Married to Augusta Willhelmina Wallin in 1861 Oct., and joined the church in 1876 and came to Utah in 1877 lived part of the time in Grantsville, Logan, Smithfield and had resided in Ogden 40 years at time of death, which took place January 16 1920 at 6:40 o'clock Friday morning at his home 2636 Liberty Ave.

He was buried the 18 of Jan. 1920, services being held at the Fifth ward meeting house at 12:30 o'clock Sunday. Devotional prayer was offered by Frank Stratford.
