

### Dear Relatives:

We are happy with your response to the new Belnap Family Crier. If we continue to receive your financial support, we will bring you more interesting information and articles. (Mail your 1968 subscription (\$3.00) to Della Belnap.)

We are pleased with the progress being made with the research in England. It has been an expensive and tedious work. The records kept in England in 1500 and before are in Old English and an old type of Latin. This is slow reading and few are available to read it. However, there has been found court cases and wills that are giving us much new information on our direct line. Before, all information found was on the branch lines. When this search is completed the information will be printed in this paper.

Two evenings were spent at the Logan and Idaho Falls Temples doing sealing work for distant English ancestors. The first session was held on September 22, 1967 at the Logan Temple. 67 couples and £37 children were sealed. We are sad to report the very sudden death of the Secretary of the Belnap Family Organization, Mrs. Coelin Ross Holbrook, who died on November 26, 1967 and was buried on November 30, 1967 at the Aultorest Memorial Park Cemetery, Ogden, Utah. She was the daughter of Tirza Belnap and Aaron C. Ross. She leaves her husband, Lawrence A. Holbrook, a son and three daughters, Allen R. Holbrook, LaDora Hanter, Many Lou Moon and Gale Haskell. Her Mother, Tirza, and two brothers, Leonard B. Ross and Dr. Aaron B. Ross. She has been President of the Relief Society in Vale, Oregon, and active in MIA and Sunday School in the 14th and 28th wards in Ogden. She was a clerk typist at the Defense Depot Ogden at the time of her death. She was elected to the office of Secretary of the Belnap Family at the reunion held in Shelley, Idaho on August 20, 1965.

The Treasurer of the Belnap Family Organization, Artella Luthy was released in December because of illness that caused her to lose her sight. She is the daughter of Zeruah Lowe and J. LaVille Thomson. Artella Luthy has been very dependable, has a good knowledge of book-keeping and banking. She is employed by the First Security Bank of Ogden, Utah. She was elected Secretary-Treasurer of the Belnap Family Organization in 1964 and has served faithfully. We will miss her and wish her God's blessings for the future.

We wish to thank all those who have helped us this past year. And we say again, This is your organization. If it succeeds, it is because of your faith, good works and financial support.

MT. BELKNAP STORY: Mount Belknap, the center peak of three located east of and clearly visible from the city of Beaver, Utah. It is in the Tushar Range of mountains and has an elevation of 12,139 feet. Tushar is an Indian word meaning Snow, and the area surrounding these peaks is a deer hunter's paradise, and Puffer Lake is a highly desirable recreation spot. Much interesting pioneer history is written of this part of

In May 1873 under the command of John D. Wilkins, Major, and consisting of Companies D, E, G and I and consisting of some 250 troops of the U.S. 8th Infantry, a military post was established two miles east of the city of Beaver. Though weary from a 200-mile walk, a tented city arose almost overnight with a large hospital tent in the center. This hospital, though primarily for the soldiers, served the civilian residents of the area. The installation was first named the Post of Beaver, but was later changed to Fort Cameron. The Fort was abandoned in April 1883 and the soldiers were transferred to Fort Douglas, Utah (Salt Lake City). One event that transpired while the soldiers were there was the trial and conviction of John D. Lee. A company of soldiers escorted him and where he, Lee, was executed for his part in the crime.

a feature article entitled "Black Power Days" by George Woodhouse, is the the town people watched from a distant hillside where a few homes were following: "If you take a view from Big Flat or Lake Puffer Peak you will see, in a northerly direction, Mt. Hawley, named in honor of Myron Hawley, because he climbed it frequently; Mt. Delano, the second highest peak in Utah; Shelly Baldy, Mt. Baldy and Mt. Belknap, which was named in honor of Thomas Belknap of the 8th Infantry, U.S.A. stationed at Fort Cameron. He was the first known white man to climb Mt. Belknap Thomas Belknap came to Utah with Johnston's Army and fought under General Patrick Conner at the Battle of Bear River in 1863, when the Shoshone Indians were defeated and subdued His brother, Gilbert Belknap joined the Utah Cavalry under Captain Lot Smith to protect the U S mail near Independence Rock on the Great Plains in May 1862. The Indians destroyed the mail stations, burned the coaches and mail bags, killed the drivers and stole the stock. Gilbert was later a missionary companion of John R. Murdock in the Southern States. They were both veterans of the plains."

There was also a public school named the Belknap School in Beaver; also a Chapter of the Daughters of Utah Pioneers called the Belknap Chapter at present active in Beaver.

MEW HAMPSHIRE STORY: Located in the central part of New Hampshire is Belknap County with the city of Laconia as the County Seat. Within the county are the Belknap mountains, with Belknap Mountain as the highest peak, 2,378 feet. Belknap County has an area of 401 square miles and is devoted to agriculture and recreational facilities, with summer and winter resorts on Lake Winnipesaukee. Textiles, hosiery, wood products and mill machinery are manufactured there. The County was formed in 1840.

