THE THAYER FAMILY OF THORNBURY

The interesting notices of the Tayer family entries in the parish of Thornbury, Gloucestershire, England, communicated by Walter Faxon, Esq., and Edward Henry Whorf, Esq., published with an introduction and notes by Henry Ernest Woods, A.M., in *The New England Historical and Genealogical Register*, seem to be enough for trying the reconstitution or, at least, for conjecturing its spread.

I. Generation.—The first member of this family settled in Thornbury must be undoubtedly Joh[an]es or perhaps Wilihelmus Tayer, or Tawier, born in the beginnings of the XVI. century, married about 1520 to 1530, one of the twenty-six tenants of the Manor in 1550, died 11 February 1561[-2].

II. Generation.—Johanes Tayer or Tawier, a god-father 1565-6-7-8-9, married to Mary [] Tawier [after married Cooke] a godmother 1557-60-61-63-65.

Thomas Tayer, father of Johanes Tayer, born in 1558, a godfather, 1557-58-59-60-62-67. Married to

Margarett [] Tawier a godmother 1560-63-64-74-83-86.

The buried entry of Mrs. Mary Tayer [after married Cooke] says: 20 April 1611. Mrs. Mary Cooke (whose sister [sic] in law was Thomas Tawyer, who died in anno 1593). In the burials of that year is only mentioned Margaret Tayer, possibly the wife of Thomas Tayer and to whom allude the entry quoted above. No other man of the surname Tayer appears in that time, thus it can be supposed that Thomas and John were brothers.

III. Generation.—It is likely that all the children born from 1558 to 1581 were sons of the foregoings. For to separate the two lines it has been made use of the facts that follow:

1st. Johanes Tayer, son and heir of Thomas Tayer born in 1558; that makes believe he was the primogenial of the said Thomas.

2nd. John Tayer's will, son of Mary Cooke and

brother of Thomas Tayer.

3rd. Impossibility that some of those children were brothers between them, by example, Johanes, born 6 May, 1561, and Cuthberta, born 1st September, 1561; Thomas, born 8 February, 1563-4 and Johanes, born 28 February, 1563-4; Richardus, born 6 May, 1565, with William, born 1st November, 1564, and Alice 10 December, 1565; Thomas, born 12 February, 1569-70, with Lucy, born 23 September, 1568, or with Ann born 13 August, 1570.

4th. Repetition of certain surnames in their godfathers. Separated the two lines it appears in John's the following: Richard and Lucy Baker,

Johanes, Johana, Eleonora Barton, Susan Birton, [Barton?], William Bruton [Barton?]; Richard and Joice Griffings; Johanes Jones (twice); Thomas and Johanes Moore; Humfridus and Elizabeth Whitfield, the same surnames are repeated afterwards in the baptisms of John's grandchildren, and yet in those of his great-grand children.

In Thomas's line: Richard Wilcox, three times; Agneta and Mary Tawier. It is not credible that this last was the godmother of her own child, whilst it is probable she has been it of a son of her brother-in-law.

Notwithstanding, it is not impossible it may have existed a third line, because it may be observed a very short time between the baptisms of John and Thomas 8 and 28 February, 1563-4, and those of Richard 2 August, 1562, or William, 1 November, 1564, which can be elucidated satisfactorily by that way, but as it has been said, there are not in the parish register of Thornbury any other man of this surname in that time, but the said Thomas and Johanes Tayer, failing, by consequence, the name of the primogenitor of this third line.

They had descendants: Thomas, Richard, John, and Edward Tayer, sons of John and Mary Tayer.

IV. Generation.—From this generation it is easy to know the children of each one: those of Thomas and John are enumerated in their own wills, adding only to the children of the last another two, died in the childhood.

Richard seems to have been married twice, the

first time (1) to An, who died 10 November, 1590, and soon after to [Dimery?] Of this last were sons Thomas and Richard, who emigrated to New England, William and several others. To identify them it has been used the same means as for the former, and principally the three next entries:

Burial, 15 March, 1606-7, John Taire, son of

Richard Taire.

Baptism, 15 March 1607-8, Agnes Taire, the daughter of Richard Taire.

Burial, 12 October, 1610, John Taire, son of Richard Taire.

Edward Tayer had also several children (2), but in his widow's will, dated 1656, are only mentioned two of them: John, and Anne, married to William Barton.

V. Generation.—A mistake in this generation is difficult. The children of Thomas and Richard are known in a great part, and also those of John, mentioned in the will of Sara [Mallett] Tayer, his widow, the others are of William, who married, 1625-6, to Mary Kelloway, whose relatives are named in six of her children's baptisms (3).

⁽¹⁾ This marriage is uncertain, but the error should be without significance because the four daughters born of it, died in the child-hood or unmarried.

⁽²⁾ Baptisms, 15 January, 1609-10, Thomas Tawyer, son of Edward Tawyer. Burial 11 February, 1609-10. Thomas Taire, son of Edward Taire.

⁽³⁾ They are doubtful: Elizabeth, daughter of Richard, born 1627, and Mary, daughter of Thomas, born 1630, because both are neither mentioned in the burials of Thornbury until 1645, nor in any record of New England, so far as known.

