

Preface.

This Volume is a copy of Harleian MS. 1534 in the British Museum. In the Catalogue it is entitled—

- "An Heraldical Book in fol., written & tricked by Mr Richard Mundy, containing:—
 - "1. An Alphabetical Table of Surnames referring to the following Pedigrees. At the beginning.
 - "2. The Visitation of the County of Cambridge, made in Anno 1575 by Robert Cooke, Clarenceulx.
 - "3. Continued & enlarged with the Visitation of the same County, made by Henery St George, Richmond-Herald, Marshall & Deputy to William Camden, Clarenceulx, in Anno 1619.
 - "Other observables in this Book may be-
 - "4. Atchievement of the Towne and Borough of Cambridge.
 - "5. Les Armes des Professors del Universite de Cambrydg; as purchased by Dr. Lorkin.
 - "6. Some Proofs from Evidences & Seals touching the Family of Colvile.
 - "7. The Crest of Creeke, prettily painted.
 - "8. The Armes & Crest of Millescent, painted.
 - "9. Arms of some few Cambridge-Shire Gentry, tricked in printed Escocheons.
 - " As to the Additions & Continuations-
 - "10. M' Munday writeth in the Titles that he hath added many Descents to the former Visitations.
 - "11. In like manner he hath made Additions to particular Descents; as 20^b, 21, 26^b, 39, 43^b, 55^b, 58^b, 85^b, etc.
 - "12. So hath Mr Robert Dale, Suffolk-Herald Extraordinary; 4, 15^b, etc., 24^b, 30, 64. And so have others; as at 5^b, 6, 6^b, 25^b, 40, 41, 141^b, etc."

The MS. 1534 has been compared with Harleian MS. 1401, and with a copy formerly belonging to Sir Thomas Phillipps, Bart., containing a few of his notes, which have also been added. The description of Harleian MS. 1401 in the Museum Catalogue is as under—

- "An Heraldical Book in fol., wherein are contained: -
 - "1. A Copie of the Visitation-book of Cambridgeshire, as the same was made & taken by Henry St George, Richmond, for William Camden, Clarenceux, A.D. 1619.

- "Observables in this Copie (besides the omission of the Extracts from the antient Evidences, etc.), are—
 - "2. The Omission of the Arms of the several Families: for what are now done in the book are of the hand of John Saunders, who tricked some with his Pen; traced out others with his black Lead, & omitted the rest.
 - "3. A Leaf of the original Visitation-book, as I take it to be, containing the Descents of Baron & of Harris; subscribed by John Baron & William Harris.
 - "4. Alphabetical Table containing the Surnames of these Families, whose Descents are herein entred. At the end."

There are several other copies in the Museum, but they chiefly contain the Visitation of 1619, so that the one now printed, Harleian MS. 1534, is much the best.

Harleian MS. 1043. "The Visitation of the County of Cambridge, as taken A.D. 1619 by Henry S^t George, Richmond, for William Camden, Clarencieux, with some additions. Another Table to the Visitation of Cambridge, more accurate than the other mentioned above."

Harleian MS. 6769. "A Folio in the handwriting of M^r Humphry Wanley, containing the Visitation of Cambridgeshire 1619, 75 pages, and an Index."

Harleian MS. 6770. "A Folio containing the Visitation of Cambridgeshire, A.D. 1619, written by a different hand, 149 pages, besides an index. These two are bound together."

Add. MS. 4962. "The Visitation of Cambridgeshire, taken by Henry S' George, Richmond-Herald of Armes, in 1619."

Add. MS. 16,940. "Visitation of Cambridgeshire 1570—1590."

At the Heraldic Exhibition held by the Society of Antiquaries at Burlington House in 1894, there was exhibited the original Grant of the Arms granted to the five Regius Professors in the University of Cambridge by Robert Cooke 13 November 1590.* Through the kindness of Mr. J. W. Clark, F.S.A., the University Registrar, these Arms have been reproduced as a Frontispiece to this Volume.

The Towne & Borough of Cambridg.

ARMS.—Gules, on a fess arched and masoned three towers or; in chief a fleur-de-lys of the second between two roses argent; in base a river proper, thereon three ships of the last each with one mast, rigged on either side, at head a flag flying of the third.

SUPPORTER.—On sinister side only a sea-horse rampant argent, maned or.

CREST.—On a helmet mantling with narrow wreath a mount vert, thereon a quadrangular castle with four domed towers argent, in front two portals.

Les Armes des Professors dell Universities des Cambridg.

[Compared with the account given in the Stowe MSS. 729, fol. 32, by one Baker to Anstis, Garter, Principal King of Arms, taken by him from the Universitye Archives of 1590, given and signed by Robert Cooke, Clarencieuls.] Variations denoted thus—[].

Devoinitie. ARMS.—Gules, on a cross ermine between four doves (argent) a Booke of the first [leaves gold clasped], charged with the Greek letter Theta Θ [sable].

CREST.—[On a helm] a wreath gules and argent a dove volant of the second, an olive-branch vert in beak [manifed gules, doubled argent].

Lawe. ARMS.—Purpure, a cross moline or. On a chief gules a lion passant-gardant of the second, charged on the side with the letter L [sable].

CREST.—[On a helm] a wreath purpure and or, thereon a Bee volant of the second [mantled gules, doubled argent].

B

Physick. ARMS.—Azure, a fess ermines between three lozenges or. On a chief [gules] a lion passant of the second.

CREST.—On a helm a wreath azure and or, thereon a quinquangle sable [argent], [called simbolum sanitatis] [mantled gules, doubled argent].

