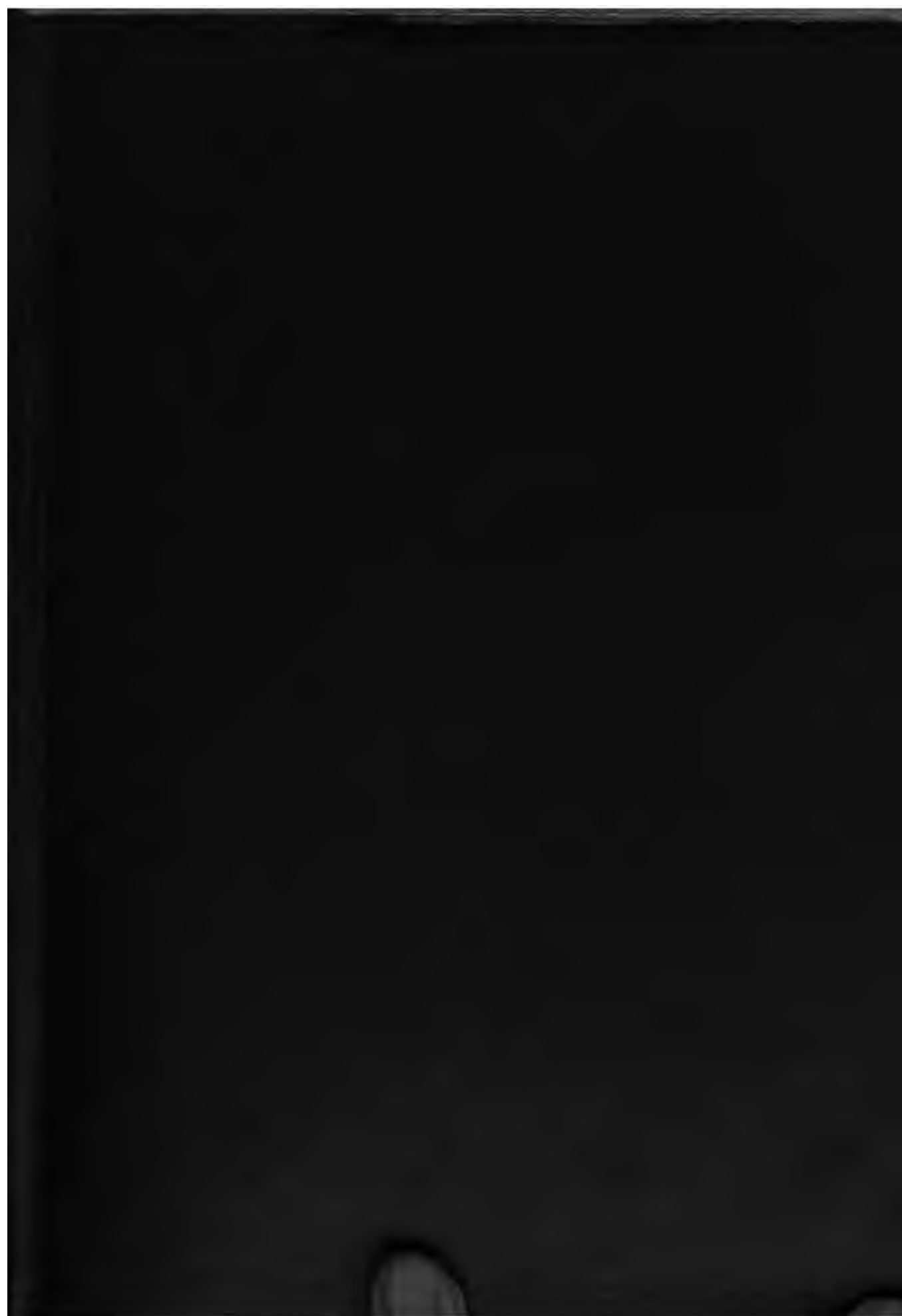

Introduction.

