WOMEN'S \$100,000 BUILDING HON-
ORS PROMINENT MOSCOW
CLUB WOMAN

In honor of Mrs. Mary E. Forney of Moscow, the new women's dormitory at the University of Idaho, to be constructed at a cost of \$100,000 by the University of Idaho Building association, has been named the Mary E. Forney hall. This announcement has been made from the office of President A. H. Upham.

The hall has been named in honor of Mrs. Forney in appreciation of her helpful interest in the welfare of the University of Idaho, and also in appreciation and recognition of the club women of the state for their interest

Active War Worker

During the war Mrs. Forney served as secretary of the Women's committee, Council of National Defense, and of the Navy league, and was chairman for the women of the Liberty Loan drives.

Her first work for the university was done shortly after the opening of the university, as president of the Columbian club. Money was raised for the purchase of a silver book to be sent to the Columbian Exposition. Before the club disbanded it was decided to present the book to the university. When the administration building burned in 1906 this book was one of the first things to be saved by President MacLean.

In the early days of the university Mrs. Forney was the leader in "making things go" at the university. She helped interest students in social activities, using her influence to broaden the social features of the college student's life. Mrs. Forney was one of the first advocates of physical training and education for women. In her efforts, Mrs. Forney "sold" the

in the university.
The naming of the hall for Mrs. Forney was suggested by President Upham to the executive committee of the University of Idaho Building association. The proposal met with instant approval and was submitted to the executive committee of the University of Idaho, who also approved the plan.

Work Starts Monday

Work is to start Monday on the construction of the three story dormitory, which will house 118 women students. A dining room will provide accommodations for 140. The building is to be complete in every respect and has been especially designed as the most modern dormitory. The construction has been financed by Moscow people, acting through their building association.

Mrs. Forney is the wife of Judge J. H. Forney, the first acting president of the University of Idaho. Ever since the establishment of the university Mrs. Forney has been one of its most able and influential friends. Her interest and assistance has been reflected in the consistent growth of Idaho's higher educational institution.

Most of Mrs. Forney's public work has been for Moscow, Latah county and the university. She served for nearly six years on the school board. She was actively interested in the establishment of the public library and conducted the correspondence with Andrew Carnegie that secured the sum of \$10,000 for the building. Mrs. Forney served for nine years as a member of the library board.

university to the community and to the entire state.

Centralizes Loan Fund

After the organization of the State Federation of Women's clubs much assistance has been given the university by the club women. When Mrs. Forney was president of the federation there was a continued effort during the two years to divide the then small university loan scholarship fund among all of the state schools. Mrs. Forney ruled that the funds could only be used for the institution for which they were raised. She succeeded in saving the entire fund for university students and some of the most ardent workers for the fund now were most active in opposition to a centralized fund in the early days.

In late years, Mrs. Forney has been the local member of the University Loan Scholarship committee, having managed loans for students aggregating more than \$5,000 and whereby many students have been enabled to continue their collegiate work.

The following pages give the genealogy of the descendants of Jesse Belknap. The foundation of the genealogy was furnished by Lovina Belknap; Christian, grand-daughter of Jesse Belknap, and has been added to as information became available from other members of the family. It is nowhere intended to be a complete genealogy as there are many missing names, and it has not been brought down to the present generation except in the case of my immediate family, of Lovina Belknap Christian. It is my hope that other members of the Belknap family will find this of interest.

After Lorenzo's death Hannah lived first with one and then another of her children. She was with Riley in Coulee City when she died in 1911. She is buried there. My Mother and Father loved her said she was a wonderful person, interesting and sweet. Some of my older cousins remember her and the wonderful stories she told of crossing the Plains. I was born in Coulee City in 1907 and am told she held me as a baby but we left while I was still an infant and I have no memory of her I'm sorry to say. Lorenzo came to Oregon in 1847 and settled in the Belknap Settlement. They gave part of their Donation Claim with Jesse and Hannah for the first school in that area. Lorenzo, Jesse and Jane are all buried in the Alpine Cemetery. Philander, Jesse and Emma all married Watts, and George married Elizabeth Haley a step-sister of the Watts children. Philander was called Phi, Phineas called Phin. I remember Uncle Phin and Aunt Emma (En) very well.

Philander & Mary Watts had 6 children. They lived in Latah, Wash. I knew 2 of them. George & Elizabeth had 10 children. They lived in Eastern Oreg. Near John Day. I knew 7. Jane and Nelson (Methodist Minister) had 7 children They lived in Berkley, Calif. Riley & Nancy had 4 children. They lived in Junction City, Oreg. Riley & Emma had 5 children. They lived in Coulee City, Wash. I knew 1. Phineas & Adelia had 3 children. They lived in Spokane, Wash. I knew 1. Phineas and Anna had no children. They lived in Spokane, Wash. Dear Carroll -

Thank you for the map and other information.

Wrong I'm sorry if I transposed some dates. I thought I had checked them carefully. On the other page I have copied out of the old family bible all the births and marriages as set down in the hand of L. D. Gilbert. As you can see Corrington was born 28-Dec. 1846. All the data I could get from the relatives was that he was born near the Platte River "enroute to Oregon". I checked with the Archives in Salt Lake and they wrote "Saunders Co., Neb". I should have checked to find their source of information but at that time was new at research and accepted their note. As you see - in the bible - it says he died 8-Nov. 1864 but his tombstone was inscribed - DIED - 8th Nov. 1859 aged 12 yrs. 10 mos. 11 days. I guess I'll have to dig a bit more.

Now that date 1-Apr. 1843 was when Phineas was born and tho' I was told originally that he too was born in Fickling, Ohio - my Dad ^{now} says he is sure Phineas was born in Iowa. So - some more research for me.

Talked some more with Dad and he said - "if I remember correctly Grandma (Hannah B.) said that she wasn't sure if Phineas was born in Iowa or Missouri - as they were

right on the line". My sister sent for his death cer-
tificate and it says 1-Apr-^{Birth} 1843 - Iowa (no county).
Death - 13 - June - 1929 - Spokane, Spokane Co., Wash.

