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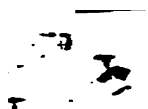

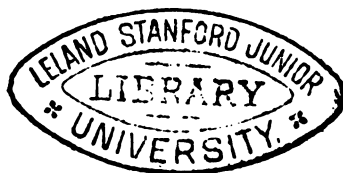

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PREFACE.

IT has frequently been said that the Camden Society have done nothing for the memory of Camden as a Herald. Camden, in reality, did but little, in that capacity, for himself; all his Visitations, as a King of Arms, were made by deputy.

It was in 1575, by the interest of Dr. Gabriel Goodman, Dean of Westminster, that Camden obtained the place of Second Master of Westminster School. In March 1592-3 he became the Head-Master. His spare hours and his holidays, in the earlier part of his career, were devoted to the production of his "*Britannia*," which first appeared in 1586. The duties of the School engrossed the rest of his time.

Although attacked by successive and painful illnesses, he published, in 1597, his Greek Grammar, entitled, "*Grammatices Græcæ Institutio Compendiaria, in usum Regiæ Scholæ Westmonasteriensis*," 8vo. London. Dr. Grant, his immediate predecessor, had composed one before him, but Camden thought it deficient and inconvenient. Wood says, Camden contracted it.

Gough, in the *Life of Camden* prefixed to his English edition of the *Britannia*, 1789, says, "At this time he probably entertained no thoughts of quitting a post in which he was universally esteemed and respected. He refused the place of Master of Requests, offered him probably by Lord Treasurer Burghley. But before the end of the year he quitted it for one in the Heralds' College.

Richard Lee, Clarencieux King at Arms, dying September 23d, Sir Fulk Greville, Mr. Camden's intimate friend, solicited that office for him; which the Queen immediately granted. But, because it was not usual for a person to rise to that dignity without having first been a Herald, he was October 22d created Richmond Herald, and the next day Clarenceux. Bishop Gibson remarks "that Lord Burghley was offended with Mr. Camden for obtaining this preferment by any other interest than his; but, on Mr. Camden's representing it to be the free thought of Sir Fulk Greville, he was reconciled to him, and continued his patronage during the remainder of his life."

The Commission for Visitation granted to William Camden, Esq. Clarenceux, was dated 5th Aug. 1 Jac. I.

In virtue of the powers vested in him under this Commission he caused the following Counties to be visited by his several *Marshals* and *Deputies*.

In June 1619 Camden had a dispute with his brother Kings, Garter and Norroy, about the appointment of his Deputies to visit for him, which, though founded partly on a mistake, did not prevent their complaining to the Commissioners for executing the office of Earl Marshal. He vindicated himself in his answer to the Earl of Arundel, and the matter, says Gough, seems to have ended here.

Smith, in “*Gulielmi Camdeni et illustrium Virorum ad G. Camdenum Epistolæ*,” 4° Lond. 1691, has printed three Letters relating to this dispute, which are here given according to their dates.

1.

“*G. Camdenus D. D. G. Segaro et R. San Georgio.*”

Right worshipful Sirs,

You are misinformed that I have granted a Commission to Mr. Vincent for the Visitation of Lincolnshire: it was never motioned to me but once, and that incidently. I neither know, neither have heard, that his proceedings have distasted the Lords, or grieved the Gentry of those parts: but I have heard him commended by divers for his good carriage and skill. Verily to Mr. Philipot I have granted a Commission for Kent, induced thereunto by the desire and commendation of many Knights, yea Deputy-Lieutenants and Gentlemen of especial note in that County, under their hands, which shall be produced. I, remaining in this county this Vacation, will be a Supervisor of his Visitation, which he hath already begun. I hope you think it not befitting, that I should offer Deputations to any not desiring the same. I never denied any of their Superiors that desired

me: yea my offers to some of them for Gloucestershire, Surrey, and Cambridgeshire, without capitulation of profit, have been refused. So God love my soul, as I have tendred the general good of the Office, which they that drew the letter, if they will inwardly enter into themselves, I trust you will acknowledge, and in that resolution I will continue; desiring you not to impeach me in the execution of my place, who never intermeddled with yours; beseeching the Almighty to bless us all with the Spirit of Unity and Christian Charity.