Any errors that may have suffered the anterior calculations, it seems established that the Tayer family of Thornbury is not prior to the 16th century. It is easy to suppose, consequently, that it shall proceed from the other family of this name that appears to be settled at Brockworth at least in the middle of the former century. In fact, though the oldest records that are known are later to 1541, they are enough to believe it so.

The first one is the will of Thomas Theyer the elder, dated 31 July, 1542, proved in 1543. Married twice: to and to Agnes, having of this last John, a minor in that year. No other children are mentioned neither in his own will nor in his wife's, dated 11 June, 1547. Nevertheless, that should not prove he should have no others, because in many wills of that age are only mentioned the heirs and legatees, omitting the others.

Will of Joan Theyer, widow (a sister-in-law of the aforegoing?) dated 19 March, 1545, proved 1546. Bequeaths to Robert, the elder, and to Robert, the younger (her grand children?) sons of John Theyer (her son?); to Joan (her granddaughter?), daughter of William Theyre, of Hucclecote (her son?) £ 6. Residue to son Thomas Theyer (the younger?).

Will of Walter Thayer, of Churchdown (son of Joan?) dated 11 August, 1558, proved the same year, he mentions William Theyer of Hucclecote (his brother?). Children: John, named in William Theyer's will, of Hucclecote (his uncle?); Margery, mentioned in Margery Theyer's will, the wife of Thomas Theyer, of Brockworth (her uncle?) and others.—

Grandchildren: John, born 1561, and several others.
John Theyer, of Brockworth. Will dated April 1561. Named in Joan Theyer's will (his mother?). Godfather of John (his nephew?) son of Walter Thayer, of Churchdown. Children: Robert the elder and Robert the younger, mentioned in Joan Theyer's will 1545 (their grandmother?). Grandchildren: Elizabeth, born 1560, and others.

William Theyer, of Hucclecote, will dated, 1571. Mentioned: in Joan Theyer's will (her mother?); in the will of Walter Thayer, of Churchdown (his brother?). He names John Theyer (his nephew?), son of the aforesaid Walter. Children: John, godson of John Theyer, of Brockworth (his uncle?); Joan, mentioned in Joan Theyer's will (her grandmother?); Katherine, mentioned in Katherine Thaire's will, 1568, the widow of Walter Thayer, of Churchdown (her uncle?), married to Richard Wost, who is named in the will of John Thayer, of Churchdown (his cousin?).

Thomas Theyer (the younger in 1542?). Will dated 16 November, 1583. Mentioned in his mother's will, 1545. Margery Thayer, his wife, in her will names Margery Thayre, daughter of Walter Thayer, of Churchdown (brother of the said Thomas?).

These four last are coetaneous with the founder of the family of Thornbury (the births of their grandchildren begin 1558 in Thornbury, and about 1560 those of Walter and John in Churchdown and Brockworth). Supposing that all were brothers and sons of Joan Theyer, or only germain cousins, the primogenitor of this family should be the father of

1+ her

Thomas Theyer the elder, who should live in the second middle of the 15th century, but if this assumption were inexact, the origin of this family

must be sought farther yet.

The root of the family name from "Taw" is likely attending to the early spelling of the name at Thornbury, but in the lines of Brockworth, Hucclecote, Churchdown, and others, the letter "h" was never silent (1), thus the omission must be considered as a peculiarity of those of Thornbury, and the names Theyer, Theyre and Thayer (2) being the most usual, as it can be seen in the next table (3), forms that is very difficult to derive from the root "taw."

⁽¹⁾ Nevertheless, it has not been made a special research with regard to the existence of the name "Tawier," in Brockworth in the 16th century, and that should be very interesting.

(2) The name Theyre prevails in the parrochial registers, Theyer in wills, and also, afterwards, Thayer in both sources.

The earliest mention of the name of Tayer in Thornbury is one of the twenty-six tenants who made presentment of the customs of the Manor in 1550. The circumstance that he signed with his surname makes believe he was the only one of that family settled there. It is probable this may be Joh[an]es Tawier, died 11 February, 1561-2. It is also presumable he was married to Constans or Johana Tawier (1), both died 19 March, 1561-2, and 4 May, 1576, respectively, and that their children were:

1) Willihelmus Tawier, 11 February, 1561, the

same day of his father's death.

2) Jone Tawier married to Thomas Jamys 15 November, 1553.

3) Johanes Tawier married before 1557 to Mary

] Tawier.

4) Thomas Tawier or Tayer, married prior to 1558 to Margaret [] Tawier or Tayer.

5) Constans Tawier married to Thomas Hold-

brook, 19 February, 1560-1.

6) Agneta Tawier or Tayer. A godmother 1560;

she died unmarried 5 May, 1571.

7) Alice Tawier or Tayer. A godmother, 1566, 1567; † 13 December 1586.

⁽¹⁾ Can these burial entries refer to his daughters Constans [Tawier), Holdbrook and Jone [Tawier] Jamys or shall they be of two sisters of him?

Abell Wheler of Thornbury and Jane [Tayer?] Wheller (1). He was in Boston, Mass., before 24 February 1639-40. Settled at Mount Wollaston (afterwards Braintree) Mass., where he died 2 June, 1665. Will dated 21 June, 1664.

1) Ursula Tayer, born 18 November, 1619. Godfather: Gyles Wheeler (her uncle). Godmothers: Ursula Tayer (her father's aunt), Secilly [Tayer] Davis (her father's cousin). † 13 December, 1619.
