

## 3 N. Ogden Councilmen Sworn; Tasks Assigned

NORTH OGDEN—Three re-elected members of the North Ogden City Council have been sworn into office and department assignments handed out for the current year by Mayor Calvin S. Chandler.

Taking the oath from Lettice Rich, city recorder, were: Wilbur Berrett, William Baily and Eldon Orton. All three were successful into their bids for four-year terms on the council.

The other two councilmen are Lowell Cutler and Wilbert P. Shupe.

In some cases, councilmen switched responsibilities, but some assignments stayed the same. A couple of council mem-

bers got added responsibilities. The assignments were as follows: Mayor Chandler, finance, budget, purchasing, personnel, public relations and inspection department.

Councilman Berrett, parks and recreation, land acquisition and the city's insurance program.

Councilman Cutler, public health and safety, civil defense and community activities.

Councilman Bailey, water department, planning board, subdivisions and annexation. Councilman Orton, streets and storm drains, city appearance and beautification. Councilman Shupe, public buildings and property and the sanitary sewer department.

## Deposits at New High, Banking Officials Told

New records in deposits, resources and loans were reported to Commercial Security Bank stockholders Tuesday.

Bank President Robert G. Hemingway said deposits increased \$2,415,000 during 1963 to a new high of \$53,587,000. Total resources at the end of 1963 were \$59,670,893, compared with \$56,866,967 at the end of 1962.

Loans at the end of 1963 totaled \$29,509,752, an increase of \$2,169,452 during the year, Mr. Hemingway reported.

Mr. Hemingway reported a net operating income of \$436,249 for the year, a gain of nine percent over 1962.

The report was made at the annual stockholders meeting held in the Commercial Security Bank.

Mr. Hemingway told stockholders the moderate increase in earnings was achieved in "the face of further substantial increases in operating expenses, particularly interest on savings and time deposits."

## Wildlife Film To Be Seen On Thursday

"Our Changing Heritage," an Audubon-wildlife film produced by Emerson Scott, of Carole, Mich., will be sponsored by Weber State College at the Moech Building, 2455 Jefferson, Thursday at 8 p.m.

Mr. Scott's film attempts to bring into focus the increasingly important problems of the usurpation by man of the natural "living space" of wildlife, said Dr. Orson Whitney Young, chairman of the series for the college.

The film takes the audience through the magnificent scenery of eastern Utah and southwestern Colorado as the camera follows thousands of sheep through the four seasons of the year.

The film tour begins in the spring in the sage brush and scrub oak covering the foothills of San Juan Mountains, through the counting corral in the summer, and into the colorful meadows along the Continental Divide.

The camera follows the sheep during the winter through the rugged desert country, and into the snowy ridges of the mountains, which conservationists feel have values worthy of preservation.

Mr. Scott will point out that much of this land is now privately owned, limiting its use by sheep and wildlife.