" G. Camulenus illustrissimo viro Thomæ Comiti Arundeliæ.

Right honourable and my very good Lord,

I received the 6th of this instant a letter from Mr. Wilson in your Lordship's name, and the rest of the Commissioners for the office of the Earl Marshal, commanding me to stay John Philpot from proceeding in the deputation which I gave him for the County of Kent: whereupon I accordingly sent my servant to seek him and stay him. I perceive that suggestions are made against him and me. For him, verily I deputed him half a year since, at the desire and commendations of sundry Knights and Gentlemen of especial note in that County under their hands; not knowing any other so able and skilful for that employment; since which time I have heard no exception taken against him till now. As for me, I thank God I have done nothing but that which is justifiable. Whether I have or no, and whether these Informers against me have to intermeddle in these matters, I beseech you to take into your consideration these points granted to me by His Majesty's Letters Patents:

' His Majesty hath appointed William Camden Clarenceur King of Arms in the East, West, and South parts of the Realm of England, to visit the said Province, and the parts thereof, from time to time, as

often and when he shall think most necessary and convenient, and to appoint his Deputy or Deputies, Attorney or Attornies.

‘ And further, His Highness does straitly charge and command, that no other person or persons shall intromit or meddle with any thing or things touching or concerning the office of Arms without special licence and authority of the said Clarenceux, in writing under the seal of the said office, first had and obtained from the said Clarenceux. All the which power, pre-eminence, jurisdiction, his Highness, for himself, his heirs and successors, does give and grant to the said WILLIAM CAMDEN, during his natural life, in as ample manner and form as any his predecessors have or had, with all manner of profits thereto belonging,’ &c.

Hereby your Honour seeing what is granted to me, and what is prohibited to the Informers against me, I doubt not but you, whom I know to be truly honourable, just, and judicious, will countenance this my authority, grounded upon His Majesty’s grant, and not suffer it to be insulted upon: but permit my Deputy to proceed in the Visitation, and me to enjoy the benefit of His Majesty’s grant as peaceably as other his subjects and servants do. “ To Mr. John Wilson, Secretary to the Earl of Arundel.

Sir,

I received not long since from You a Petition exhibited against me, *sine die, sine Consule, et sine nomine*, and withal a letter in my Lord’s name, whereunto I sent his Honour an answer, and I doubt not but I have satisfied him, and assure myself, that he will permit me to use the benefit of His Majesties grant as peaceably as other

His Majesties subjects and servants do. I thank you for your favour to my Deputy M. Philipot, whom in this employment I will supervise, and desire you rather to countenance him, than to suffer any affront to be given to His Majesty's Great Seal.

In Camden's "Annales ab anno 1603 ad annum 1623," subjoined to Smith's Latin life of him, the following short memoranda, pp. 46, 47, relate to this dispute.

It is probable that the following Letter, of a little later date as to Month, the original of which is preserved in the Cottonian MS. Faustina E. i. fol. 11, relates to the same contention. It is addressed, "To my very lovinge Friend Mr. St. George, at the Office of Armes &c."

"It hath been brymly tould mee from the mouth of our honorable Earle Marshall, that my office of Clarenceux is conferred and invested upon Mr. Kniveton (or) Mr. Boulton, or some other, not for any fault committed by mee, but by you Mr. St. George or Mr. Philpott. I pray you confess ingeniously wherin you have offended, that I may not bee punnished for your delinquency, for they purpose to leave mee £600 presently, and an hundred mark a yeere.

