 Appeared **Personally** *Edward Rigby a Doctor of Divinity in the County of Norfolk Clerk & Jane Carver (Wife of the Rev. William James Carver of Hauxton Hall near Norwich in the same County Clerk) and made Oath that they knew and were well acquainted with Henry Beevor formerly of Studbartho in the County of Norfolk but late of St. S. Clouster Torate Rogers Park in the County of Middlesex widow deceased for some time previous and to the time of her death & also with her will and manner & character of handwriting & subscription having frequently seen her write & also subscribed her name and having now viewed & carefully observed the paper writing therein annexed beginning thus "The plate in the box" and thus "The funeral to be conducted in the same manner & with the same brass &c." dated thus "Dec. 2nd 1835" and thus subscribed "Henry Beevor" they further made Oath that they do verily & in their consciences believe the said will to be of the proper handwriting and subscription of the said Henry Beevor widow deceased = *Edward Rigby Doctor = Jane Carver =* On the 20th day of August 1837 the said Rev. Edward Rigby Doctor and Jane Carver were duly sworn to the truth of this Affidavit by virtue of the annexed Commission before me = *Henry C. Long officiating Minister of the Parish of Swansthorpe being the adjoining Parish of Mungreen Hall situate in the Parish of Swardston in which Jane Carver one of the Deft. sives**

On the first September 1837 Admou (with the will annexed) of the Goods Chattels &c. of Henry Beevor formerly of Studbartho in the County of Norfolk but late of St. S. Clouster Torate Rogers Park in the County of Middlesex widow deceased was granted to Henry a Doctor (Wife of Frederick Adams Doctor Dec. 2nd 1835) the daughter & one of the Rev. William James Carver a named in the said will having been first sworn duly to Admou. &c. Executor being named in the said will //

Extracted from the Register of the Consistory Court of Durham

This is the last Will and Testament of us or of William Burn of South Shields in the County of Durham Gentleman I give bequeath and devocate unto John Turnbull of South Shields Merchant as and Executor Executors & assigns all my real & personal Estate whatsoever wheresoever and of which I may be possessed or upon trust to sell and convert the same into money and after payment of all my just debts funeral and testamentary expences to divide the residue thereof & share alike among my wife Elizabeth & Elizabeth his wife & all their children living at my decease (my nephew and his wife to take as one share) and I appoint the said John Turnbull sole Executor and Executor of this my last will and Testament and empower him to do all things which he shall think fit to do in my last will and Testament and hereby revoke all former Wills and Testaments made by me and do hereby give and bequeath unto the said John Turnbull the sum of one thousand eight hundred and twenty two = *William Burn* (Signed) & sealed as a public and solemn act by the said William Burn the Testator as also for the last will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence at his request and in the presence of each other have signed our names as Witnesses = *C.