IN the first place I must refer to some necessary corrections to the first Volume :—

Pages 5 and 22, add a ? to the words *alias Lyons*," under the Arms of Chocke. I think the writer of the addition on page 22, from the Caius Coll. MS., "*Witheridge alias Lyons*," refers more to the Arms than to the name of the family. In the grant of a Crest (page 106) the Arms are simply attributed to Witherige by Robert Cooke, and Lyons is not mentioned. Perhaps until some other evidence is produced we may conclude that, as the Arms of Witherige were according to the Patent "*Argent, a Chevron sables betweene thre Lyons cowshant gules*," the Arms of Lyons may have been "*Argent, a chevron between three lions couchant Gules*." There is nothing "*coward*" about the lions; and the piece of glass illustrated by Mr. Paul* must, one would think from the colours, have referred to the family of Lyons, and not to that of Chocke.

Page 10, for "*Newborough*," it may be necessary to substitute "*Merebrooke*."

Page 11, the charges in the Arms of Fraye are, as is usual, tricked as "*bee-hives*;" they should be "*fig frays*."

Page 44, More of Cookham, add the Christian names [*William*] Berkeley, [*John*] Byrde.

Page 55, Tyghall. The third John Tyghall was the son of [*Robert*].

Page 223, Hugh Hene married [*Catherine*] da. of [*Anthony*] Bickerstaffe.

Page 244, Lyford of Hurley, after Speprue add [*Sheprue*].

Page 273, in the pedigree of Rich of Sonning the italics in brackets, "Sir, K^t Alderman," should be struck out. They were added, as the Townsend MS. included these words in the running text. Reference may be made to "Some account of the Lord Mayors and Sheriffs of the City of London, 1601 to 1625," compiled by G. E. Cokayne, London, 1897, p. 83 n., where the confusion so often found between the two men named William Cokayne is fully cleared up. I am indebted to the writer of this book for the correction.

The present Volume contains nearly all the flotsam and jetsam gathered during the time, the four Visitations of Berkshire were under consideration.

With the exception of the List of those summoned to attend Ashmole and deliver their Arms and Pedigrees, I have again arranged the various Pedigrees and Notes in alphabetical order for convenience of reference. The Table of Contents shews at once the description of the different items.

The copies of the Grants of Arms preserved in MS. Ashmole 858, fol. 189, etc., being those exhibited to him at the Visitation made in 1665-6, have been supplemented from MSS. in the College of Arms, and other MS. Books of Grants in private collections.

In the Introduction to Vol. I. there were printed some letters referring to the obstructions put in Ashmole's way in following the usual custom, that a Herald going on Visitation could obtain copies of the earlier Visitations of the county he was about to visit. It is certain that he obtained a copy of that made in 1623, which he himself transcribed, the signatures to the Pedigrees being imitated. This is preserved in MS. Ashmole 852, pp. 235 to 385, and was the text used for the copy printed in Vol. I.

In the same Volume (MS. Ashmole 852) is another set of Pedigrees, some of which will be found printed in the present Volume. Mr. W. H. Black, in his catalogue of the Ashmole MSS., describes Part I. of MS. Ashmole 852 as "Pedigrees taken at sundry Visitations of Berkshire reduced into one Alphabetical Series by Elias Ashmole, Windsor Herald."

They occupy pages 1 to 202, and of this portion of the Volume Mr. Black remarks that they "seem to have been written later than the following MS. [*i.e.*, the copy of the Visitation of 1623], which is bound up with it."

The Pedigrees are, many of them, taken from the Visitation of 1566, but there are some additional ones, and these I have printed in the present volume. Unfortunately their origin is not even suggested.

Without having had any opportunity of comparing them, I think that the first part of MS. Ashmole 852 is a copy of either Vincent's or Philip-pott's Berkshire collections, probably the latter, and that Ashmole, finding the official copy of the 1566 Visitation was not sufficiently complete, chose the MS. of one, or it may be of both, or made a combination of or selection from the works of the other two Heralds.

Some, at least, of these additional Pedigrees appear to have been copied from the original papers, thrown out for one reason or another, at the time the office copy was made; others seem to have been compiled in order to fill the blanks between the Pedigrees entered at different Visitations, and thus shew the continuous existence of the family.

In the present Volume will be found transcripts of the original copies, signed by the head of each family, of at least eighteen Pedigrees, prepared for the Visitation made in 1665-6, and thrown out by Ashmole, principally because certain fees of entry could not be obtained. The reason is stated in many instances on the Pedigrees themselves, "fee unpaid," etc., having been added.

It is thus clear that a Visitation was not an official record of the Gentry of a County, but comprised only the Pedigrees of those who were prepared to pay the Fees of Entry.

