The Arthritis Patient Education Class is a series of separate seminars developed by the Intermountain Medical Program and the Arthritis Foundation and the Division at the University of Utah.

The sessions will be limited to patients and their families. Persons interested in attending must contact St. Benedict's public relations department prior to April 15, to receive registration materials.

Classes have been scheduled for Wednesday, April 23 and 30, and 7 and 14 from 7 to 9 p.m. in the hospital's Mirror Room.

City Workers to Study Deferred Pay Program

A proposal that Mayor Roy Inaugurate a deferred compensation program for its employees has been referred to the city council.

The proposal was made by Mayor Fisher of the National Intermountain Life Insurance Co.

Mayor Fisher said the program would allow employees to "defer part of their income and get a tax write-off on it."

Mayor Fisher said, "If the program is approved, it would allow employees to put money into a trust fund earning a guaranteed 7 1/2 percent interest rate. After the first two years, the money would be paid out to the employee when he retires."