Some Granddaddy gave me some misinformation
too. It was he who gave me Lane Co. for the birth-
place of the younger children but they were all
born at the Alpine Donation Claim and that is

It must have been written in 1849 or 50 and surely gives a wonderful word-picture of the country - Indians and life at that time here in Oregon. It is 4 large pages long and I surely do treasure it and enjoy reading it again & again.

Thank you again Carrall for putting me on the right track and helping me to make my records authentic. I have tried to be accurate and thought I had been careful - I learned a long time ago that the records Clark Bucknaps sent me were filled with discrepancies as were the ones from Mr. Taylor in Calif. and now I really feel terrible to think I've done the same to you. I'll try and do better - OK? I am very grateful to you ~~for~~ your painstaking method in acquiring and recording the data on the Bucknaps. I hope I can write an accurate history someday of the Gibberts in America - at least the ones of our direct lineage. It's really an herculean task & I don't know if I'm the one to accomplish it but I can at least begin.

I have received the little booklet by Walbridge and am enjoying its pages immensely. I'll send for the book "They Laughed Too" soon.

I have all sorts of conflicting stuff --

2nd wife -- may have married 1899 -- maybe Lizzie Belknap -- maybe just a "Miss Belknap" -- maybe a Widow Belknap -- parentage unknown -- name of first husband unknown -- and so on.

3rd wife -- either a P atterson of a Cliff or a Van Cliff -- or maybe Bessie (or Elizabeth) Van Cliff Patterson -- maybe a widow? Date of this marriage, no information yet.

All informants agree no children by second and third marriages. That's all they agree on.

By this time you have no doubt received a letter from my Aunt Stella Dolan, giving all the information that we have on the above. Webster Clark Belknap's second wife, Liz or Lizzie, was a widow whose previous husband's name was also Belknap--not related to our Belknaps according to Aunt Stella. This marriage to Webster in 1899 lasted only about a year. However, ^{later} when Webster's children had left home for college or to go to work, the marriage was resumed until the 1920's when cancer made Liz so desperately ill that she went to live with a daughter. She died in 1924, according to Aunt Stella's records which is based on memory. I have never heard my father mention this marriage. The family apparently tried to forget that it ever happened, which is no doubt ^{one of the reasons} that information varies. The people who really knew the family record are gone, which, of course, is the main reason for the difficulty in trying to reconstruct the past.

Aunt Stella has ~~me~~ probably given you more complete information on the third wife--Bessie (Elizabeth) Patterson Belknap. I do not know her maiden name. This seemed a happy marriage as it gave the two of them the companionship that made their later years very pleasant. They had an apartment in Portland, where her children and his could lend a hand whenever necessary. Bessie was a sweet, refined lady of whom Grandfather Webster was understandably proud.

Dear Claudia:

Since sending you my letter dated 5/18 (the day I began writing it), I've found I ought to ask some questions about your record of the birthplaces of Dow's children. But before asking my questions, I should explain why I ask them.

Part of what I've done, up to NMM now, has been to trace the movements of our family -- beginning with the first men we know about, but in more detail from Jonas Newton Belknap on. In his case, from northern Conn to Belchertown Mass when he was about one year old; then from Belchertown to Cherry Valley NY by 1890; then briefly to nearby Worcester NY; then down the Susquehanna River to near Scranton Pa about 1894; then NW to Ontario Co. NY in late 1894 or very early 1895; finally to Kentucky in 1820, where he died in 1824.

Most of

His sons appear to have gone to Kentucky before Jonas did: Jesse to Hardin Co. about 1816; others to adjacent & Hart Co., where Jonas N. was ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ living with his daughter Cynthia and her husband ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ Isaac Newton in 1820 to 1824 (or, perhaps more accurately, they were living with him).

Census time in

In 1824, after Jonas N died, Jesse moved to Licking County, Ohio -- and by 1830 all of his brothers and sisters were in that county, except Susannah and Elisha. Elisha got there later in that year.

or mid

In the early 1830's (exact year not certain), Jesse sold his land in Licking County -- mostly to his father in law James Garlinghouse and to his son in law Gamaliel Garlinghouse -- and moved NW to Allen CO Ohio, where he and his unmarried children stayed till 1839. In that year, after son George married Keturah Penton, Jesse took his family to Van Buren Co in SW Iowa, where they stayed till 1847 and 1848. His brother Jonas (jr) was also in Allen Co, I think. (When Jonas left Licking Co., I'm not sure.)

What I do not know with any certainty is when and how (and to where) two of our people left Licking County: Hannah and her husband Dow Gilbert; Orrin (son of Jonas Jr) and his wife Nancy Starr.

We know that in May 1847, Dew and Orrin were in Van Buren Co and started from there for Oregon, arriving there in Nov 1847. But when did they reach Van Buren Co?

A descendant of Orrin says that Orrin's daughter Margaret was born in Benton Co, Iowa, 20 June 1841. . . near Cedar Rapids, about 175 miles North of Van Buren Co -- which would indicate that between 1841 and 1847 Orrin moved south to join Jesse etc in Van Buren Co. This I can believe, especially if Jonas his father was in Van BUREN Co, as I think likely. (jr)

But what seems strange to me is the birthplace you give for Dow's son Corrington -- Saunders Co Neb, 1 Apr 1843 -- for this would mean that between that date and May 1847, Dow and Hannah backtracked about 450 miles to join Jesse etc in Van Buren Co in the extreme SW corner of Iowa -- a most unusual movement. So I have to ask if you are sure of that birthplace? I'm not arguing, for I have no other record of Corrington's birthplace. I'm just asking if you are sure. I don't question the year, for Aunt Kit said that Dow and Hannah had 6 children when they left Van Buren Co in 1847. Or am I wrong in relying on Kit for the fact that Dow and Hannah started from Van Buren Co in 1847 -- did they actually join the wagon train later, in Nebraska?

I hope you can set me straight on this bit of puzzle?

And while I'm about it, more questions about birthplaces:

(A) Are you sure that the first five children of Dow and Hannah were born in Licking Co, Ohio? This would mean that they stayed behind when Jesse etc moved to Allen Co., and that they did not leave Licking County till after April 1843 -- ~~AND~~ some years after Jesse etc reached ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ Sounds quite possible; but are you sure?

Iowa.

