The following stated sums are due on Territorial and school taxes from the respective counties named, on the 31st of December, A. D. 1882, and the total may be relied upon as revenue, as probably all or nearly all will yet be collected and paid into the Territorial Treasury, to wit:

In addition to the above there is due on taxes prior to the year 1878, \$37,368.45, a large portion of which can never be collected. Suits have been instituted in several cases, and all the property of the parties liable has been exhausted, leaving balances that can never be collected. It would therefore be advisable for the coming Legislature to remit the amounts due in those cases and thus close the accounts. This would avoid the necessity of reporting as revenue amounts that can never be realized.