Of course it is impossible to say that these thrown-out Pedigrees, now found in MS. Rawlinson, D. 865, are all that were so treated, and indeed if the list of those summoned to appear at the Visitation is studied it will be found that in a number of cases there is no explanation given why the Pedigrees were not recorded.

It is almost needless to point out that these eighteen Pedigrees, having been received and written out by the Herald, and signed by the head of each family,* are of equal value with those entered in the Visitation Book of 1665-6, as the mere fact of the non-payment of the fees cannot,

of course, in any way depreciate the quality of the information they contain.

A somewhat similar instance is referred to by the late Dr. Jackson Howard in his edition of the Visitation of London made in 1568 (p. 13). "The Pedigree of White, prepared in 1568, but not entered in the vellum Visitation-book, G. 10, at the College of Arms, appears in F. 1" [the original papers from which it was compiled] "at fol. 318."

Some few Pedigrees have also been added from the Harleian MSS., the number being given in every instance.

The text I have called the Smith MS. is a copy made, I believe, by Samuel Stebbing, Somerset Herald, about the year 1708. The full title of the book is, "The Visitation of Berkshire made in Anno 1566 By William Harvey al's Clarenceux King of Armes, Transcripta et Augmentata p' Will^m Smith al's Rouge dragon Anno 1600."

The Tricks of Arms are in every case copies of the original drawings, and every addition made by myself is in italics, within square brackets.

When the volumes containing copies of all the inscriptions in the Churches of Berkshire, visited by Ashmole, are issued, it will be possible to increase the Armorial of the County, and to add some dates and other information to the fleshless skeletons of the Visitations.

In some instances the series of interesting letters received by Ashmole during the time of his Visitation, as also some Arms and Pedigrees, seemed to require a little addition, and if it be considered that I have now and then gone beyond my tether I would plead the words of so great an authority as Sir William Dugdale: "I am as willing to confine my selfe to y^e circuite of this Shire as he or any man can be to desire it; but they y^e understand what belongs to these things cannot but know that now and then a little light at a remote distance will helpe much."

My thanks are due to my friend Everard Green, Esq., F.S.A., Rouge Dragon, for his kindly interest in my efforts to gather in the flotsam and jetsam of Berkshire contained in the present Volume.

Each list has a number of notes and corrections written by Ashmole, as well as the names of persons added by him from time to time. All these additions are here printed in italics.

List No. 1 is printed in ordinary type. It is no doubt the list furnished to Ashmole at the commencement of the Visitation, and from a note by him, after Bradfield, "247 Harthes," it may be assumed that it contains a fairly accurate list of the principal hearths in Berkshire in the year 1665, more or less completed by Ashmole's additions.

A number of the names are marked with lines and crosses, +, × ; these I have left out, as they seem to follow no exact rule.

No reliance whatever can be placed on the title *Gent.*, so often occurring in MS. No. 1. Many of the names so distinguished drop out before the compilation of the final list No. 5, without having any information attached to them, as mort, gone away, disclaimed, and the like. *They are here marked "Not in Rawl. D. 1480."*

Any notes not in the main text are printed in square brackets.

See a very full and complete pedigree of Castillion, by G. E. Cokayne, Esq., F.S.A., *Clarendon*, printed in the "Genealogist," New Series, vol. xvii., pp. 73, 199, 225; also an account of Speen Church by Walter Money, Esq., F.S.A., in which the monuments are described. The Arms of Castillion are of considerable interest. The original Arms are given at the foot of the Funeral Certificate of John Baptist Castillion who died on the 12th of February 1597-8, and was buried at Speen, near Newbury, on the 17th of March following (see the facsimile, "Genealogist," vol. xvii.). It is marked, "This

is the true Coate of John Baptist Castillion as it was sent from Piemont." Gules, a lion rampant Argent, in the dexter chief point a tower Or. No Crest is given.

There are two Castillion tombs at Speen, the older one to the memory of John Baptist Castillion. This fine tomb has not been improved by being removed to a corner, and then overshadowed by a painted window in the worst possible taste. It originally showed the "true coate" as above, with the difference that it is a castle with three towers in the corner of the shield, and not a single tower. The other tomb is that of Elizabeth the first wife of Sir Francis Castillion; it was erected according to the inscription it bears in the year 1604. This tomb also originally had the "true coate."

