

Record OF HYRUM EARL BELNAP
(Hyrum Belnap now writing)

Born 18th July 1890 at 5:15 AM at the residence of Gilbert Belnap (grandfather) in Hooper, Weber County, Utah.

Blessed when eight days old by Hyrum Belnap his father. Afterward recorded on the Hooper records. (25th July 1890 day when blessed.

Baptized in the Church of Jesus Christ of Later day Saints, the 28th day of August 1898 in the 4th ward Weber Stake of Zion by Aaron Jackson. Confirmed by Hyrum Belnap same day.

Ordained a Deacon by Bp. E. T. Woolley 22nd day of Dec. 1902 in the same ward he was baptized in.

Ordained a Teacher Nov. 4, 1907 by H. W. Gwilliam (Henry W.) in Ogden Fourth Ward.

Ordained a Priest April 27, 1908 by Sylvester D. Bradford in Ogden Fourth Ward.

Ordained an Elder Sept or Oct 1910

Went on a mission to Germany and Hungary, left Ogden Oct 15, 1910. Returned July 22, 1913.

Went to Preston Idaho to work at the Preston Lumber Co. There July 1915. Remained there until Oct. 1917. Then he went to the University of Utah Salt Lake City. Took up the medical course.

February 1918 enlisted in Navical Medical Corps of the U. S. A. (Note: U. S. N. R. F.) Went to the Navil station San Pedro, California. Left Ogden March 31--Arrived there April 3 rd. Transferred to Section Naval Base, San Diego. Came home on a furlough, arrived in Ogden Aug. 9th, 1918 Returned the 17-inst.

Made rates Ph. M. 3 & 2 at San Diego. Transferred to Pharmacist's Mate School, Naval Operating Base, Hampton Rds. Va. Nov. 7, 1918, visiting on the way--Los Angeles, Salt Lake, Ogden, Denver, Kansas City, St. Louis, Cincinnati, Norfolk. Reporting at the station Nov. 18, 1918. Was then transferred to the U.S.S. Martha Washington (see diary) and sailed to New York with troops. Left N. Y. for France, spending Thanksgiving day and two following days at-sea (sea sick). Returned from Brest France Dec. 21 to Norfolk. Fransferred back to the school and placed on inactive status Feb. 26, 1919 and returned home.