(B) You show the last three children of Dow and Hannah being born in Lane Co., Oregon. But their land near Alpine was in Benton Co, wasn't it? And my records say they lived there till 1877, when they went to the vicinity of Spokane (Latah, ~~in~~ I think). Are my records wrong? Or was there some reason why three children weren't born on the homestead at Alpine?

Forgive this detail. I've learned that, in genealogy, the record of places is just as important as the record of dates -- sometimes more important, when you're trying to leave a trail that future genealogists can follow.

A minor point in your letter, which I forgot to mention..... In the little map that Clyde Starr drew for you, he showed the name of his great grandfather as "Chatham" Hawley. This is one of Clyde's personal notions -- against the name Chatman as it appears in all Oregon records that I know of. But in the land deed record in Licking County Ohio it is shown as "Chapman Hawley" or maybe "Howley" -- hard to tell whether it was ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ "a" pr "o". Me, I'll stick with Chatman, as the congressman did.

I was born in Coulee City in 1907 and am told she held me as a baby but we left while I was still an infant and I have no memory of her I'm sorry to say. Lorenzo came to Oregon in 1847 and settled in the Belknap Settlement. They gave part of their Donation Claim with Jesse and Hannah for the first school in that area. Lorenzo, Jesse and Jane are all buried in the Alpine Cemetery. Philander, Jesse and Emma all married Watts, and George married Elizabeth Haley a step-sister of the Watts children. Philander was called Phi. Phineas called Phin. I remember Uncle Phin and Aunt Emma (Em) very well.

Philander & Mary Watts had 6 children. They lived in Latah, Wash. I knew 2 of them. George & Elizabeth had 10 children. They lived in Ft. Lane Oreg. Near John Day. I knew 7. Jane and Nelson (Methodist Minister) had 7 children They lived in Berkeley, Calif. Riley & Nancy had 4 children. They lived in Junction City, Oreg. Riley & Emma had 5 children. They lived in Coulee City, Wash. I knew 1. Phineas & Adelia had 3 children. They lived in Spokane, Wash. I knew 1. Phineas and Anna had no children. They lived in Spokane, Wash. Mary & Isaac had 8 children. They lived in Junction City, Oreg. *Jesse & Irena had 6 children. They lived in Spokane, Wash. I knew 5. *Jesse & Ella had no children. Ella's maiden name was O'Donnell. Dear Claudia:

How fine to hear from you again. Illness -- not yours, I hope. Son in Viet Nam -- I hope that's over, now.

Questions in your letter: Putting together a reasonable record for Keziah and Chatman Hawley was difficult. I don't recall where I got the dates that you question -- and you may be right. Will check, later. Just now, am buried in trying to complete a job that began in 1968 -- correcting, provably, major errors in current records of the branch started by one of Ebenezer's sons, Joseph (m Prudence Morris) -- the shoemaker whose grandson became the first Belknap college professor and whose later descendants through that grandson became the only known Belknap multimillionaires.

Gross errors in the two generations just following Joseph had fouled up the whole picture so badly that scores and scores of Belknaps acquired incorrect lineages. To get it straight -- with unchallengeable documentary proof -- seemed impossible at times. But we (a man in Hollywood and I) finally solved the blasted thing. Now I'm putting the outcome on paper and transferring seeds of people from one branch of the family to a totally different branch.

As to Squire Rycraft -- not a title. Possibly named for an ancestor whose family name was Squire (a fairly common surname). In saying that Sarah Hawley married Squire, while his brother George married Miranda McCain (daughter of their partner in the building of Simpson Chapel), I'm relying on Mrs Mintonye because she says she got her information directly from one of Sarah's sons: Marc Pomergy ("Brick") Rycraft.

Haven't touched our own branch for some time. Much to do on it. Scores or hundreds of Jesse's descendants on whom I have full data -- not yet entered in my files. The fun is getting the information; putting it into shape for filing is just a boring chore. So I let the chores wait while I wander off on some new chase. . . . Lately, building up a record of descendants of Jesse's youngest brother Orin, about whom little had been collected till now. They are scattered widely, with most of them located in a triangle bounded by Ilwaco, Wash., Norman, Okla., and San Juan de Compostela, Spain.

Because you like pictures, I'm enclosing the Christmas card that Peg prepared in time to call it a New Year's greeting and mail it in February. Should have sent you one, but don't think I did. Picture of me and my children and grandchildren.

Dear Cousin Carol,

I enjoyed your letter of December 3rd. Sorry I am tardy in answering but it has been a busy time of the year. We shared Christmas at our home with my sister Dorothy, her husband Omer, my son James and his wife Andis. Sunday after Christmas Jim, Andis, Betty, Bob and I drove to Los Angeles and visited all members of the family living in California. We did Disneyland and returned along the coast. Everyone seemed to have a fine time.

Answer to question number one. Yes my grandfather was both a clergyman and a lawyer. He received his degree in theology from Willamette University and his degree in law from Northwestern. My father was born in Evanston in 1892 while his father was in school there. Dad was from February 14th to September 29th older than you. He always felt badly about not being a native son of Oregon.

Now for as complete information as I can give you about my family. My father was a farmer/logger most of his life. He passed away in October of 1941 in the logging woods on the McKenzie River. He and I were falling timber and dad suffered a fatal heart attack just before quitting time one evening. I continued to work for that logging company, in the office until I was 18 then I enlisted in the Army Air Corps. I was born at our family home between Alpine and Glenbrook on April 26, 1924. I graduated from high school at McKenzie High in 1941. I spent 32 months in the service. I was shot in the chest by a bullet fired from a F.W. 190 on April 4, 1943. The records show that I was struck in the chest by a 20 MM bullet. The bullet remained imbedded-unexploded in the superior aspect of the right shoulder. The bullet was removed in the Princess Mary R.A.F. Hospital in Holton, England. I later spent time in 2nd General Hospital, Oxford, Halloran General in New York and Bushnell General in Brigham City, Utah. I was finally discharged from the service in Denver on January 29, 1945. After leaving the Armed Forces, I sold real estate for a time then decided upon college. I married Betty December 21, 1946—we just celebrated our 25th anniversary. I received my B.S. in Elementary Education from Oregon College of Education in 1950. I taught in Valsetz, Oregon through 1950-52 then came to Eugene. Our son James Edward was born in Dallas, Oregon while I was teaching in Valsetz. I came to Eugene in 1952 to teach and finished my M.E. in School Administration from the Uof O in 1954. I have been an elementary principal in the Eugene Schools since 1955 and have no desires to change jobs or school systems. My name has appeared in Who's Who in American Education. Our son Robert Stuart was born in Eugene on August 16, 1964. James is now a Junior at Oregon State University and is attending college on a military scholarship. He was student body president of his high school and is

an Eagle Scout. Bob is a 2nd grader and ~~me~~ a challenge for his old parents.