Hebrew. ARMS.—Argent, the Hebrew Letter \(\backslash tawe sable. On a chief gules a lyon passant or, charged with the letter H sable.

CREST.—[On a helm] a wreath argent and sable, thereon a turtle-dove of the first [azure] [mantled gules, doubled silver].

Greeke. ARMS.—Argent and sable party per chevron.

In the first two Greek letters A alpha & Ω omega of the second. In the second an Eicade or grasshopper of the first. On a chief [gules] a lion passant [or] charged on the side with the letter G [sable].


CREST.—On a helm a wreath argent and sable, thereon an owl of the first, beaked, legged, and eared or [mantled gules, doubled argent].

Thees armes wer invented and purchased by Docter Lock, a Lat poplyck professor of phisick in the university of Cambridg.

ARMS.—Quarterly of ten: 1, Sable, a cross engrailed or; in the first quarter a mullet argent, Payton; 2, Argent, three piles wavy gules, Gernon; 3, Or, a chevron gules, on a chief three mullets pierced, Sutton; 4, Argent, a bear rampant sable, muzzled or, Bernard; 5, Gules, three fishes naijant argent, within a bordure engrailed of the second, Lilling; 6, Argent, a demilion rampant gules; 7, Argent, a cross flory sable, mullet of the first, Haselden; 8, Sable, three Danish axes argent, Dennis; 9, Gules, a lion rampant or, and label azure, Colvile; 10, Gules, a lion rampant or, collared azure, Malory.







ARMS.—Quarterly of nine: 1, Or, a fess chequy azure and argent, on an escutcheon of the third a lion rampant gules, debruised by a baston raguly or, STEWARD; 2, Vert, three boars' heads couped argent, BORELEY; 3, Argent, a lion rampant sable, on the shoulder a mullet or, WALKFARE; 4, Argent, a chevron gules between three hurts, BASKERVILLE; 5, Per pale gules and sable, a lion rampant argent, crowned or, on the shoulder a crescent of the second, BESTNEY; 6, Argent, a cross fleury sable between four martlets of the second, SPENLOW; 7, Vert, three lions passant or, mullet of the last, FITZGEFFREY; 8, Azure, a chevron ermine between three leopards' heads or, BLACKNEY; 9, Argent, a lion rampant-guardant sable within a bordure engrailed of the second, BERUEN.

Rules.

- 1. This Society shall be called the HARLEIAN SOCIETY.
- 2. It shall have for its chief object the publication of the Heraldic Visitations of Counties, and any manuscripts relating to Genealogy, Family History, and Heraldry, selected by the Council.
- 3. The Council shall consist of a President, nine Vice-Presidents, and twelve Members of Council, two of whom shall hold the posts of Secretary and Treasurer; and any four, including the Treasurer or Secretary, shall form a quorum. In case of equality of votes, the Chairman to have a casting vote. Any Candidate may be elected with the consent in writing of one Member of the Council, the Treasurer, and the Secretary.
- 4. Three Members of the Council shall retire in rotation annually, but shall be eligible for re-election.
- 5. The Annual Subscription shall be One Guinea, paid in advance, and due on the 1st day of January in each year; and new Members shall pay an Entrance Fee of 10s. 6d. in addition to their first Annual Subscription.
- 6. Members may at their option subscribe Two Guineas per annum, in which case they will be entitled to the publications of the Register Section of the Society.
- 7. The funds raised by the Society shall be expended in publishing such works as are selected by the Council; but no payment in money shall be made to any person for editing any work for the Society.
 - 8. One volume at least shall be supplied to the Members every year.
- 9. An Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of January every year, at such time and place as the Council may direct; and due notice shall be sent to the Members of the Society at least a fortnight previously.
- 10. No work shall be supplied to any Member unless his Subscription for the year be paid; and any Member not having paid his Subscription for two years, having received notice thereof, shall cease to belong to the Society.
- 11. No copies of the publications of the Society shall be supplied to persons not actually Members, and each Member shall be restricted to a single Subscription.
- 12. An account of the receipts and expenses of the Society to be made up to the 31st of December in each year, and published with a list of the Members and the Rules of the Society in the following Volume.
- 13. These Rules shall not be altered except at the Annual Meeting, and three clear weeks' notice must be given to the Secretary of any such intended alteration.

Report for the Pear 1896.

THE Council have to report that, since the Annual Meeting last year, ten new Members have joined the Society, of whom three have joined the Register Section. Two Members have also joined the Register Section.

During the same period the Society has lost eight Members (of whom three belonged to the Register Section) by death; seven Members (of whom five belonged to the Register Section) have resigned; five Members have discontinued their subscriptions to the Register Section, and the names of seven Members (of whom three belonged to the Register Section) have been removed under Rule X.

The number of Members now on the Roll is three hundred and forty-four, of whom one hundred and eighty-six are Subscribers to the Register Section.

The Fourth Volume, with Index, of Hunter's "Familiae Minorum Gentium," edited by Mr. J. W. CLAY, F.S.A., has been issued to the Members as the Publication for 1896.

The "Visitations of Cambridgeshire in 1575 and 1619" are in the Press, and will be issued as the Publication for 1897.

In the Register Section the Third Volume of "Marriages in the Parish of St. George, Hanover Square," from 1810 to 1823 inclusive, is ready, and will be issued in a few days as the Publication for 1896.

The "Registers of Durham Cathedral," fully annotated from the MS. of the late Captain E. A. White, F.S.A., are in a forward state, and will be issued to the Subscribers to this Section for 1897.

The Members of the Council who retire by rotation at the Annual Meeting are Mr. CLAY, Mr. ARMYTAGE, and Dr. HOWARD.
