October 8th 1899 Bp. Edwin Stratford of the 4th ward in the Weber Stake of Zion died at his home corner of 22nd and Jefferson Avé, Ogden, Utah.

At his death his counselors H. W. Gwilliam, and Hyrum Belnap were called upon to look after the ward afairs untill such times as anotherBishop should be chosen and set apart.

Sunday evening December 17th, 1899 at 6:30 President L. W. Shurtliff and counselors C.F. Middleton and N. C. Flygare met with the people of the 4th ward, this being the regular ward Edwin T. Wooley was presented by the President and meeting. unnamiously sustained as Bishop of the 4th ward.

January 28th, 1900 at the ward evening meeting President Shirtleff presented the names of H. W. Gwilliam as first and Hyrum Belnap as second Counselors to Bishop Edwin T. Wooley.

On the 4th day of February Apostle F. M. Lyman and the Presidency of the Stake met with the people. Apostle Lyman set Bishop Wooley apart and H. W. Gwilliam and Hyrum Belnap his Counselors. (note Henry W. Gwilliam first counselor)