My sister Mary was born at Alpine in August 6, 1922. She too graduated from McKenzie High in 1941. She now lives in Los Angeles and has one daughter, Janice Dawn. Mary is currently married to William Bouman who is a flight inspector for the F.A.A. She was married for 22 years to Janice's father, who is now a retired army officer. Mary works part time for the Federal Government as a secretary to a department of railroad inspection. Janice is currently divorced from her 2nd husband and works as a legal secretary for a lawyer in Anaheim—born in 1944 not 1943.

My brother Robert was born in Benton, County I believe. He graduated from Monroe High School in about 1935, received his teaching certificate from O.C.E. in 1938 and started teaching in Wasco, Oregon. He married his wife Beryl in Wasco in June of 1939. Bob was later a principal in Lakeview, Oregon; St. Helens, Oregon; Oswego, Oregon; Salinas, California. He completed his B.S. in Elementary Education and his M.E. in School Administration from the U of O in the 1940's. He completed a Doctorate from Stanford in about 1958 and became Superintendent of Schools in Santa Paula, California. In 1960 he joined the staff of Valley State College in San Fernando, California where he is currently president of the faculty. He spent 2 years in Jamaica recently as an educational consultant. His wife Beryl and Bob reside in Northridge. Bob's son Michael Robert was born in Lakeview in 1943. He graduated with honors from U.C.L.A. and after spending two years with the Army in Washington, D.C. has completed all of his work for a Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin. He is currently a History Professor at the University of Texas. His wife Patricia will complete her Master's from the University of Wisconsin in January and happily join Mick in Texas. Bob's daughter Nancy Ann was born in St. Helens on the 29th of November, 1944. Nancy was a fine student and received her degree in education from Valley State College. She did much work in languages, went to school one summer in Chile and is currently teaching English as a second language to elementary youngsters in Yuba City, California. She is married to Jack Dooly who is with the California Rehabilitation Program. Jack has a Masters Degree in Social Work and has done graduate work at the University of Tenn. They have been married about 4 years, have no children but have recently built a new home.

My sister Donotha graduated from Monroe High School in about 1933. She received her teaching certificate from O.C.E. in about 1935 and started her teaching career at Zena, Oregon near Salem. She later taught in Nyssa, Oregon where she married Omer Adkinson, a druggist and native of Beloit Rock, Oregon. They moved to Astoria in 1943 and Donotha taught some there. They later bought a Pharmacy in Woodburn. Omer retired two years ago and has sold the business while retaining the building. Donotha still teaches in Marion County but swears each year will be her last. She received her degree from O.C.E. and has done graduate work at O.S.U. She has penciled in some corrections and additions to the page you sent me which I am returning with her corrections.

My Aunt Violet, who is the widow of my fathers brother Gilbert, has done a tremendous amount of research on the Belknap family. Her address is Mrs. G. M. Belknap, Rt. 1, Box 157, Jefferson, Oregon 97352. Her health is not the greatest at all times but I am certain she might be able to provide some information for you about the family of Gilbert Marion Belknap who was the only other child of Edward H. to live to maturity. There was a baby brother Ransom who was scalded to death as an infant in one of the great iron kettles that was used to heat water in a fireplace.

I hope this information is helpful to you in your pursuit. One other correction in the past information that I gave you was on the date of my mothers death. I have trouble keeping it straight in my own mind. If I told you it was 1959 it should have been 1960. Happy New Year to you, I hope your Christmas was an enjoyable one. Please excuse all of the typing errors—I don't like Betty's typewriter.