I pray you come unto mee if you can possible to informe me of the verity of this matter, for you best can, and soe I rest

The shaken signature, which is all of this Letter that is in Camden's own hand, seems as if it had been written in a later year than 1619. It is clear, however, that the attempt to injure Camden failed, for Philipot, as has been shewn, visited Kent in 1619, Hants in 1622, and Berks in 1623. St. George visited Devon and Cornwall in 1620; Wilts, Dorset, and Somerset, in 1623. So that there were no substantial grounds for complaint against Camden. The passage in this Letter regarding £600 is unintelligible. Camden's Patent was never revoked; and he died Clarenceux, Nov. 9th, 1623:^a nor were Kniveton or Boulton Officers of Arms at any time.

" William Camden, Esquier, al's Clarenceux King of Armes of the east, west, and south parts of the kingdome of England, on this side the riuer of Trent southward, being a batcheler, departed this mortall life at Chiselhurst, in Kent, the ixth daye of November, 1623, being Sundaye, in the morning about 4 or 5 of the clock, and was from thence conveyed to Westminster; his funerall was worshipfully solemnized according to his degree on Wensdaye the xixth of the same moneth, in manner following, that is:—

first proceeded 26 poore men in gownes, then gentlemen in cloaks, then esquiers, then knights; Sir Henry Bouchier, Knight; Sir Francis Lee, Knight of the Bath; and Sir Robert Cotton, Knight and Baronett; then Mr. Docter Heather, being his executor, and Mr. Docter Sutton, preacher at this funerall; next, after the Penon, Phillip Holland, Porteuillis, and Augustyn Vincent, Rouge Croix, with their coats on their armes; the Penon borne by Mr. Wyat, his kinseman; his hearme and creast by John Phillipot, Rouge Dragon; his coate of armes by Samuell Thompson, Windsor Herauld. On his corps, on the pall of black veluet, was placed the King's rich coate of armes, with his coronett with which he was crowned at his creac'on, the pall

NICHOLAS CHARLES, Blanch Lyon Pursuivant, was appointed Lancaster Herald by Patent, dated 17th Nov. 1608, and created with ceremony on the 21st April following. He was a skilful and judicious officer, and it is said "worthily filled his place."^b He accompanied Sir Richard St. George, Norroy, in his Visitation of Derbyshire in 1611, and was afterwards appointed by Camden his Deputy to take that of Huntingdon. His career though short was useful and industrious.^c He died 19th November 1613, leaving a widow, Penelope, daughter of Sir William Seagar, Garter, who remarried Timothy Cartwright, of Washborne, in the county of Glou-

beinge supported by Sampson Lennard, Blew mantle; Henry Chitting, Chester; Henry St. George, Richmond; and William Penson, Lancaster, Heralds: next the body followed Sir William Segar, Garter, Knight, principall Kinge of Armes; his two assistants, Sir Richard St. Georg, Knight, Norroy Kinge of Armes, and Robert Treswell, Somersett Herald. After them he was accompanied with dyuers noblemen—as the right honourable the Lord Keeper, then Byshop of Lincolne; the Earle of Leic'; the Viscounte Graundison; the Bishop of London; the Bishopp of Winchester; the Bishop of Durham, with other Byshops; the Lord Paget; the Lord Cary; and many more barons, knights, esquiers, and gentlemen. This certificate was taken by William Penson, Lancaster, and the truth thereof testified by Doctor Heather, executor to the defunct, by subscribe'on of his name.

"S^r.

Not knowing how I may deserve that love and courtesie you have allwayes afforded me, yet still presuming upon your favour, I have made bould to acquaynt you with such newes as our City is filled with. And first the Lord Bruse is certeynly alayne by M^r Sackville, in the feilds without Andwerpe in Brabant, and Sackville himself sore wounded. Also my Lo. Harington died within twoo dayes journey of Hidelberg, and a gentleman of his, a brother to S^r Edward Bushell, very treacherously killed by the meanes of S^r Andrew Keth, master of the horse to the lady Elizabeth. But Keyth is in hould to be sent over into England. There is also a quarrell betweene my Lo: of Essex and M^r Harry Howard, and one of them is gotten over. But there are Letters sent to the Archduke and the French King to prevent theyre desperate proceedings. There is also a talke of a quarrell betweene my Lo. of Rutland and my Lord Danvers, as also of other Noble and gentlemen

cester, and was mother, Noble states,^d of Thomas Cartwright, the architect who was employed to build the Royal Exchange.

