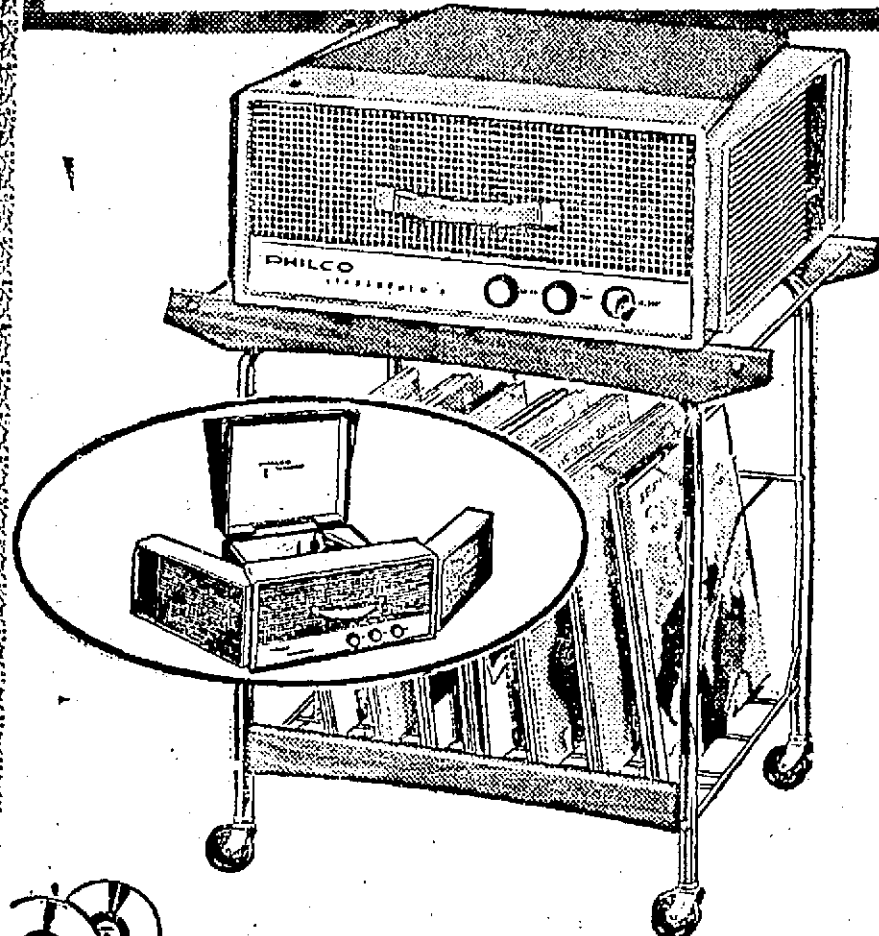

## WATER DISTRICT GETS FIRST CHECK FOR NORTH OGDEN DEVELOPMENT

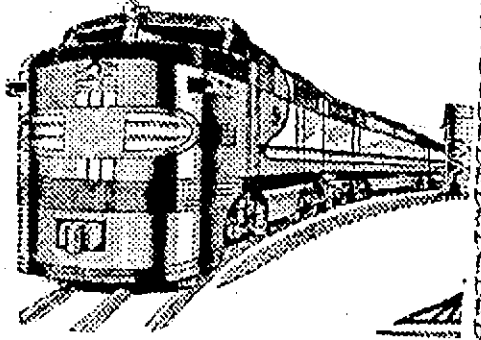
First payment has been received from the federal government for the new irrigation and culinary water development in the North Ogden area.

Edward Southwick of the Weber-Box Elder Conservation District said a check has been received for \$45,000 to cover engineering and design costs.

Mr. Southwick said bids will be called for shortly after the first of the year.

The project calls for three reservoirs in the foothills and pipelines to carry water to homes and farms east of Washington Boulevard from about 1900 North to 2600 North.