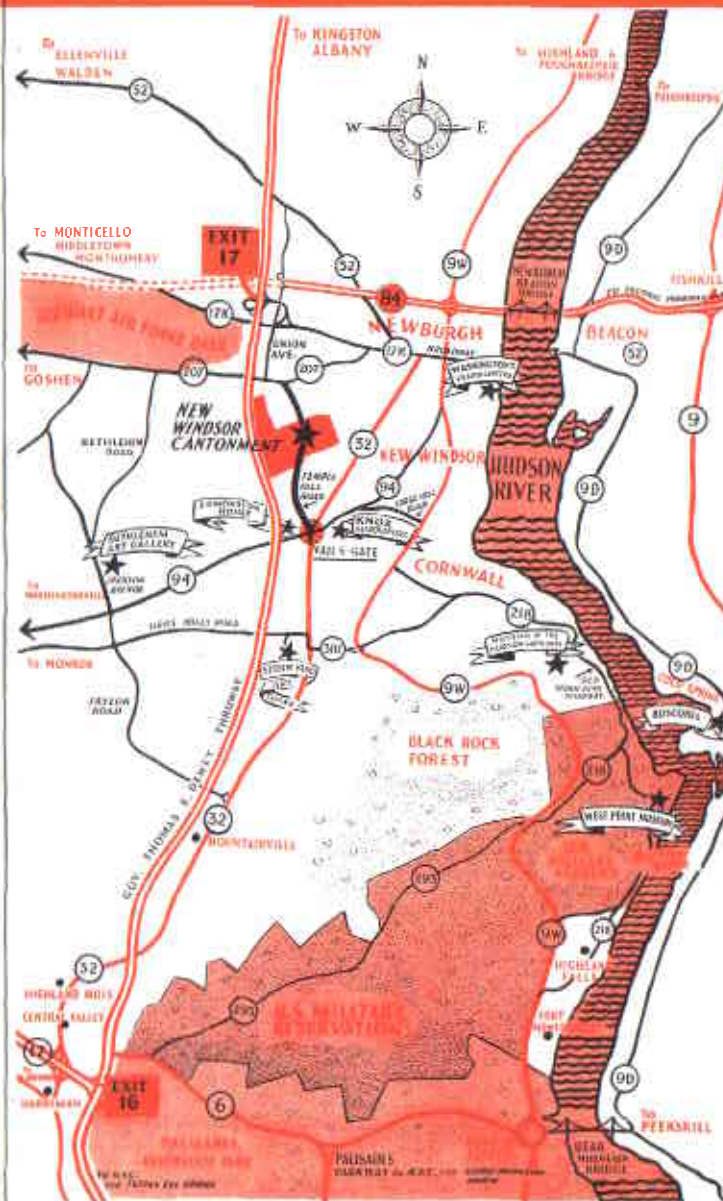

IRENE BELKNAP from Carroll Belknap

I'm most deeply grateful for your amazingly complete record of addresses of descendants of Clifford. For the life of me, I can't even begin to imagine how it was possible for anyone to do such a thorough job. It must have involved an incredible amount of hard work.

I wish I had any small fragment of this sort of information on some of the scores and scores of Belknaps whose parentage is unknown -- where all that's known is just a name or a marriage, with no clue to where to search -- dead ends over a period of three centuries. Only blind chance seems to turn up, once in a while, a lead to follow.

My thanks, too, for the material about Newburgh and New Windsor -- and the name and address of Mr D C Gorden. I'm writing to him to ask if he knows any present-day Belknap in that area who is likely to have records on the Newburgh families, to remedy some gaps in my files.

And thank you for the outline prepared by Reva Barrett in 1947. I've had what purported to be typed copies of it -- but this original is better, for it's free of some errors that the copyists made. I've run off a copy for my files and am mailing it back to you.

Bit by bit, but steadily, I'm putting together what I believe is an accurate record of descendants of Jesse and Jane. Is there any of it that you'd like me to send to you?

I'm enclosing a copy of a sheet recently received from Claudia Marshall, supplementing and expanding what I already had in my files, on Dow and Hannah. I'm sure that Claudia, who is a careful and experienced worker on genealogy, is right on names and dates. I'm not so sure she is altogether right on the birthplaces of the children. So I've written to her about this question. If I find that changes should be made, I'll tell you. Meanwhile, the page may be helpful to you.

Bellnap- Jesse Bellnap the subject of the memoir was born in Cherry Valley New York, 1792, Jan. 26 and died at his home in Denton Co. Oregon, Nov. 19, 1881, closing a life of great usefulness where over he has been known.

197 He was brought up in Western New York and was married to Miss Jane Garlinghouse in Ontario Co. Feb. 26, 1812 who entered into the rest of the saved five years before him. He was converted to God and joined the M. E. Church, Feb. 7, 1816 in which communion he lived nearly 66 years. He never joined but one Church and never joined it but once. The writer has been personally acquainted with him for almost 50 years and can truly say, he was a good man and full of faith and the Holy Ghost. Through all the years of his activity

He served the Church as class leader, steward and trustee. His benevolence in support of the Church and the ministry reached the full measure of his ability. In doctrine and Church polity he was a Methodist, in experience and holy living he was a Christian. For many years he was a sufferer but was uncomplaining, in fact he was almost always rejoicing, having a desire to depart and be with Christ. The mortal was well nigh broken by the weight of years so that his last sickness was short, but he was ready, and said, "Thank God it will soon be over, it is alright."

He stood at the head of a numerous family. He was the father of seven children, six of whom are still living, one of them is the Rev. C. G. Bellmap of the California conference and all the rest are members of the M.E. Church. His numerous years brought him to the fourth generation after his, the family now numbering 180 souls. On the 20 of Nov. 1881, the writer preached the funeral sermon of his first class leader from the text of his own selection "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord", the P.M. Starr.

Obituary

The subject of this brief obituary - wife of Jesse Bellmap died Sunday, Dec. 10, 1876 in the triumphs of the Christian faith. She was born in Pennsylvania in 1792, emigrated to Eastern New York with her parents in 1796. She was converted to God and joined the M.E. Church in her 16 year of which she has been a faithful and exemplary member till God took her. She came to Oregon in 1848 with her husband and settled in Benton Co. in the neighborhood bearing her name. Herself and her husband were pioneers of Methodism in this Western wild. The first annual conference held in Oregon

provided over by one of our Bishops, was the held by Bishop Simpson and her home was his home. From that time on the house of Jesse Bellnap was the preacher's home and many are the weary itinerants that have found encouragement and refreshment of both body and soul under her roof. She leaves a large family of children, grand children and great grand children to follow her, we hope, to the better world. Her husband now in his 85th year is still living on the borders of the Heavenly Canaan. A large congregation attended her funeral services at the Simpson Chapel. "Blessed are the dead that die in the Lord". M. G. Jenkins.

Dear Claudia:

I'm ever so grateful for your full and careful record on Dow Gilbert and Hannah. It corrects many errors in other records which I did not trust.

Do you want similar records on other children of Jesse Belknap? If so, I'll be glad to send them -- like the one for Ransom, which you already have.

Questions in your letter of May 7:

(1) You are right in thinking that in the case of Belknap daughters I must restrict myself to their marriages and their children -- can't attempt to take the record beyond that point in what I eventually publish. ~~XXX~~ Yet I think it is good that my files often trace descendants of daughters down through later generations -- for my files will someday be useful to others in the future.

(2) Garlinghouses: Bill Garlinghouse, mentioned by Clyde Starr. Unknown to me. Could not have been a brother of Jane. Probably a nephew at most -- possibly a cousin of sorts, from one of the three Garlinghouse families in Ontario County in early 1800's. . . Mary A Garlinghouse, in grave at Alpine. Possibly wife of that Bill. Unknown to me. . . My records of Garlinghouses at or near Alpine include only Jane -- and her sister Mary Ann, wife of Jesse's brother Jonas -- and her sister Rachel, wife of Abiathar Newton.