Charles's Manuscripts are said by Anstis to have been purchased by Camden, and if so, they were no doubt dispersed with Camden's Collections.^e

of good quality, but I think the truth of some few have given occasion to some idle brayne to coyne others, and fill the world with rumors of Duello.

My L^o. of Bedford they say is very sick. But my L^o. Petre is not yet dead, but in great danger; and amongst the rest to fill up the mouth of mortality S^r James Pemberton, our late Mayor of London, on Thursday morning last gave up the ghost. Thus desiring your pardon for my boldnesse, remembring my thanks to M^r Tho^s Cotton, and Mistris Cotton, and Mr. Bevill, I take my leave; from my howse in Colman Streete, London, this 10 day of September, A^o. Dom. 1613.

^e There is in the Library of the College of Arms a quarto Volume of Pedigrees in his own hand, interspersed with Drawings of Arms and Seals, in which some few descents have been introduced in another hand, and probably that of William Booth, judging from an autograph at the beginning of the MS. "Wm. Booth, of Wetton, his book, 1660."

The Lansdowne MS. 874, in the British Museum, contains a large and curious Collection of Epitaphs and Arms in many of the Churches in London, and other parts of England, begun by Nich. Charles in 1610, and continued by Sir Henry St. George, Clarenceux; with some later additions. This volume contains many Drawings of Monuments, Copies of Arms, &c. from painted windows, of some of which few or no vestiges are elsewhere to be found.

A Volume of Charles's Collections, in part illustrated by Drawings of Seals and Arms, is also preserved in the Cottonian MS. Julius C. vii.

The Harl. MS. 1349 contains various other matters illustrative of the City and Citizens

Charles survived the completion of this Visitation a very short time; but it was not until some years after that Camden brought into the Office the Return of the Visitation taken under his authority, as appears from the following Note on the first page of the Book in the College of Arms, viz.

“ This Booke, conteyning the Visitaçõn of Huntingdonshire, by Nicholas Charles, Lancaster, in anno 1613, delivered into the Office the 5 day of Marche 1621 by William Camden, Clarenceux King of Armes. “ In the presence of the whole office.”

The next leaf bears the autograph of Charles.

The volume thus described and identified, and remaining in the Library of the College of Arms, is marked C. 3. Huntington 1613.

On comparison of the Cottonian MS. with this it is evident that Charles must have made a copy for himself almost simultaneously, as the variations are so trifling that the two manuscripts may be considered almost fac-simile of each other. To his own copy he has appended transcripts of the Commission to Clarenceux and of his own Deputation; of his summons to the Baylif of the Hundred of Normancross, for the Knights, Esquires, and Gentlemen of that Hundred, to appear before him for the purposes of the Visitation; of the Proclamation for disclaiming of such as had usurped the title of Gentlemen; and his Summons to defaulters to appear before the Earl Marshal.

Two other copies of Charles's Visitation of the County of Huntingdon may be found among the Harleian MSS. Nos. 1075 and 1179.

Gough, Brit. Top. vol. ii. p. 230, says, “ Le Neve had a Visitation of Staffordshire by Nicholas Charles, Lancaster.” He adds, *ibid.* p. 243, that Sir John Cullum had Nicholas Charles's copy of Harvey's Visitation of Suffolk; but no such MS. as this is, at present, in the Library at Hardwick.

The Editor has now only to express his kindest thanks to *Sir* CHARLES GEORGE YOUNG, GARTER, for obligingly collating the proof sheets of the present Volume with the original Visitation in the Library of the College of Arms ; and also for the Account of Nicholas Charles given in the present Preface.

