- 1. That there is no widow surviving the said Hyrum Belnap, deceased, and that your objector herein is the eldest surviving child of said deceased.
- 2. That the petition of Arias G. Belnap and Hyrum A. Belnap, for the appointment of themselves, as administrators with the will annexed of said estate, has not been consented to by this objector and, this objector is informed, by certain other members of the family.
- 3. That as between this objector and the said petitioners above named and other members of the family, there is a very fixed and definite difference of opinion as to the actual property rights involved in said estate, and as to the manner in which said estate should be handled and disposed of - for example: In that certain instrument signed by deceased, dated the 10th day of September 1927, it was provided that by reason of the deceased turning to his second family certain property that the members of the first family should have from said estate, before anything further was distributed to the second family the sum of \$16,500 should be

distributed to the members of the first family; that when said contract was drawn to carry out such provision the entire matter was made very uncertain by reason of the fact that the figures \$16,500 were used in one place and the figures \$15,600.00 were used in another; that your objector is informed and believes and therefore states the fact to be that the amount should be \$16,500.00; that your objector is also informed and believes, and therefore states the fact to be, that the two above named petitioners are of the opinion that the sum should be \$15,600.00.

- 4. That by reason of the fact that there are two families, and that certain advances have been made by deceased to different members of each family; that members of the second family disagree with Arias G. Belnap on property rights, this objector is of the opinion, and states the fact to be, that the two above named petitioners should not be named administrators with will annexed of said estate; but instead thereof that a corporate administrator with will annexed should be named administrator of said estate.
- 5. That it is the petition of the above objector that First Security Bank of Utah, at Ogden, Utah, be appointed administrator with will annexed, because in the opinion of this objector, it is for the best interests of said estate and the conservation thereof, and for each and every person interested in said estate that said First Security Bank of Utah be appointed administrator with will annexed of said estate.
- 6. That these objections and this petition are filed pursuant to Section 102-3-16, RSU 1933.

Dear Sir:

Soon after May 15th, I received from your court the three Record Books written almost wholly by my sister Flora Belnap. I should like to report that it seems impossible to finish copying them in the time alloted us, sixty days. I was unable to obtain persons to start work until one week after I received them. Since then I have had four people working constantly on them; one spending her entire time, and the three others from three to five hours a day. The copying is about hald through. The writing and notes added, are very close together and rather difficult to decipher, and so it has taken more time than matticipated. We find that in order to make the copy accurate, it must be carefully rechecked after it is finished, to verify it, and the index changed to surnames and standardized if it is to be understood by any one who is not acquainted with my sister's system. My husband, and daughter (a Salt Lake City school teacher), will be able to help me do this rechecking and indexing if it could be done after July 21st when the University of Utah Summer School ends. This would be very desirable because it would lesson the expense which is far above what I anticipated. We would greatly appreciate it if your honor allow us to continue work on these records until the court has need of them. We can get them to your court within twenty four hours of the time your honor may notify

We feel that in as much as a large amount of money has been spent to make copies of these records, their accuracry should be verified, and the index standardized. Some mistakes in deciphering have been made as it is now, and the index is partly in surnames, and partly in given names which is rather confusing at times.

Thanking you kindly and hoping you will allow us this privilege, I am

Comes now the State Tax Commission of the State of Utah and informs and petitions this Honorable Court as follows:

I.

That the State Tax Commission is a body politic created by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Utah and is charged with the duty, among other things, of administering the provisions of Chapter 12, Title 80, Revised Statutes, 1953, otherwise known as the Inheritance Tax Law, and of collecting all inheritance taxes due thereunder.

II.

That Hyrum Belnap died testate on or about the 18th day of September,

A. D., 1958; that at the time of his death, and for many years prior thereto, said
decedent was a resident of Weber County, State of Utah; that Arias G. Belnap has
been duly appointed as surviving Co-administrator with Will Annexed of the aboveentitled estate and is now serving in such capacity; that on or about the 5th day
of March, A. D., 1940, said Co-administrator with Will Annexed filed with this
Court an inheritance tax report and appraisement, listing certain property therein
as being subject to the Inheritance Tax Laws of the State of Utah, which property,
so listed, was duly appraised by the inheritance tax appraisers in and for Weber
County in the total sum of \$20,501.83.

III.

That said decedent, during his lifetime, to wit, the 31st day of December, 1931, transferred to his son, Hyrum A. Belnap, as trustee, four tracts of income-producing real property located in Weber County, State of Utah; that under the terms of said transfer to Hyrum A.Belnap, as trustee, the decedent reserved to himself the income on said property over and above the upkeep of the property and taxes thereon for and during the period of said decedent's lifetime; that said

transfor by said decedent to Hyrum A. Belnap, as trustee, was a transfer in trust for a corporation to be formed and to be known as the Hyrum Belnap Company, Incorporated, a Utah corporation; that thereafter, said corporation was duly formed and a charter issued to it by the State of Utah authorising it to issue capital stock to the extent of 250 shares; that Hyrum A. Belnap, as trustee, transferred to the corporation the legal title to said four pieces of income-producing real property situated in Weber County, State of Utah, reserving to said decedent, however, the net income from said parcels of property for and during the term of said decedent's natural life; that neither said corporation so formed nor any other corporation or person received any of the income from the said parcels of real property during the lifetime of the decedent other than the decedent himself; that during the year 1934, the charter of said corporation to do business in the State of Utah was revoked by reason of its failure to pay the corporation franchise license tax for the year 1933; that during said decedent's lifetime, said decedent collected the income from said parcels of real property and paid all taxes and expenses thereon; that said decedent caused 140 shares of the stock of said corporation to be issued to himself and further caused the remaining 110 shares of stock in said corporation to be issued in the names of the children of the decedent; that said children of the decedent so receiving said 110 shares of stock in the corporation paid no consideration for the shares of stock so issued to them.

IV.

That the State Tax Commission is informed and believes, and therefore alleges that the Hyrum Belnap Company, Incorporated, conducted no business as a corporation and did no acts as a corporation, except to take title to the real estate and to issue stock to the decedent and his children as aforesaid, and that the corporation kept no records of any description.

٧.

That the said transfer of the four parcels of real property by the decedent to the corporation through the trustee, with a reservation to the said decedent of the sole right to all of the net income from the said property during his lifetime, was and is a transfer intended to take effect in possession or emjoyment at or after the death of the trustor and, therefore, is subject to tax under Chapter 12, Title 80, Revised Statutes of Utah, 1933, and particularly Section 80-12-3 thereof; that notwithstanding the premises and despite numerous requests the said Co-administrator with Will Annexed of the above-entitled estate has failed and refused to include the full interest in said real property in the inheritance tax report and appraisement, claiming that inheritance taxes due to the State of Utah from the above-entitled estate should be based upon only 140/250 the interest in said real property.

VI.

WHEREFORE, YOUR PETITIONER PRAYS:

That the transfer and disposition of the said real property effected in the manner aforesaid was and is a transfer and disposition of property subject to tax under the provisions of Chapter 12, Title 80, Revised Statutes of Utah, 1933.

- l. That this Honorable Court enter its order adjudging the transfer by said decedent to said corporation through the trustee as aforesaid to be a taxable transfer under the provisions of Chapter 12, Title 80, Revised Statutes of Utah, 1935.
- 2. That the Co-administrator with Will Annexed be ordered to file a supplemental inventory including therein the 110/250ths interest in said real property which was omitted from the original inheritance tax report and appraisement heretofore filed and have said 110/250ths interest in said property appraised for inheritance tax purposes.
- 5. For such other and further relief as this Honorable Court may deem just and meet in the premises.