In all the Castillion Arms on the two tombs the lion rampant is carved in relief, and in some of the shields the castle in the corner is slightly raised. At some period the

Arms have been altered in every shield, by fastening over the lower half of the lion a tower, gilding the upper half of the lion, and painting a small ermine canton over the castle in the corner. The tower has now fallen away, and the mark of it still remains; the gold castle lined out with black originally in the corner can also easily be traced.

The painted impalements recording the various marriages, reaching to 1607, may have been added at any time.

I here print three drafts of patents from MSS. in the College of Arms, the "Latin" following the originals. The first is taken from the "Genealogist" by the kind permission of Mr. Cokayne. In my opinion the first two of these were never executed; they are both by Sir Gilbert Dethick, who is said in the third draft to have issued the real patent, which agrees with neither. They were, I think, simply efforts towards granting the proposed augmentation.

The third draft is by Sir William Dethick, and appears to be an exemplification of the Arms and Crest as given in Sir Gilbert Dethick's patent.

About the year 1563, judging from the date of the two earliest drafts, it was intended to grant the augmentation. This I conclude also from the large introduction of ermine into the Arms tricked on both of Sir Gilbert Dethick's drafts.

In 1565 the manor of Benham Valance was given to John Baptist Castillion, so perhaps it might be concluded that the patent of Arms, not now extant, was granted some time between or about the years 1563 and 1565. Sir Gilbert Dethick died in October 1584.

The last of the three drafts, by William Dethick and William Camden, is dated the 18th of December 1597. Notwithstanding the "*excogitavimus et assignavimus*" of the "Latin" text, with regard to the Crest, it will be safer to rely on the English draft, that they "ratified & conferred this Crest or Cognizance of the Salamanders head coupee proper (?) wth an Emprresse or word of delight appropriat to the same, wth helmet and mantle."

A docket of this patent seems to be preserved in Slove MS. 676, fol. 140, as follows: "*In Campo Rosso supra el Castillo d'argente ung medio de Leone rampante d'oro: for the Crest a Salamanders head Coupee with an impress or word appropriate to the same, with the helmet and mantells, granted by Will: Dethick Garter to Jn^o Baptista Castillion from Piedmont in Italy.*"

It will be noticed that in the two drafts by Sir Gilbert Dethick, dated the 1st of May and the 20th of August 1563, the salamander's head is given as the Crest. It now appears only once on the monuments, at the feet of the figure of J. B. Castillion, where it is represented in a different form from that usually found in the tricks. It has a kind of upper beak and a beard; the ears, as well as plaited lines of a mane, are of gold. As in the drafts of Sir Gilbert Dethick it is placed in a crown of gold.

In the draft of William Dethick, now dated 1597, it is stated that the Arms the renowned and ancient family of Castillion bore was, on a field gules a demi lion gold, rising out of a silver castle, as confirmed by Sir Gilbert Dethick. These were probably the Arms confirmed, but they were not the ancient Arms of the family. It is, however, clear, from the drafts of patents dated 1563, that Sir Gilbert Dethick had already started the idea of placing the demi lion in the tower. This change in the position of the charges may have resulted from the augmentation of the ermine canton.

In the draft by William Dethick the Crest is simply described as a salamander's head proper, coupee on a wreath of his colours; the crown is not mentioned. It is, however, quite clear that this draft of 1597 ratified and confirmed the Arms and Crest, as they had been before ratified and confirmed by Sir Gilbert Dethick.

Ashmole refers in the annexed pedigree to the ermine canton given by Queen Elizabeth to Castillion as well as to the rose added to the Arms of Compaigne by Henry the VIIIth.

The Arms of Castillion and Compaigne impaled are represented in the facsimile of the Funeral Certificate given with Mr. Cokayne's article in the "Genealogist," as also the Salamander's head Crest in a crown. The trick at the head of Ashmole's pedigree gives the same Arms quartered and the same Crest.

J. B. Castillion died on the 12th of February 1597-8 and was buried on the 17th

of March following. This exemplification by William Dethick seems to be dated the 13th of December 1597. It is difficult to see the purpose of it, a little more than two months before Castillion died, unless the previous patent of Sir Gilbert Dethick could not be found.