(3) Clyde Starr's map of homesteads at Alpine. Clyde isn't too dependable as a source of information; but this map is good. A more inclusive map was drawn in 1963 by the school children at Alpine, in the course of gathering material on the story of the little town. It was published in a book that I think you will want to ask your bookseller to order for you: Edna Mintonye, They Laughed, Too. Published by The Naylor Company, San Antonio, Texas. Miss Mintonye, the teacher at Alpine, compiled the ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ book from the material she and the children dug up -- mostly about the early days and the first settlers -- Belknaps, Starrs, Gilberts, etc. A good book in its capturing of the flavor of the time and its people. Unhappily full of errors on genealogy, as such information was collected by hearsay and much of it was supplied by Clark. Worst error is that Hannah died back in Ontario County, aged 100. Despite such errors, a valuable ~~XXXXXX~~ book to own. Peg urges me to get copies for my children and grandchildren. I may do this, if I resign myself to annotating the many genealogical errors, for what the book says about our ancestors ~~is~~ is worth knowing. The data on the arrival of our people, in Oregon, is detailed and -- I believe -- very accurate.

(4) Location of homestead of Cumi and Washington Waltz. Not known to me. The maps I have do not show, either, the claim of Cumi and her first husband Samuel Fletcher Starr -- but I believe it was in the Glenbrook area, SW of Alpine. . . On second thought, I'm enclosing a copy of one of the many copies of that map that have been sent to me, together with ~~an~~ a copy of a "key" naming the people related to us (which I prepared long ago for someone who wanted to know "who all these people are"). The map's original ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ can be dated between 1851 (death of Jonas Belknap) and 1857 (death of Chatsan Hawley).

(5) Waite. The Waite who wrote the genealogical chapters in the Walbridge book was D. B. Waite, a surveyor and school teacher -- living in the middle of the 19th Century. It's interesting to know that he was probably related to the Gilberts. History authorities in that part of New York regard him as being a very accurate workman. I believe the only Ira Gilbert named by Waite was -- he says -- a son of Jones Gilbert.

(6) Top of your page 2 -- ancestry of Clyde Starr: It was like this -- (as I'm told):

Sewell Hawley and Emma Noble
Weltha ~~BALKNAP~~ and Wilbur Starr

His mother Weltha Hawley was sister of Willis Chatman Hawley - Congressman for many years till death in 1937.

Sorry to be so late in answering your nice letter but I have been ill. Feeling some better now and thought I'd best get this in the mail so you could look it over and see if it is all you want on the Gilbert family (Jesse Belknap, that is).

Several years ago I met and corresponded with a Clyde Starr who gave me some information that may be of some importance to you. He said that "there was a Bill Garlinghouse born about 1835 - 40 and he thought he was Jane's brother. He married Wm. Coyle's widow. After a while he and she were divorced, he remarried a 22 year old woman and they had 6 or 7 children. Alpine is the location of the Jesse & Jane Belknap homestead. The old part of the cemetery there was donated by Jesse and Jane and the new part was donated by Washington and Gumi Waltz." He then drew a platt showing the locations of the Jesse Belknap, Dow Gilbert, Ransom Belknap, Jacob Hammer, Sewel Hawley, Chatham Hawley, Jesse Hawley, Caton, David Hawley and H.B. Nichols places which I will copy and enclose. Mr. Starr was elderly at that time, in his 80's I believe, and I do not know if he is still living or not.

I was looking at my ^{Great} Grandparents wedding ^{certificate} and was interested to note that it was witnessed by Chatman Hawley and Camaliel Garlinghouse and the minister was the Rev. J. W. Starr. Wedded in Licking County, Ohio near Granville on the 31st of January 1833. This was Lorenzo Dow Gilbert & Hannah Belknap.

I wish you could have known my grandfather Jesse Belknap Gilbert. He was such a wonderful personality. Tall, good looking, kind, generous and gentle and always immaculate and so mannerly, I feel we have a wonderful heritage to live up to.

I am enclosing a clipping my cousin found in the old family bible which Hannah Belknap Gilbert used. With your many sources of information can you tell me where to look to find some clue as to which member of the Gilbert family this could be. I can't seem to find what paper this came from nor can I find a Horse Valley. Since it was in my G. Grandmother's bible I feel sure it must tell of someone I should find.

I am as you must have guessed attempting to trace my ancestors - and I must admit that some of them have done a masterful job of covering their tracks.



Some time ago I sent you a sheet on Lawrence Dew Gilbert and Hannah Belknap and their children. I warned that I might later tell you to revise the birthplaces shown for the children.

Here's status to date:

- All dates shown are from family Bible and from gravestones. OK.
 - Birthplaces of first five children (Philander through Phineas) must be checked further to determine which of them were born in Licking County, O. There is reason to believe that v. Phineas was born in Van Buren Co., Iowa. Will send you accurate information on these five when I get it.
 - Corrington (vi) -- probably also born in Van Buren Co, Iowa. Birthplace shown as "Saunders Co, Nebraska," is impossible -- and came from an unverified sheet from the Salt Lake Archives.
 - Birthplace of the last three children was not Lane Co., but Belknap Settlement (Alpine) in Benton Co., Oregon. This is certain.
- Will write again when I have fuller data on birthplaces of the first six children.

I believe I have finally, after some errors, arrived at a correct statement of the second and third marriages of Webster Clark Belknap, son of Ransom Belknap. The final step has come during the tracing of descendants of a much younger brother of Jonas Newton Belknap -- Stephen, born in 1769, 10 years after Jonas.

Stephen went to Ontario, Canada, some time before 1814. He died, by drowning, in Dec 1814, leaving an infant daughter. A son, Stephen Jr, was born posthumously. His descendants returned to the US -- in Michigan, mainly. For years, they tried to trace their ancestry, with no success till 1880. In that year, a grandson of Stephen Sr -- Edward Myron Belknap, who had come to Corvallis -- visited the Belknaps at Belknap Settlement. His letter to his parents begins like this:

"Dear Father: We have at last found out something in regard to our forefathers," and goes on to tell what he learned from Jesse, who was then 88. "The old man was pleased to find out what became of his Uncle Stephen, as they could never learn anything of him."

