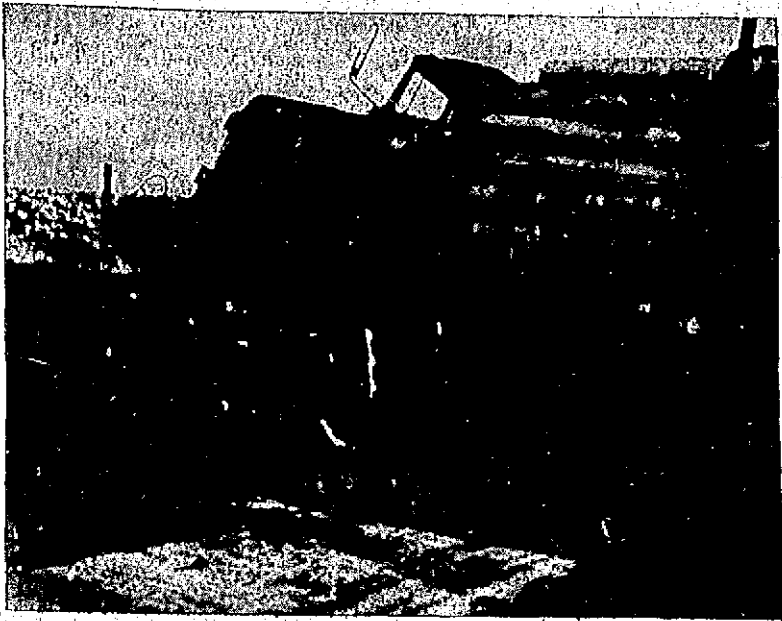


ALMOST HAS TRUCK IN LAP



FIFTEEN-YEAR-OLD Wayne Wells, Roberts, miraculously escaped injury when this 2-ton truck almost landed in his lap after it struck the tractor. Wells was driving about 6 miles north of Idaho Falls at 5:50 p. m. Thursday. C. B. Roberts, investigating state patrolman, said the truck, driven by Frank H. Barnes, 46, 188 Whittier St., struck the rear of the tractor as it was headed south, just south of the Osgood turnoff on U. S. Highway 91. The tractor was demolished, and about \$100 damage was done to the truck, Roberts said. Assisting in the investigation were B. J. Schum and Vance Hicks, state patrolmen.

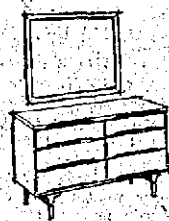

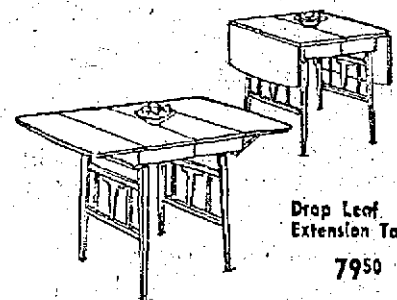