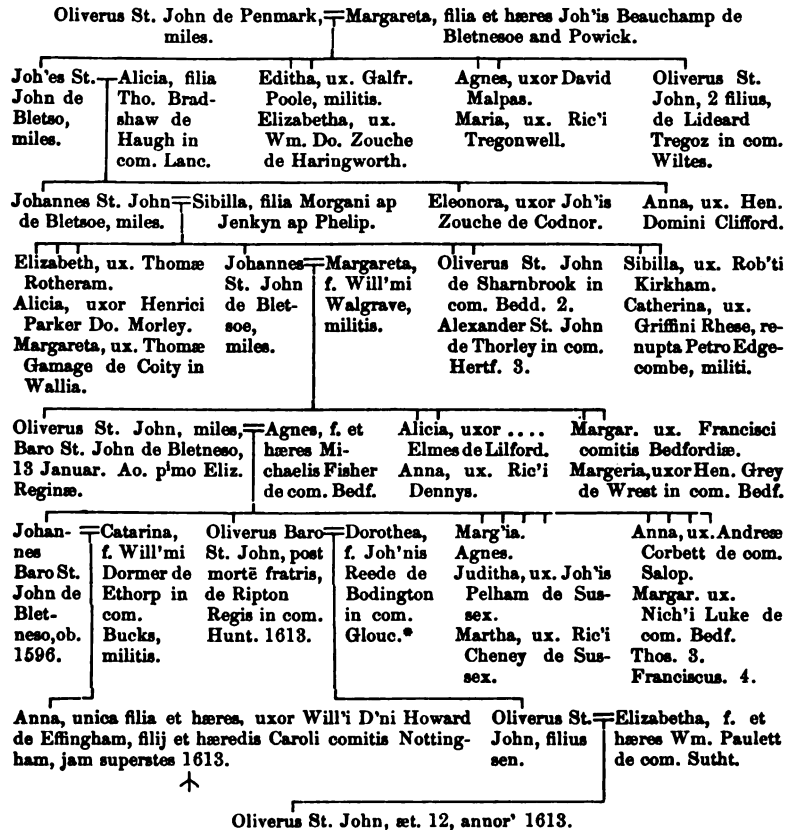

This was the copy of a very ould deed (translated into English) circa t'p'e H. 2.

All men may know that are present and to come, that I, Myghell, the sunne of Myghell of Walton, have given, granted, and by this my p'sent writing have confirmed unto Walter Beiuyle, for his homage and service, one parcell of my wood, wth y^e land, that is to say, of the land of Robert Beiuyle, w^{ch} is called the Westcrofte, extending to the baulke of Rauff, y^e sonne of Giles, and so from that baulke by the baulke of Richard y^e sonne of Hubert, unto y^e wood of the monkes of Sautrye, and ayen by the division w^{ch} doth extend itself betweene Westfelde unto y^e Fyssermere unto y^e tillage w^{ch} is called Rucrofte, &c. To have and to hould &c. yielding therfore yearely to me and my heyres one penny, that is to say, at Cristmas, for all mann' of service, &c. TO MR. ROBERT CASTLE OF GLATTON.

Whereas by vertue of his Mat's cōmission under the Great Seale of England you were warned by the bayliiff of the hundred of Normancrosse to apeare before me Lancaster Herald of Armes at Stilton, where I satt in his Ma^{ty}s behalf and service to register all the gentlemen of name and of armes wthin the same hundred, according to the tenour of his Ma^{ty}s said Cōmission ; and you not only made default of appearance there, but after, by myself being warned to Huntingdon, have likewise made default of your aparaunce there also, to the hindrance of his Majesties service and contempt of the Great Seale of England. And forasmuch as I fynde in the last Visitation of this shire, which was about the beginning of the reigne of the late Queene Elizabeth of happy memory, that your family had then no Coate of Armes prooved or allowed unto them, and that since that tyme you have falsly and wthout true ground usurped the auncient armes of one Castle of Warwickshire, these are therefore to require you, and in his Ma^{ty}s name streightly to charge and command you, that from henceforth you do not only forbear the using or bearing of the said armes wth you have hitherto usurped against all right and custome of the lawe of armes, but also any other armes whatsoever, untill you know the Earle Marshall's pléasure therein ; and hereof fayle you not, as you will aunswere the contrary at your perill for your further contempt hereof. Given under my hand at Huntingdon the 28 day of August, A^o. Dⁿⁱ 1613, and in the eleventh yeare of his Ma^{ty}s reigne of England, France, and Ireland, and of Scotland the seaven and fourtieth.

