Dear Brother,

On my arrival here I met Elders Cowley, Parkinson & Bills, the two former enroute to St. Louis, the latter returning home, having been released on account of poor health; in the afternoon Elders Snow and Hammond joined me, from Coffee Co. where they had been on a visit to Saints.

On the morning of the 2nd Elders Cowley, Parkinson & Bills left for the West, Elders Hammond and myself took train for Louisville, he continuing on to New York while I returned last night, and expect to start in the morning for St. Louis, I have been so delayed that I cannot say how far I can get West. Elder Snow is with me here, but goes to Lebanon to-morrow.

I enclose you blanks to make out for the Conference from 1st Mar to 31st Aug inclusive please send me a copy as soon as convenient.

I cannot say whether I will get back

in time to go out to Lebanon with you
or not. My blanks are still delayed but
I hope to get them before morning and
send you order.

Have a letter from Bro. Loampf, he still
talks of a release, but feels well, baptized
his relatives.

Say to Uncle Robins that I have
had no time to look up the matter he wanted
me to see too, but will on my return.