BELKNAP, MONTANA: The city of Belknap was located on Highway Alternate 10 between Missoula, Montana and Clark Fork, Idaho near Thompson Falls. The to Mountain Meadows, where the historically famous massacre was committed, city was a lumber shipping place on the railroad and was named after the foreman of the lumber manufacturing business, a Mr. Belknap (first name From the "Beaver City Press", issue of January 16, 1948, quoted from not known). Nearly all the town was destroyed by a forest fire while left standing.

> BELKNAP, ILLINOIS: A town named Belknap is located in Johnson County. Southern Illinois, near the Cache River northeast of Cairo in a rich agriculture area.

FORT BELKNAP: This old Fort, Fort Belknap, Texas, partly restored, is just south of Newcastle, Young County, Texas. It was named for William G. Belknap and was built in 1850 on the Salt Fork of the Brazos River to afford frontier protection and also guard the "Lower Indian Reserve" set aside in Texas The tribes on the Reserve were the Caddo, Anadarkho, Waco, Tahwaccaro and Tonkawa Indians.

GEORGE EUGENE BELKNAP: American Naval Officer, born Newport, New Hampshire January 22, 1832; died Key West, Florida, April 7, 1903. He advanced through various grades to Rear Admiral in 1889, and retired from the Navy in 1894. After taking part in the capture of the Barrier Forts on the Canton River, China, in 1856, he participated actively in the American Civil War, and in 1873, while engaged in deep sea soundings in the North Pacific Ocean, made notable discoveries concerning the topography of the

ocean bed. He became superintendent of the U.S. Naval Observatory in 1885, and was Commander of the U.S. Fleet in the Asiatic Station from 1889 to 1892. Among other works, he published "Deep Sea Soundings."

JEREMY (originally Jeremiah) BELKNAP: American Clergyman, born Boston. Mass. June 4, 1744, died there June 20, 1798. He attended Harvard College, graduating in 1762, and afterward he became Pastor of Congregational Churches in Dover, New Hampshire (1766) and Boston (1787). He was active for the American cause during the Revolutionary War. The Massachusetts Historical Society, organized in 1791 and incorporated in 1794 - the first of its kind in the U.S. - recognizes him as its founder. He devoted much of his life to biographical and historical research, and his best-known works include "History of New Hampshire", 3 volumes (1784-1792): "American Biography", 2 volumes (1794-1798); and "Collection of Psalms and Hymns", (1795).

REGINALD ROWAN BELKNAP: U.S. Naval Officer, born Malden, Mass. June 26, 1871. He graduated from the Maval Acadamy in 1891, and was promoted through the grades to Rear Admiral in 1927, and retired in the same year. ber 20, 1967 in Vietnam. He was 44. At the time of his death. Colonel He is known for his invention of a portable and collapsible anti-submarine net, and for command of the U.S. Mine Squadron which laid the mine field across the North Sea in 1918. He took part in the Spanish-American War, the Chinese Boxer Campaign, and the Philippine Insurrection after which he became Mayal Attache in Berlin, Rome and Vienna. In 1912 he became Assistant Chief of the Bureau of Navigation, with which he was long associated, and two years later he acted as war observer in Germany. He served as Director of the Strategy Department of the Naval War College 1921-1923. Since 1929 he has been burser and treasurer of the General Theological Seminary, New York, and has been active in the Military Order of the World War, as a delegate to Episcopal General Conventions and Bundles for America. He has written on various Naval subjects.

WILLIAM WORTH BELKNAP: American Military Officer, born Newburgh, New York September 22, 1829; died Washington, D.G. October 13, 1890. He attended Princeton University, and studied law at Georgetown, D.C., being admitted to the bar in 1851. He entered the Union Army in 1861, and participated in engagements at Shiloh, Corinth, Vicksburg and Atlanta. He advanced to the rank of Brigadier General in 1854, and was appointed Secretary of War in 1869, in the cabinet of Ulysses S. Grant. He resigned this office in 1876 following accusations of malfeasance in office, of which he was later acquitted. (Story follows.)

