

Fourth District Court.

Most all of yesterday before Judge Miner was occupied in finishing the case of the People, etc., vs. James Wangsgaard. The defendant finished his testimony and there were examined for the defense, Elisba Wilber, Joseph Belnap, Lars Nelson, C. H. Forbes, Jacob Beeston and James N. Kimball, all of whom testified either to the transaction or to the good reputation of the accused. The case was ably argued, Judge W. L. Magionis for the prosecution and Judge L. R. Rhodes for the defense. The jury deliberated about an hour and a half when they returned a verdict of not guilty.

The case of the People, etc., vs. Robert Adams, charged with rape, was next put on trial, and occupied nearly all of the remainder of the day. A jury was partly obtained when court adjourned. Adams is charged with having raped an old lady about 75 years of age.

The case of the People vs. Martin Tribbey came up on a demurrer to the last two counts of the indictment charging forgery. The demurrer was sustained.

The case of the People vs. A. Waldram was continued for the term.

A complaint in intervention was allowed in the case of Melinda Rawson vs. Mary Ann Rawson et al.

George Wilson was discharged from further jury service during the term.

Under an order for an open venire for three jurors, A. J. Chamberlain, W. C. Howell and A. Y. Ross were summoned.