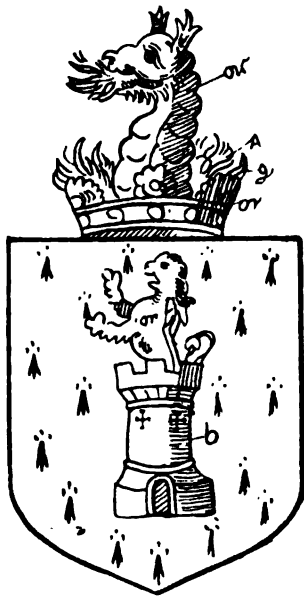
The idea of course at once occurs, considering the narrowness of the dates, that it was made because it would be required for the proper marshalling of the funeral.

It is puzzling to know at what time the alterations were made in the Arms; it may have been done by J. B. Castillion on his receiving the augmentation, if some portions of the tombs at Speen were prepared before his death in 1598. The later tomb is unfortunately like the older one, neither in its original position nor condition, but the Arms upon it are those of Sir Francis Castillion and Dorothy (St. John) his wife impaled. If their marriage took place, as stated, in the year 1597, the impaled Arms must have been placed on the base in or after that year, and possibly the figure and inscription were not added until 1604. Or it may be suggested that after the funeral of J. B. Castillion, Camden and Thompson, the Heralds, ordered the alteration mentioned above, and made the Arms on both the tombs agree with those exemplified by William Dethick, and with those given on the funeral certificate.

Benham Valance was sold in or after 1630, and notwithstanding the patent of Sir Gilbert Dethick, confirmed in the exemplification of the Arms and Crest by his son Sir William Dethick, Francis Castillion, as pointed out by Mr. Cokayne, was able to prove to the satisfaction of Chitting and Philipott, who acted for Camden at the Visitation of 1623, that the Arms he was entitled to bear were the true Arms as received from Piedmont, quartering Compaigne with the rose granted by Henry the VIIIth (see Vol. I., p. 79).

The same Arms with a different Crest are found on the tomb of the Rev. John Castillion, D.D., Dean of Rochester; buried 1688 ("Genealogist," xvii., p. 204).

And although it appeareth that the Hennes in South Wales were gentlemen of good noate and of Coate Armour from whom it may probably be supposed the said S^r Henry Henn alias Hene to bee descended. 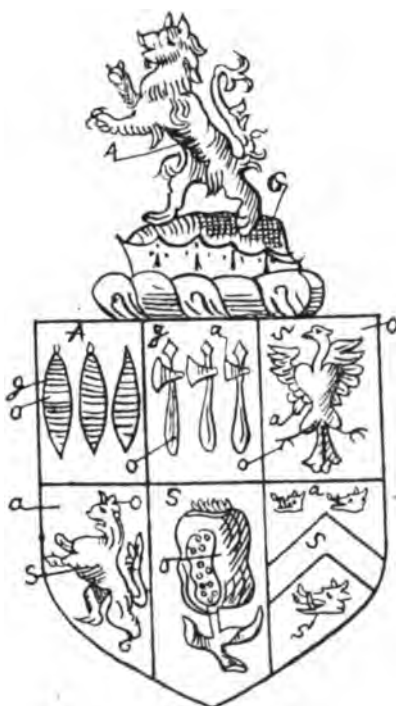

Sir Edward did giue a very fine Crest w^{ch} I beline hee did purchase,* for formerly I finde they gaue an nother, and M^r Hoby hath y^e patten for y^e new Crest now in y^e hous, w^{ch} I doe Intend to bring to london yer long, but you told me sumthing must be donn now before the tearme, but if it could hansomly be deferred tell I could come to london w^{ch} will be aboue a fortnight hence then I could know M^r Hobys minde and let you know it, but if y^t cannot be pray let me know as soone as you can whether M^r Hoby may giue the Hobys armes without leaue from your office (and also our Children) or whether it must be purchased, and if so w^t the charge will bee, y^t so wee may know what to doe and giue you an Ausur directly. 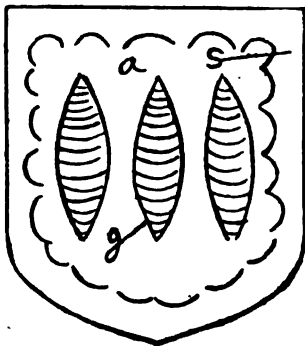

