Thank you for your letter of July 13th. I appreciate the complimentary remarks you made but must hastily correct an impression that I have apparently given you. I know little about Newton genealogy. What little I know is of a fragmentary nature and includes a certain amount of supposition.

I think you must have forgotten some of the things we discussed in the past. The reason I think that the Asa Newton who died at Livonia was the Asa, brother of Mary (Newton) Belknap was based on Belchertown records and the Livonia Asa's will. In 1970 I found in the "Crocker Collection" that an Asa of Belchertown had a daughter, Matilda b in 1771 & a son Joseph b in 1774. Asa of Livonia in his will names children Joseph as his eldest son and Matilda as his eldest daughter.

The Newton Genealogy, by Erminia Newton Leonard, pub 1915 has this on the children of Stephen & Mary (Witt) Newton of Windsor, Conn & Belchertown, Mass. Stephen Newton, b August 15, 1716; died prob at Belchertown; m Jany 20, 1736/7 at Leicester, Mass Mary Witt, b Sept 17, 1715 Marlborough, Mass; death not given. However Doolittles sketches has "Mary (Witt) Newton died Belchertown 1783, age 68". Their Children:

2. James (or Jonas) b March 18, 1740; d Nov 3, 1753

These 5 births were recorded at Windsor so it could be possible that Stephen Newton had other children born elsewhere. It would not seem likely that if he did have a daughter born later that it would be aphoebe who married Job Belknap, an older brother of Samuel Belknap. I have made a note on this marriage of Job and Phoebe however and the next time I go to San Francisco I will check in some records there to see if anything is available on this Phoebe Newton.

On May 22, 1974 I wrote you about the John Newton, who married Abigail Parker. Since then I have come upon a book entitled "Revolutionary Soldiers Buried in Indiana" by Margaret R. Waters, pub 1970. This book delineates John Newton's places of residence as follows: Lived Deerfield, Mass., until about age 40; then to Bristol, Ontario County, New York for 14 or 15 years; then Kentucky; then Ohio; then Decatur County, Indiana about 1826. I might also mention that the Newton genealogy mentioned above says that this John Newton "removed first to Cherry Valley, New York, in 1794". I still wonder if Susannah Belknap, dau of Jonas, did marry a Newton if it could have just possibly have been a son of this John Newton. Jonas & John sure do seem to have lived in the same places for a number of years!

THE GERHAM LOT: I'm grateful for the correction of my assumption that that phrase about "indefeasible estate of inheritance" was unusual. I'm lucky to have you to spot my errors. . . . Please forgive delay in answering your note about the Belchertown VR manuscript you found at NEHGS. It is most helpful. (1) It settles the old dispute about identity of the Hary Belknap who married Rufus Kentfield; (2) it provides HAMA support for the inclusion of this Mary and Chlos in Glenn Evans' list of children of Samuel Belknap and Mary Newton.

However, it also raises some questions about dates and places of births.

PLACES: If this manuscript is really V R for Belchertown, and all the children were born at Belchertown, then the records showing SAMUEL REMA remaining at Ellington Conn till 1760 are in error and birthplace of son Jonas was not Ellington as my notes say. Can you throw any light on this? Was the MS really V R -- or was it an inclusive listing of the children, wherever they had been born? (Commander Charles Belknap also had Jonas b at Belchertown, but I didn't trust his source.)

DATES: Much difference on this, in various sets of records. Here are some main ones. (Year dates only, for simplicity in showing differences)

COL A -- Belchertown VR as reported by you

COL B == H W Belknap notes

COL C -- Glenn Evans, in work done for Clinton Belknap, some years ago COL D -- Salt Lake records as far as I have tham (There may be further records there, I think)

Gources named by Evans, with one exception, had nothing to support his entries. One possible EXECUTER exception may have been: "Records of Charles de Groff, Meridian, Cayuga Co., NY.", which I'ver been ax unable to track down.

Can you give me the name of the person who prepared that MS? And any other information about it or him, such as date of the work?

Next time I'm in Boston, I'll try to study it.

No luck, yet, in identifying the Asa Newton who married Tamar Vinton.

I am in Boston for a few days and took a look at the Belchertown V. 18. that The NEA 9. I has in their safe. although these records are not much - the man who was compiling them died before completing his job - I thought you sught be interested in the following: marriages by mr Justus Forward Rufus Kentfield & Mary Belknap m Nov 25, 1773 David " & Mary Smith of Sunderland Dec 5, 1776
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This index also shows two asa newton's, one born 1765 "brother oliver" (son of oliver?) and another who married 1770 (probably to Sibbel). Also an Oliver newton who in 1762 (Rebecah?) and another marriage of an oliver in 1771 - no indications as to unhom. ask had a son Joseph & 1774 and a dan matilda & 1771. & 1763 and possibly a son asa 6- 1765 as above. (over) Sions - on his # 32 Samuel Vinter Family - No Sking Sao. De Grof 10 es to 7 Monidian Myonege

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