HIS MA^{ty} COMISSION TO CLARENCEUX FOR HIS VISITATION.

JAMES, by the grace of God King of England, Scotland, Fraunce, and Ireland, Defendor of the Fayth, &c. To our trusty and welbeloved servaunt William Camden, Esquire, surnamed Clarencieulx, Kinge of Armes of the east, west, and south parts of our realme of England, from the ryver of Trent southward, and to all other our loving subjects, greeting. Forasmuch as God of his great clemency and goodnes hath subjected to our empire and governaunce the Nobility, People, and Cōmons of this Realme of England, wee mynding of our royall and absolute power to us comytted to visite, survey, and viewe throughout all our realme of England, and other our dominions, as well for a due order to be kept and observed in all thinges touching the office and dueties appertayning to Armes, as also for reformation of dyvers and sondrie abuses and disorders daily arising and growing for want of ordinarie Visitations, Surveys, and Viewes in tymes convenient, according to the auncient forme and laudable custome of the lawes of Armes; and that the nobility of this realme may bee preserved in everie degree as appertayneth as well in honour as in worship; and that every person and persons, bodyes politique, corporate, and others may bee the better knowne in his and their estate, degree, and misterye, without confusion or disorder, have therefore constituted, deputed, ordayned, and appointed for us and in our name our sayd welbeloved servaunt William Camden, Esquier, alias Clarencieulx, King of Armes in the sayd east, west, and south parts of our Realme of England, from the sayd ryver of Trent southward, to visite all the sayd Province, and the parts and members thereof, appertayning to the offyce and charge of the said Clarencieulx Kinge of Armes, from tyme to tyme, as often and when as he shall thinke most necessarie and convenient for the same; and not only to enter into all churches, castles, houses, and other places at his discretion, to peruse and take knowledge, survey, and viewe of all manner of armes, cognizances, crests, and other devyses of Armes of all and singular our subjects, as well bodyes politique as others, within the sayd Province, of what dignity or degree, estate, or misterie soever they bee, lawfully authorized to have, use, or beare any such armes, cognizaunces, crests, and other like devyses, with the notes of their descents, pedigrees, and mariages; and the same to enter of record in a Register Booke of Armes, according to such order as is prescribed and sett forth in the offyce, charge, and oathe taken by our said servaunt at his creation and coronation; but also to correct, comptroll, and reforme all manner of armes, crests, cognizances, and devyses, unlawfull or unlawfully usurped, borne, or taken by any manner person or persons within the same Province, contrary to the due order of the lawe of Armes; and the same to reverse, pull downe, or otherwise deface, at his discretion, as well in cote armes, helme, standards, pennons, and hatchments of tent and pavilions, as also in plate, jewells, paper, parchment, windowes, gravestones, and monuments, or elsewhere wheresoever they bee sett or placed, whether they bee in shiell, scutcheon, lozenge, square, rondell, or otherwise howsoever, contrary to the antiquity and auntyent lawes, customes, rules, priviledges, and orders of Armes; and further, Wee by theise presents doe give and graunt to the sayd Clarencieulx foli