-- 9 Dec 1881 --

This Edward Myron Belknap married Elizabeth ("Lizzie") Hooper, daughter of John and Sarah Hooper. He died (at Corvallis, I believe) in March 1894. In 1901, according to what seem to be reliable records, his widow Lizzie married Webster Belknap "of Spokane, Washington." In 1911, according to those records, she was living in Corvallis. (This agrees with what Irene told me in 1971 -- that Webster and Lizzie had been separated at that time). Stella Dolan told me that Lizzie died about 1924.

That covers Webster's second marriage. The third wife -- Annie Elizabeth Cliff, ("Bonnie Bessie") has proved to be widow of a Patterson -- not Anderson.

So I suggest that you alter any record of Ransom Belknap that I've sent to you, by making the lines for his son Webster read as follows:

- m (2) Elizabeth ("Lizzie") Hooper, widow of Edward Myron Belknap, 1901
- (3) Annie Elizabeth ("Bessie") Cliff, widow Patterson, 1933.

As you know, there were no children of these two later marriages.

Dear Mr. Belknap,

By now I know I must owe you at least three letters. Thank you so very much for all the interesting information you have sent. The reason for my delay in writing is that I have been expecting the DLC information on Jonas and Polly Belknap's claim and today finally it came. It is ten pages long and I plan to study it a little more thoroughly later. The first page consists of: Joseph Kelroy and Sewel R. Hawley both "First being duly sworn, says he is in no way interested in the land claimed by JONAS BELKNAP..... and he is personally acquainted with said Jonas Belknap and knows that he has personally resided and cultivated said land continuously, from 20th day of December 1849 to the 31st day of January 1853 the time of his death." There is at least two other entries as his death date being 31 Jan 1853.

p. 4 JESSE BELKNAP of Benton County in the Territory of Oregon, being first duly sworn, says he is personally acquainted with JONAS Belknap the person who claims a donation right to the tract or tracts of land described in notification 2687 and POLLY BELKNAP his wife; that he has known them to live together as man and wife from 13 day of January 1813 to 31st day January 1853 and they are and were reputed by their neighbors as such during said period. signed JESSE BELKNAP. Subscribed and sworn to before me in Marysville. A.G. Hovey Clerk

I asked for the "letter enclosed" that is mentioned in the DLC book record and they did not send such. I wonder if "letter enclosed" might refer to "Jonas died in 1853. See affidavit of Jesse belknap attached"

(page 4)

This is written in the middle of page 7 where Homan C. and Randolph Buckingham are swearing that Polly had lived continuously from 20th day of August 1851 to the 21 st day of August 1855, on this claim. I think some of this confusion could be due to Jonas dying before he had lived on his claim 4 years. They apparently were able to win the decision because on page 8 : Their claim consisted of 521 acres and .16 acres. The north half for widow and south half for heirs of J. Belknap, Dec.

It was not till 11th day of October 1877 that the hassel about this claim was settled and a Patent was issued. Ten years after Polly's death and nearly 25 years after Jonas's death.

Have you ever come across anything that would indicate that Polly married again? We have never found where she is buried either.

W. C. BELKNAP

Impressions and Observations of The Journal Man

By Fred Lackley, 1-23-36

"When I was a boy I went to school at the District school house, a log building on the Gilbert place in the Belknap settlement near Monroe in Benton county," said W. C. Belknap of 3035 S. E. Ankeny street. It was built in 1880. Leonard V. Starr was the first teacher. The first annual conference of the Methodist Episcopal church in Oregon was held at this schoolhouse. Bishop Simpson, who presided, preached an eloquent sermon. The Rev. John Kennedy organized a congregation of Methodists in 1848 in the Belknap settlement.

"I was born on my father's plantation, about two miles west of Monroe on November 29, 1840, my father, Hanson A. Belknap, was born in Kentucky on December 10, 1820. He went to Licking county, Ohio with his parents in 1827. Eight years later they went to Iowa. In the spring of 1847 my father, mother and my two sisters, Lucinda and Sarah, started across the plains for Oregon with some of the families of Samuel Starr and H. D. G. Starr. Father stopped at Marysville, at Oberlin, and at the falls. Two miles west of Oberlin he and Mother bought 80 acres of land and a black cow bought 100 acres.

Father and Mother were married in Van Buren county, Iowa, November 29, 1840. Mother's maiden name was Menah. She was born in Highland county, Ohio, in 1820. She was a daughter of Jeremiah Starr.

Father founded the Belknap settlement in the fall of 1847. In 1848, who had crossed the plains with my father, my grandfather, Starr, and Orrin Belknap, took claims near Father's place. Dow Gilbert married a daughter of Samuel Starr. Another son of Samuel Starr married with my father's sister, Lucinda, in 1848.

My father and Mother had four children, George, John, Sarah and Lucinda. George was born in 1842, John in 1844, Sarah in 1846 and Lucinda in 1848. George was the first to leave home. He went to the University of Oregon in 1860. He was a member of the Oregon bar and was a judge of the Oregon supreme court. He died in 1900. John was a physician and a member of the Oregon bar. He died in 1900. Sarah was a teacher and a member of the Oregon bar. She died in 1900. Lucinda was a teacher and a member of the Oregon bar. She died in 1900.

He was accompanied by his daughter Keziah Belknap Hawley and her husband, Chapman Hawley, whose grandson, Willis C. Hawley, was president of Willamette university for some years and later was a congressman from Oregon for about 25 years. My father's brothers, George, Corrington and Harley, came with their father across the plains. Corrington was a Methodist minister. Harley was the father of Dr. Preston Belknap, who died recently at Prineville, and whose son, Leuben V. Hobart D. and Wilfred H., are practicing physicians in Portland. Another son of my uncle Harley was Virgil C. Belknap, born near Monroe in 1871 and for many years a practicing physician at Prairie City. Uncle Harley married Laura Jordan, of Benton county, in 1855. He and his family went to Prineville in 1874. He built the Crook county courthouse and the school building at Prineville. Virgil studied medicine under his brother, H. P.

Orrin H. Starr, George W. Starr, H. B. Nichols, W. C. Woodcock, John B. and John Goodman, William C. Kelly and a number of others settled in the Monroe district in the fall from 1850 to 1852. "If you will cross the bridge and go up the road a piece you will come to the home of O. V. Starr," said an acquaintance to me recently at Waldport. I crossed the bridge, went up the road a piece and recognized Mr. Starr's place from the description, for I had been told that the home was pretty well back from the road and was surrounded by flowers and shrubs.