THE BELKNAP SCANDAL: The Belknap Scandal (1876) was one of the series of scandals which marked Grant's second administration, Secretary of

War W.W. Belknap's first wife agreed to secure a lucrative post tradership at Fort Sill for C.P. March of New York, on condition that she should receive one-half of the profits. The trader at the Post paid March \$12,000 a year not to take the place and March paid \$6,000 to Mrs. Belknap. After her death he peid the money to the Secretary. Just before a house investigation committee moved to impeach him. Belknap resigned. The impeachment trial in April and May resulted in acquittal, largely on the grounds that the Senate had no jurisdiction over a resigned officer. (Information source, W.B. Hesseltine, "Ulvases S. Belnap, who is the son of Vinson K. Belnap, 9th son of Gilbert Belnap and Adaline Knight.) "Lt. Col. Belnap was killed in action Decem-Belnap was commanding the 3d Bn. 8th Inf. 4th Inf Div. Col. Belnap entered the wilitary service from California. His assignments included a broad span of command and staff positions in Europe, Korea and the United States, as well as combat service in the Asiatic-Pacific Theater of Cperations during War II. Prior to assuming command of his battalion in Vietnam, Col. Belnap served as executive assistant to the Director of the Joint Staff in Washington. Born in Ogden, Utah, and reared in Gerber, California, Col. Belnap attended the Universities of California and Georgia, graduating from the latter. He subsequently attained his Master's degree from Lehigh University. He was a graduate of the Army Command and General Staff College, the Armed Forces Staff College, and the U.S. Army War College, Class 1967. Col. Belnap is survived by his wife, Jean Simmons Belnap, sons David, Douglas and Philip, all of 130 Groghan Drive, Carlisle, Pa., his mother, Mrs. Jewel Belnap, and sister, Mrs. Mary Deitrick, of Red Bluff, California, and a sister, Mrs. Jack Coulter, of Dunsmuir, California, Burial was in Arlington National Genetery on December 29." # 125th ANNIVERSARY OF RELIEF SOCIETY Mount Logan Stake, Logan, Utah March 1967

The Female Relief Society of Nauvoo, now known as the Relief Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, was organized March 17, 1842 in Nauvoo, Illinois. Members of all the ward, branch and mission Relief Society organizations in the LDS Church, 286,820 strong, observed the 125th Anniversary of the founding this past week.

Typical of the talents developed in the arts and crafts in the homemaking department of the Relief Society is the handmade gold leaf plaque, mounted on a background of royal blue velvet and framed in gold leaf, made by Homemaking Counselor Zeruah Thomson and dedicated to the memory of her great grandmother who was one of the 18 women in the original organization founded by Joseph Smith, to her grandmother who served as president of Relief Society for 25 years and to her mother who was a stake board member.

Mrs. Thomson presented the memorial plaque to Mount Logan Stake Relief Society President Relda Jorgensen and Counselor Lucille Campbell in commemoration of the 125th Anniversary.

Memorial on the back of the plaque:

This plaque was made by Zeruah Lowe Thomson and dedicated to the memory of her ancestral lineage of devoted Relief Society service.

To her great grandmother, Martha McBride Knight, who was one of the original 18 women in attendance at the meeting when the Relief Society was organized by the Prophet Joseph Smith, 17 March 1842. This day was also Martha's 37th birthday. She was born 17 March 1805.

And to her grandmother, Adaline Knight Belnap, who was president of the Hooper Ward for 25 years and labored a few years on the Weber Stake Board under President Jane S. Richards.


Her mother, Adaline Belnap Lowe, was a member of the Oneida Stake Board for a number of years. (Franklin, Idaho.)

Zeruah is in her fifth year as homemaking counselor in the presidency of the Mt. Logan Stake Relief Society, and has acted as counselor in her ward for two years (Logan, Utah), making four generations of service to Relief Society.

In commemoration of the 125th birthday of the organization of the Relief Society, this plaque was presented to the Mt. Logan Stake to hang on the walls of their Stake Relief Society Center which is soon under construction.

#### THE BOY WHO HELPED TO STOP THE BRITISH

Jesse Belnap - 1760-1854


Jesse Belnap was born in Connecticut and was only a lad of fifteen when the Revolutionary War began, and he begged his mother to let him go to fight for his country. However, his mother would not let him go until he was seventeen years old. He joined the army at Hebron, Connecticut in 1777.

All the men in his company were artificers. Artificers were men who built bridges and roads and machinery and made it possible for the regular soldiers to move about. They are called "engineers" and "seabees" now.

One day Captain Horton was told that the British intended to sail their ships up the Hudson River, and the General told him to make a chain to stretch across the river to stop the ships, so Captain Horton put his men to work to make the big chain.

Jesse knew how to do blacksmithing work and he worked hard with the other men until the long chain was completed. Then the Captain asked for volunteers to swim across the river. Jesse stepped forward and said, "I will go, Captain." So Jesse swam across and pulled a string with him. When he reached the other bank he used the string to pull a rope across, and then the other soldiers swam across, holding on to the rope. Then they tied one end of the rope to the heavy chain and pulled and pulled until the chain was stretched across the river. They fastened the chain to a tree on each side of the river and stood guard with their guns to keep the enemy from unfastening it. In this way the British ships were kept from sailing up the Hudson River, for no ship could sail over the chain.

This boy grew up and married Eunice Hall, and they each lived to be over ninety years old and had 17 children. Jesse was the grandfather of Gilbert Belnap.
