

Colleges to Compete In Judging Contests

College livestock judging contests, sponsored by Ogden Junior Chamber of Commerce, has grown to become one of the largest such activities in America held in conjunction with a stock show.

Most of the credit for this achievement goes to the Ogden Jaycees, who have been working with the college and university officials to support the program.

College judging takes place Friday, Nov. 10, starting at 8 a.m., with teams and individuals looking over large collections of stock to select what they consider to be outstanding exhibits.

The collegians must then explain the reasons for their choices, to professional judges of the show, who rate on ability. "The activity amounts to an extension course in

animal husbandry for the youthful judges," said Rudy Van Kampen, secretary-manager of the stock show.

A committee of nine Jaycees directed the promotional work this year. Gary McMahan is chairman. He is assisted by Tony Fisher, reasons chairman; Gordon Beckstead, banquet chairman; Cleve Wadcoups, publicity chairman; Gordon Belnap, accounting chairman; Jess Hunsaker, solicitation chairman; Tom Purdue, awards chairman; Pete Lakomski, correspondence, and Charles Lindquist, in charge for the board of directors.

Awards to teams, groups and individuals scoring highest in the competition will be made at the annual banquet Friday evening.

With several days remaining before the deadline to register, six colleges and universities had entered teams in the judging contests.

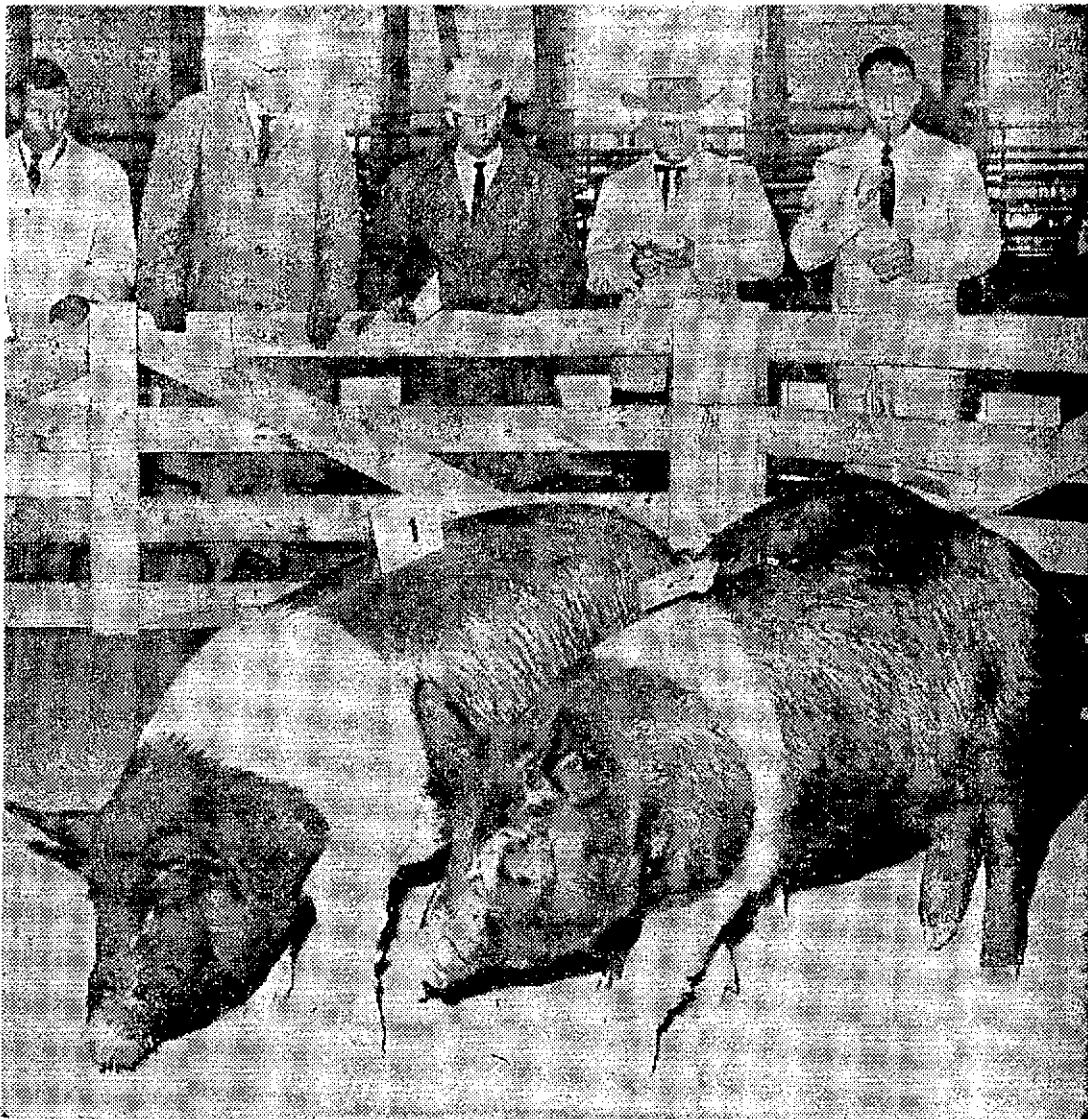

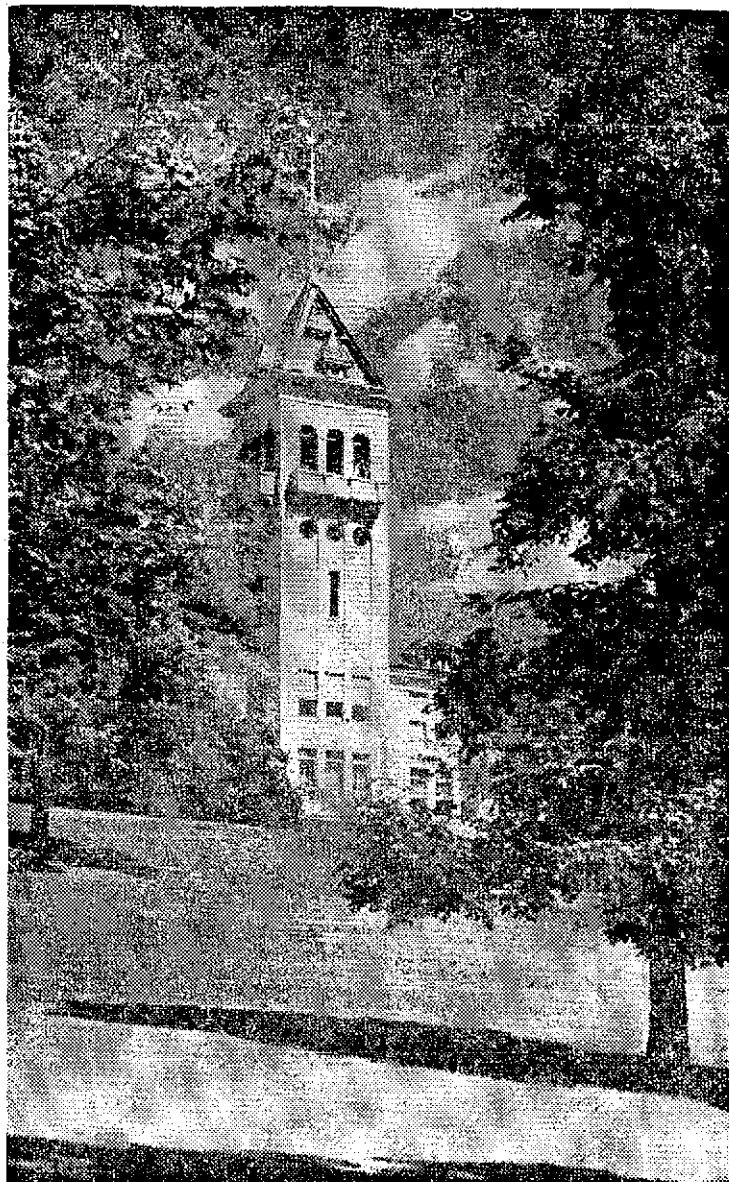
THREE SECTIONS FOR DAIRYMEN

Of major interest to local cattle owners is the purebred dairy section of the stock show, open to three of the popular dairy breeds.

Breeds recognized in the contests are Guernseys, Jerseys and Holstein-Friesians, the strains that can be seen on any pasture in Utah and Idaho farms.

Cash prizes total \$2,937 in this division, divided into sums of \$979 for each breed.

Judging of the dairy exhibits is scheduled to begin at 9 a.m. on Nov. 14. The top contests will be selection of the champion, senior and reserve champion animal in each of the breeds.
