Operated by the Weber County Association for Retarded Citizens (WCARC), the center will provide limited residential programs for the retarded.

Clients will be allowed to stay a maximum of 90 days but cannot stay less than three days. During that time, they will defray the cost of the service. work with staff trained in special skills required for working with various handicaps.

Both ambulatory and nonambulatory handicapped people will be accepted at the Crisis Assistance Center, including those people currently on medications.




