



In order to keep the members of the family informed of the activities of the Family Organization, and to promote greater activity in genealogical research in accordance with the instructions of the Authorities of the Church, the officers have decided to send out a Quarterly Bulletin to all members of the family.

Since our last letter of November 1964 the First Vice-President, Ronald Belnap, has moved to New Orleans and it has been necessary to replace him. In accordance with the By-Laws the President called a meeting of the Board of Directors, consisting of the officers and a representative from each of the families of the children of Gilbert Belnap, on January 30, 1965, and two names were chosen to fill this vacancy. However, both of the people chosen at that time have declined to accept the position, and since the first Vice-President is directly responsible for the genealogical work, the officers do not wish to delay the work any longer because of lack of organization. Because of the inconvenience in getting the Board of Directors together so soon for another meeting, we have appointed Della Belnap, who is the registered Family Representative for the Gilbert Belnap Family Organization, to fill the vacancy of the First Vice-President. We hope this will meet with your approval.

As you probably know, the Church is planning to establish branch genealogical libraries in various areas and we plan to organize committees of those who wish to do active research in these areas so they can meet as groups and work together. Much can be accomplished in this way. We will select a committee to act as a Central Checking Group to catch duplications before they get to the Index Bureau by having all research sheets sent to the Central Family Committee for finalizing. These sheets will be cleared by the Ward Examiners in the areas where they are made before sending them to the Central Committee, who will forward them to the Index Bureau for clearing and temple work. We would like each family, as they comply with the Church's request for the three-generation family group sheets, to send us a copy of the four sheets that apply to the Belnap Family in order that we may bring our records up to date. These sheets should be sent to Della Belnap, 815 - 32nd Street, Ogden, Utah, 84403, by August 1, 1965. This is the date the sheets should be in to your ward. The enclosed envelope should be returned immediately. If you need any help with this, please contact your Family member that is on the Board of Directors.
