Expressing confidence in today's youth, an Air Force general said Tuesday night America is not coming unglued or being dominated by the unpatriotic.

Lt. Gen. Albert P. Clark, superintendent of the Air Force Academy, spoke at a rousing, colorful patriotic banquet in the Weber State College Union Building.

### 300 ATTEND

The event was sponsored by the Ogden Lions Club for some 300

area Lions, their wives and guests and hopefully will become an annual affair, said club president Gordon L. Belnap.

A stirring musical pageant in tribute to the nation was presented by the Footprints, an Air Force ROTC unit from Brigham Young University, Bonneville High School Band set the tone of the evening with patriotic selections during the opening dinner hour.

"History offers the fact," said Gen. Clark, "that no nation survives when its leaders are produced in an overly permissive society."

He said the 7,000 cadets at the academy near Colorado Springs, Colo., "echo your patriotic resolution and commitment."

Gen. Clark called for a revitalization of the national spirit and the refurbishing of ideals that other nations try to emulate.

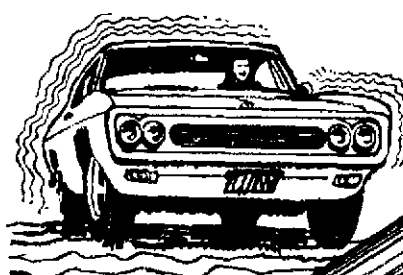
The Air Force academy, he said, is a special instrument of higher learning that produces Air Force officers dedicated to preserve peace and maintain the nation's security.