To all & singular, aswell Nobles as Gentiles, as others to whome these p'sente shall come, Sr Edward Bysshe Knight Clarenceux King of Armes of the South East & west pte of this Realme of England from the River of Trent Southward, sendeth greeting. Forasmuch as amongst the sundry Monum^{ts} devised by our prudent Ancestors to comend the memory of deserving men to succeeding ages, it is observable that the cheifest & most vsuall haue been the bearing of markes or signes in Sheilds commonly called Armes, as evident demonstracons of their vertues & rewards for the same, And that for their comendable service to their Prince and Country, in Warr or Peace they might in their lyfe tyme receiue due honor &

afterwarde transmitt the same to their successive posterity. In which respect whereas Peregrine Hoby of Bysham in the County of Berke Esq^r naturall son to Sr Edward Hoby of Bysham afores^d Knight is generally knowne to be a person well deserving not only for his good conversacon & discreet demeanour, but also for a prudent discharge of his duty to his Country having been a Burgess of Parliam^t for the Towne of Merlow in Co^m Buk: both in the reigne of King Charles the first of blessed memory & of King Charles the 2^d now haply reigning, as also a Justice of Peace in the s^d County of Berke for many yeares past.

Know yee therefore that I the said Clarenceux for the consideracōns aforesaid, haue by power also of my Office, vnder the greate Seale of England, at the instant request of him the s^d Peregrine Hoby, given granted assigned and confirmed, and by these p^sentē doe giue grant assigne & confirme vnto him the s^d Peregrine a Border engraied sable, vpon the Escotcheon of his Armes, as in the margent of these p^sentē is more fully to be seene, as a fitt and noted distinccon in his said Armes* or Ensignes of Honour from any other of y^t name or family. So that he the said Peregrine Hoby and his descend^{ts} may at all tymes & vpon all occasions, beare & shew forth the same Armes in sheld Coate Armour or otherwise wth their due differences, accord^s to the law of Armes & laudable cus[t]ome of this realme wthout the inpediment let or interrupcon of any pson or psons whatsoever. In wittnes whereof I the said Clarenceux haue herevnto subscribed my name, & affixed the seale of my Office the 17th day of November in the 16th yeare of the reigne of our Soneraigne lord Charles the 2^d by the grace of God, of England Scotland France & Ireland King defendor of the faith, And in the yeare of o^r L^d God 1664.

Pray S^r Correct & mend this as you think fitt, & retorne it so as you would have me Engross it.

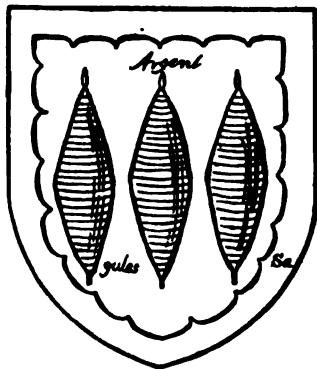

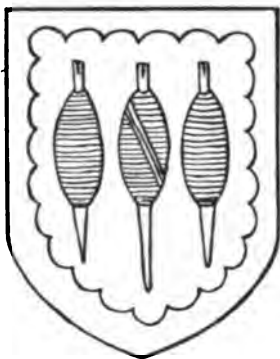

* Peregrine Hoby had no Arms; the Arms confirmed or granted to him, with the addition of the bordure engraied, were the Arms of Badland assumed by Hoby on account of the marriage with the heiress of that family, discarding their more appropriate bearing (see "*Miscel. Geneal. et Herald.*," i., 141-2). Also an exemplification of these Arms to Sir Thomas Posthumous Hoby, Knt., brother to Sir Edward Hoby, Knt., by William Dethick Garter, and William Camden Clarenceux, dated the 10th of July, 1698. A pedigree is also given to the same date. Cf. also "*Miscel. Geneal. et Herald.*," 2nd Series, iii., 351.

Mrs. Hoby, when she wrote to Ashmole on the 16th of October 1667 (as above), can hardly refer to the Crest granted to Sir Edward Hoby by Dethick on the 10th of June 1570. She says, "Sir Edward [Bysshe] did giue a very fine Crest w^{ch} I belue he [Peregrine Hoby] did purchase, for formerly I finde they gaue an other, and Mr [Peregrine] Hoby hath y^e patten for y^e new Crest now in y^e hous, w^{ch} I doe Intend to bring to london yer long." Of this crest granted by Sir Edward Bysshe I can find no record. Possibly it was one of the grants cancelled at the Restoration, given by Bysshe during the years 1646 to 1660, when he intruded into the office of Garter for the Parliament.



