

County Okays Layton Canal Road Contract

Weber County commissioners Monday approved a contract with the Bureau of Reclamation for roads crossing the Layton Canal in connection with the Weber Basin Project.

There will be 10 crossings with five bridges to be built by the Bureau of Reclamation over the new canal.

In other business commissioners personally praised Ellis Moncrief, the helicopter pilot who so effectively aided the sheriff and the Weber County Jeep Patrol during the recent 10-day search for lost hunters. They also authorized payment of \$500 for his time and the use of the helicopter, and further suggested that Sheriff LeRoy Hadley work out an agreement and terms for the helicopter if needed in further searches.

Also approved Monday was \$325 for travel expenses for two members of the Weber County extension service to attend important conferences.

Fay Boyer will accompany beef feeders and Young Farmers on a tour through Arizona and California. Maude Martin will go to the 4-H Congress in Chicago, where there will be about 30 Utah girls, including Da Nece Nevey of Huntsville, who won the state award of a free trip to the congress.
