Also Lake street where the negroes live mostly, which we seen on our way to Garfield Park a most beautiful place, where we had our pictures taken. As it rained some we came home until meeting time we went to church at Logan Square, heard the choir from Milwaukee and enjoyed it quite well.

Monday the elewenth went to Marshal Fields the largest apartment store in the world, made a few purchases, it has so much in it and arranged so nicely its almost like going into an art gallery. Earl worked here one summer.

Next went to Jackson park rode on top of the bus wandered through some of the park which is a most lovely spot and close by is the University of Chicago with its many and large buildings and beautiful grounds. This day we also saw the University of Ill. the school Earl attended, then took supper and went home to rest.

Tuesday the twelfth took breakfast at the Virginia went to the station to fix our tickets for the return trip, next went to the Field Museum a very large and beautiful building all of marble, where we seen all kinds of stuffed animals and skeletons also of birds and fish and of monsters not upon the earth today, the natural history of almost every thing in existance. Took dinner at the Virginia then back to our room and rested.

Wednesday afternoon the 13th went to the Great North Western theater and witnessed the play called Blossom Time, a most wonderful play the acting and singing was superb, at night went down to see it lit up, it was some glitter.

There were many schools and hospitals in close proximity to the Cook County Hospital, it covers one whole block like ours, it's eight stories high in front and six in back, it has sixty six interns and several thousand beds. These Hospitals and schools are all large and substantial buildings.