At the same time Mrs. Hoby seems to have been labouring under some misconception when she wrote about the arms. They had been granted as above on the 17th of November 1664, and were allowed by Ashmole at the Visitation of 1665-66.

The bottoms or weavers' spindles wound with thread (literally balls of thread) seem to be better tricked in Harl. MS. 1488, fol. 139^b.

Lovelace, dwells at Kilham with Mr Rich: Lovelace at Wargrave. Neither names appear among the Disclaimers, nor did they enter their pedigrees. 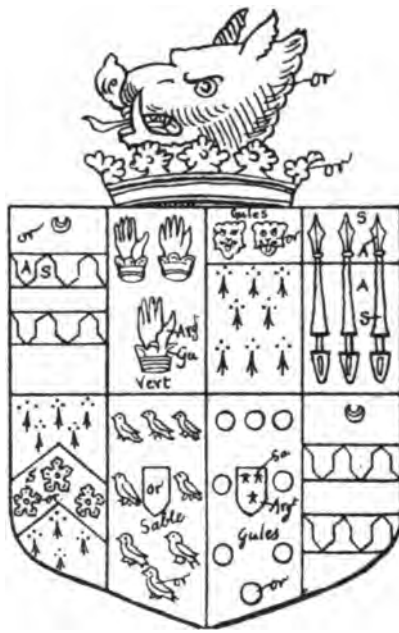

To all and singular as well nobles and gentilmen as others to whom these presentes shall come be seene hearde read or understood We S^r Gilbert Dethicke Knight als Garter principall Kinge of Armes, Robert Cooke Esquyer als Clarenceux Kinge of Armes of the Southe partes and Wifflm Flower Esquyer als Norroy Kinge of Armes of the north partes of England sendith greetinge in the Lord God Everlastinge. For as much as aunciently from the beginnunge of the valiant and Vertouse actes of excellent personnes have been commendid to the world and posteritie with soundry monuments and remembrances of their good desertes Amongst the which the chieffest and most usuall hath been the bearinge of figures in shyldes called Armes beinge none other thing than demonstrations, or tokens, of prowisse & valour

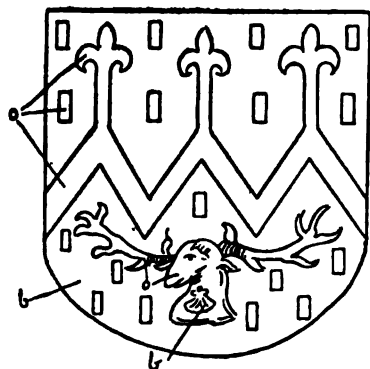
diuersely distributed according to the qualities of the personnes meriting the same. To thintent that such as by their vertues do adde to the advancemēt of the common weale the shyne of their good lyfe and so conversacon in dayly practyse of thyngs worthy and commendable being the very true and pfecte tokens of a right noble dysposition may therefore receive dewe honor in their lyves and also desyre &

continue the same successively in their posteritie for ever. Amongst the which number Thomas Powle of London Escnyer Clerke of Crowne to the Queen's Majesty's Court of Chancerye one of the six clerkes and comptroller of the hanaper in the same Court and also steward of her ma^{ties} forest of Waltham in the County of Essex beinge one of the bearers of these tokens of honor to witte of Armes with hearme mantles torce and creast to him assigned by William Harvy late Clarenceux Kinge of Armes of the South partes of England by letters patentes bearinge date the xxiiij of June 1559, These Armes and creast withstandinge beinge not so well & belyked of for some respects of the officers of Armes well known to the sayd Thomas Powle hath required us the Kings of Armes to shewe him favor and to gratifye him in the alteration & changinge & amendinge of his sayd owld Armes & Creast. In Consideracion wherof and at his instant request and for a further proof of our good affection . . . him we the sayd Kinges of Armes by power and authority to us committed by letters patentes under the great seale of England have assigned given & grannted unto the same Thomas Powle in lieu and place of his sayd old armes and creast these armes and creast following viz. azure a fese ermyne between three lyons passant gold, uppon his hearme on a torce silver and goules an unicorne passant azure mained bearded flashed ungled & horned gold about the neck a crowne silver mantled geules doubled silver as more playnly appeareth depicted in the margent which arms & creast and every part & parcell therof we the said Kinges of Armes do by these presentes certifie confirme and graunt to the said Thomas Powle and to his posteritie for ever and he and they the same armes to have hold beare enioy and shew forth with their due differences in shyld, cote, Armour, seale, or otherwyse at all tymes and for ever hereafter at his or their lybertes and pleasures without the impediment loss or interruption of any personn or psonnes. In witness whereof we the Kinges of armes aforesayd have assigned these pnts with o^r handes and sett therunto o^r severall seales of Armes the VIIth of May 1569.

