## District Crime Board Wants to Add Worker

The District Two Community Crime Prevention Committee agreed Friday to seek funding for a part-time secretary to coordinate a crime prevention campaign in Weber, Morgan and Davis counties.

Committee members concurred that at least a part-time worker would be necessary in order to maintain program continuity and liaison between counties.

Still in the planning stages, the crime prevention effort will feature an informational approach designed to make the public aware of how they can help limit crime.

Among several alternatives being considered by the committee are the printing of pamphlets, placing advertising in electronic media, establishing of a film resources library, newspaper ads and linking into the Mass Media Resource Center at the University of Utah.

Committee members David Turner said he has "been approached by a grocers' representative about a state wide program to increase the severity of the shoplifting offense" as part of the committee's anti-crime activities.

"He suggested a mass awareness campaign in addition to increasing the civil liability for shoplifting to a minimum of \$100 and a maximum of \$200," Mr. Turner explained.
