I may be wrong on this point.

One reason why the jeb was troublesome was an old tradition that a John from Brinfield (said to be the first John, but plainly the second one) had settled in Remssalaer Co. MY. It took a long time to MMMMM that none of the several John Belknaps in that county in early 1800's could possibly have come from Brinfield, and that the Eli at Massau, husband of Clarissa Lyman, could not possibly have been the sen of a Brinfield John. Thank Heaven, that wild goose chase is finished.

But -- alas -- there are plenty of other wild goose chases waiting for me.
