Hospital Shows Profit in April

ROY -- Weber Memorial Hospital showed a profit during the month of April, the board of trustees have heard.

Karl S. Storey, certified public accountant for the hospital, said the excess of revenues over expenditures in April was \$9,816.

"This profit cut the hospital's loss so far this year to \$30,925," said Mr. Storey.

He attributed the profit to April being a "good" month and said he expected similar profits in May, June and July.

OVERCOME LOSS

He said he expected the hospital will overcome most of the loss by August, when it must pay three payrolls in a month.

In other business the board approved an amended budget which includes \$95,839 for wage increases to meet the new minimum wage law and about \$17,000 to go to increased costs.

These funds came from a room rates increase approved by the hospital in April.

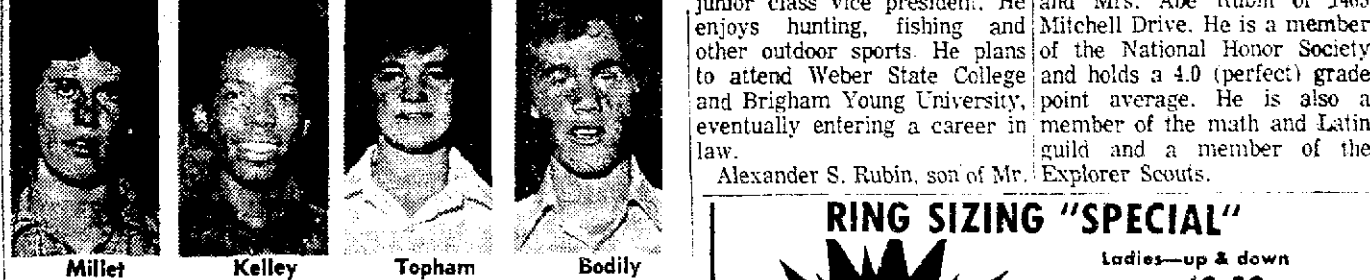
The board also approved a pay hike for administrator, George Goodell.

The increase will raise his salary to \$1,352 per month, said William E. Johnson, chairman of the board of trustees.

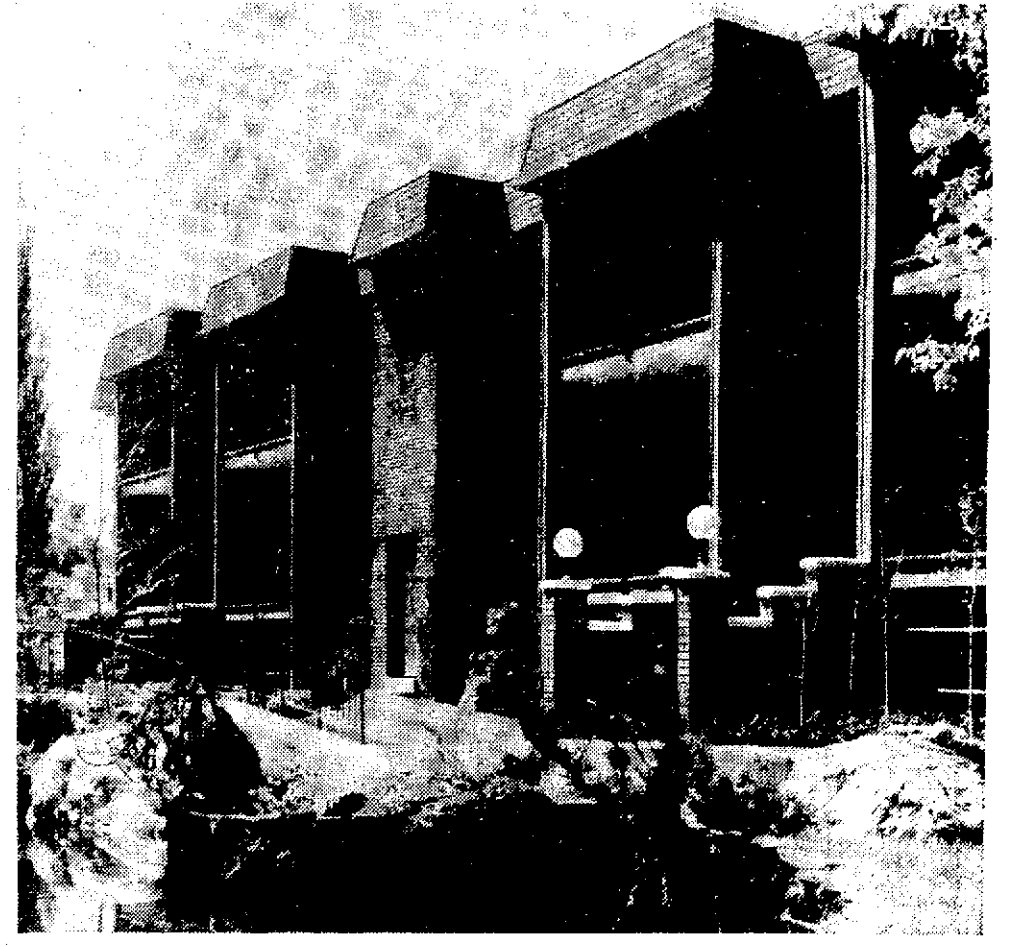

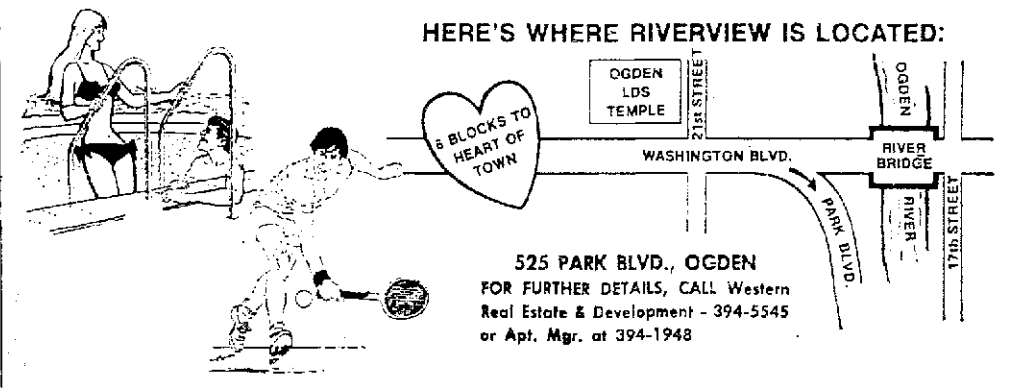
