OGDEN (AP) — A federal court jury found former Commercial Security Bank Vice President Gordon Belnap of Ogden guilty on one county of misappropriating bank funds and innocent on another Friday night.

The verdict came after four hours of deliberation. Sentencing was set for Dec. 15 in U.S. Dis-trict Court in Salt Lake

The jury found Belnap innocent of embezzling \$13,200 but found him guilty of depositing in his own account a \$5,000 cashier's check from Commercial Security made out to a bank in Pennsylvania.

The maximum sentence for the conviction is five years in prison and a \$5,000 fine.

Belnap said following the guilty portion of the yerdiet, "It certainly is not true." He said he would have to consult his lawyers before decising on an appeal.