The original of this Grant was exhibited at the Society of Antiquaries on the 1st of April 1897. It is signed by the three Kings of Arms. The seals of Garter and Norroy remain, that of Clarenceux is lost. The Grant has a curious painted border with Tudor badges and flowers, and in the initial a figure of Garter pointing to the arms depicted in the margin. A docket, together with the above description, is printed in the Proceedings (Second Series, xvi., p. 351).

To all & singular as well Nobles and Gentlemen as others to whome these presents shall come, William Segar Kn^t Garter principall King of Armes of Englishmen, sendeth greeting in our Lord God everlasting whereas aunciently from the beginning the valiant and vertuous actes of worthy psons have bene comended to the world with sundry monuments & remembrances of their good deserts: Amongst which the cheifest & most vsuall hath bene the bearing of signes & tokens in sheilds comonly called Armes which are evident demonstracions of Prowes & valour diversly distributed according to the Qualities & deserts of the psons meryting the same: which Order as it was most prudently devised in the beginning to stir & kindle the heartes of men to the imytacōn of virtue and Nobleness even so hath the same bene & yet is contynually observed to the end that such as have done comendable se[r]vice to the Prince or Country either in warr or peace, might receave due hono^r in their Lyves & also derive the same successively to their posteritie after their deathes forever & to register & record them in the Office of Armes that vpon all occasions the Kinges & Heraldes of Armes who were instituted for the preservacōn of the Nobilitie & Gentry of this Kingedome might

make such exemplificacōn of them as should be requyred. In which respect George Wilmote of Letcombe in the County of Berks Esq, being touched with a care for the preservacōn of the memory of his auncestors hath had conference with me & by good & venerable prooffe hath made it appeere that divers monuments of his predecessors have suffred by the iniquitie of tyme, The brasse being so pulled away, as it is not extant what armes were insculped to demonstrate with whome they maryed, yet hath sufficiently manifested himselfe descended from very good auncestors: which vpon his request I have recorded in the Registers of my Office. And further he hath desired me to exemplifye vnto him his Armes and Crest with that difference that he & his postiritie may lawfully beare them without offence to the Lawes of Armes or any other of his name or kindred which accordingly I have done & in such maner as they are heere depicted in the margent soe are they heere described with the apt & pp termes of Blazon viz^t In a sheild Argent a fesse gules charged with an vnlicorne seiant and twoe flower deluces Or betwene three Eagles heades erased sable And for his Crest vpon a Helme and wreath of his Collours Argent and gules a demy ounce proper houlding a battaile Axe or, with mantells of gules doubled Argent which Armes & Crest & every part & poell thereof I the King of Armes afores^d by vertue of my Office of principall King of Armes of

Englishmen according as by the Originall institucōn thereof appeereth Doe by these p'sents approve exemplifye ratifye and confirme vnto the said George Wilmote and his posteritie vsing due differences for ever, And that he & they the Same may vse beare and shew forth in sheeld signett Hatchment pennon Coat Armor Trumpett banners & also vpon Jewells plate Glasse or any other way according to the Lawes of Armes or Lawdable customes of this Realme of England at his or their liberty and pleasure without the lett impediment or interupcōn of any pson or psons whatsoever In witnes whereof I have here vnto sett my hand & seale the tenth day of February Anno Domini 1627.

The first two references occur in C. 41, part 3, folio 9, MS. College of Arms. Mr. Hare may have been John Hare, who was successively Rouge Dragon and Richmond Herald. He died on the 14th of May 1720, aged 52.

The arms are not to be found in any of the Visitations of London. The note about the Grant having been made to Anne Yonge is an addition not given in C. 41, and I have been unable to verify it.
