The funeral services of John Charles Dalton, who on Friday last was crushed beneath the wheels of a wagon, took place shortly after five o'clock on Sunday evening, August 5, at the residence of the parents of the deceased. cortege. Deceased was born June 6, 1867, and not in 1866, as first reported.