"No, my husband isn't here. My name is Mrs. O. V. Starr," said the woman who answered my knock at the door. "If you want to know in I think he'll be back soon."

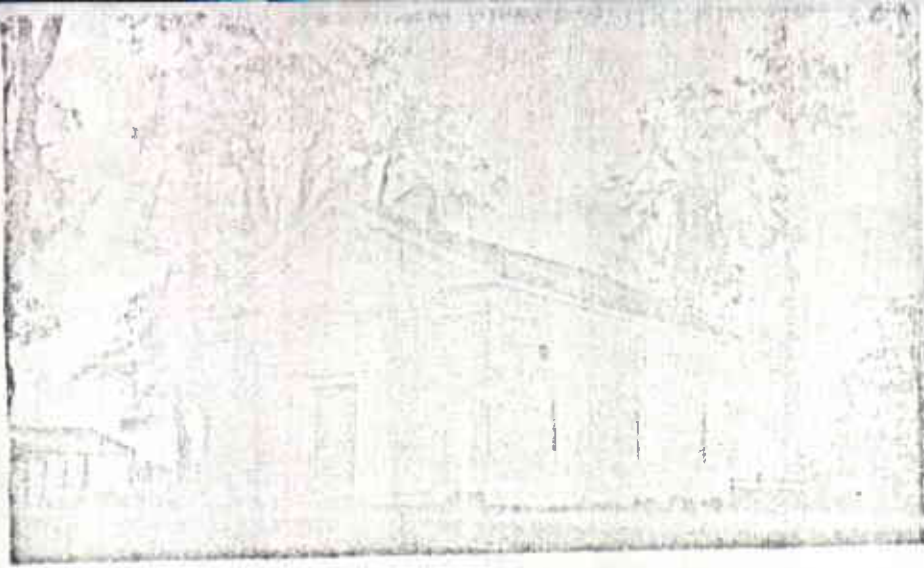

Bishop Simpson's Chapel

In 1858, the old Simpson's Chapel was completed. It stood on a hill about halfway between the present towns of Bellfountain and Alpine. The church was built of hand-planed lumber and was a plain oblong with three windows on each side and a porch in front. It was surrounded by oak trees, many of which are still standing and which served as hitching posts for horses.

The history of the Alpine community may be said to have had its beginning at the time of the erection of two buildings, the Ebenezer school house and Simpson's Chapel, though it is true that quite a number of settlers had come to the valley before that time. The school house was built of logs and was situated on a promontory about two miles south of the present town of Alpine and on part of the old Gilbert place. It was probably built about 1849 and served both as a school and a "meeting house."

It was and always has been a Methodist Church and was called Simpson's Chapel because Bishop Simpson was the presiding officer of the first annual conference, held while the group was still meeting in the old Ebenezer school. In 1903, it was decided that a new church was needed, so one was built at the present site of Alpine and was completed in 1904. At this time the congregation divided, part of its members going to Bellfountain and part to Alpine.

The whole community was once known as the Belknap settlement because of the preponderance of Belknaps among the first

settlers who, in pioneer days, had come by wagon train to the valley from Ohio, Missouri, and Iowa. Other early families were the Stairs, Hays, Haywards, Gilberts, Catons, Wyodlocks, Goodmans, and Nichols.

Another interesting part of the early history of the Chapel centered around the campground which, in 1871, was bought from George Humphrey and is known as the Bellfountain Park. People came from miles around, primarily for the spring of clear cold water, held meetings, and visited. The gatherings were religious but also social. People would bring food, put up tents, and stay for a week or more. Sometimes someone would bring part of a beef and hang it on a tree and those present were free to help themselves. The pioneer days are gone but Simpsons Chapel is still used as a house of worship by those who have taken the place of the pioneers.

I'm most grateful for your letter of March 20, for it gives us -- finally -- a definite date for death of Jonas. So it kills an old and widespread tradition that he "died on the plains, en way to Oregon."

Though I'm making a little progress on tracing descendants of Jonas and Polly, I haven't learned anything more about Polly. I doubt that she married again, for she was about 63 when Jonas died and all her children were married. All I know about her subsequent life is that the map of farms in her neighborhood -- drawn, I think, a year or so before 1857 -- shows her name on her farm. If she stayed there, the most likely place of burial would be Bellfountain.

I suppose I should add that I have no proof that the date of her death was 1867. That's merely the date shown on records compiled by various people.

The second paragraph in your letter suggests that the date I have shown for marriage of Jonas and Polly (15 Jan 1811) may be wrong. Affidavit signed by his brother Jesse seems to ~~indicate~~ mean that the date was 13 Jan 1813. I'll try to trace this. I'm guessing that the 1813 date is right.

Getting things right is a long hard task. I'm grateful for help.

TO BE TOMORROW**

**Oregon Native Well Known
for Pioneering Efforts**

Funeral services will be held tomorrow at 11 A. M. in the Holman & Lutz Colonial mortuary for Webster Clark Belknap, native Oregonian of the covered wagon era, who died Thursday at his home in Portland.



Mr. Belknap was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Ransom Belknap, who crossed the plains in the great migration of 3000 persons which doubled the population of the Oregon country.

He was born in 1850 at Monroe. In later years, he frequently told friends that he was five days old when the first issue of The Oregonian appeared.

The house Ransom Belknap built at Monroe in 1855 of hand-hewn timbers and whipsawed lumber still stands.

Wheat Grown in 1877

In 1877, W. C. Belknap was among the first settlers to try wheat growing in the Spokane country. From 1892 to 1896 he was a state senator from Spokane county. He helped to lay the capitol foundations at Olympia, which stood for 40 years before the building was completed. He attended Willamette university but did not graduate.

As a young man he married Ida Clark. She died in 1893. Eight years ago, he married Mrs. Betty Patterson, a life-long friend.

Friends and relatives recalled Mr. Belknap in his youth and middle life as a man of tremendous energy, but one who, though as a pioneer farmer he managed refractory horses and numerous children, he never was heard to use profanity.
