

# CHRISTENSEN LAID AT REST

## Two Funeral Services Held for Farmington Man

Funeral services for Arnold Christensen, who died as a result of exhaustion in the cloudburst at Farmington Monday night, were held Thursday at 11 o'clock at the home of his brother, A. C. Christensen in Farmington. Bishop A. L. Clark presided. The Farmington male quartet composed of A. L. Gregory, Heber, Leonard and Burdette Brimly, sang the following: "God Moves in a Mysterious Way," "Saviour Comfort Me," "Sleep Beloved." George Manning sang "My God and Father." "Let Us Speak Kind Words." The opening prayer was by Ezra F. Richards. The benediction was pronounced by J. L. Wood, the speakers were George G. Knowlton, Simon Bamberger, O. H. Hunter, O. P. Solo and Bishop Clark.

The body was then taken to Hooper where another service was held at 2 o'clock in the Hooper meeting house. The services were presided over by Counselor H. L. Rigby. The ward choir sang "All is Well," and "Nearer, My God, to Thee." Assisted by Charles Howles, the choir sang "Come to Me." Joseph O. Moore sang, "Face to Face" and George Manning sang, "Until the Dawn."

Invocation was by Bishop Clark and the benediction by George Shorten, the speakers were Frank Belnap, Bishop J. P. Beus, J. D. Hooper, O. P. Solo and Counselor Rigby. There was a very large attendance and an abundance of flowers. Interment was in the Hooper cemetery. The grave was dedicated by Bishop Thomas Reed.