power and authority to reprove, comptroll, and make infamous by proclamation to be made at the Assizes or generall Sessions within the same his Province to bee had and kepte, or at such other place or places as hee or they shall thinke most meete and convenient, all and all manner of person or persons that unlawfully and without just authoritie, vocation, or due calling, doe or have, or shall usurpe, to take upon him or them any manner of title of honor or dignitie, as esquier, gentleman, or other; and likewise to reforme and comptroll all such as at any funeralls or interrements shall use or weare any mourning apparell, as gownes, hoodes, tippetts, or such like, contrary to the order lymitted and prescribed in the tyme of the Most Noble Prince Kinge Henry, of famous memory, the Seaventh, our grandfather, otherwise or in any other sort then to their estates and degrees doth appertayne. And furthermore, by these presents wee prohibit and forbid that no paynter, glasyer, gouldsmyth, graver, or any other artyficer, whatsoever hee or they bee, within the sayd province of the sayd Clarencieulx, shall take upon them to paynte, grave, glase, devyse, or sett forth by any wayes or meanes any manner of armes, crests, cognizances, pedigrees, or other devyses appertayning to the offyce of Armes, otherwise or in any other fourme or manner then they may lawfully doe and shalbee allowed by the sayd Clarencieulx, his deputy or deputies, according to the auncient lawes and statutes of armes; and wee forbyd and straightly cōmaunde all our sheriffs, comissioners, archdeacons, officials, seryvenours, clarks, wryters, or other whatsoever they bee, to call, name, or write in any assize, sessyons, court, or other open place or places, or else to use in any writing the addition of esquyre or gentleman, unlesse they bee able to stand unto and justifie the same by the lawe of Armes of our realme, or else bee ascerteyned thereof by advertisement in writing from the sayd Clarencieulx King of Armes, or his deputye or deputyes, attorney or attorneys; and further wee straightly charge and cōmaunde that no other person or persons shall intromytt or meddle with any thinge or thinges touching and concerning the office of Armes within the sayd Province, without speciall lycence and authoritie of the sayd Clarencieulx, in writing, under the seale of the sayd offyce first had and obtayned from the sayd Clarencieulx; all the which sayd power, preheminence, jurisdiction, and authoritie above specified, for us, our heyres, and successors, wee doe give and graunt by theise presents to the sayd William Camden, alias Clarencieulx, during his naturall lyfe, in as large and ample manner and forme in everie thinge and things as any his predecessors, or anye other bearing the name or tyle of Clarencieulx, have or had, dyd or might doe by force of any letters patents graunted by any of our predecessors, or as of right hee or they ought or might have used to doe and exercise by force of his sayd office, with all manner of profyts, advantages, and emoluments thereunto belonging: Wherefore wee will and straightly charge and cōmaunde all and singular our justices, sheryffs, mayors, bayliffs, and all other our offyceers, mynisters, and constables, and all and everie our loving subjects, that in the execution of the premisses they effectually employe their best ayde, assistaunce, furtherance, and counsaile to our sayd servaunt, his deputye or deputyes, so often and when as hee or any of them shall require the same, in all that they conveniently may, as they tender our favour, and will aunswere the contrary at their perill; and further, by theise presents wee doe authorize our sayd servaunt to nominate and appoint, under the seale of his sayd office, so many deputyes or attorneys as shalbe

thought to him expedient, for the better execution of all and singular the premises ; and if there fortune to fall out in this Visitation any manner of scruple, doubt, question, or any misdemeanor of any person or persons whatsoever that cannot bee conveniently bee decided or ended by our sayd servaunt, or by such deputye or deputyes, or attorneys, as hee under the seale of his sayd offyce shall name and appoint, then our mynde and pleasure is that our sayd servaunt, his deputye, deputyes, or attorneyes named as is aforesayd, shall commaund such persons or persons whome the sayd question, scruple, or misdemeanor shall concerne, under a certeine payne, and at a certen daye, to appeare before the Earl Marshall of England for the tyme, before whome the sayd scruple, question, or misdemeanour shalbe heard and ordered, according to the lawes and custome of Armes in that case provided, and of auncient tyme used, any statute, lawe, proclamation, custome or usage to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding. In witnes whereof, wee have caused these our letters to bee made patents. Witnes ourselfe, at Harfeild, the fyfth day of August, in the fyrst yere of our raigne of England, Fraunce, and Ireland, and of Scotland the seaven and thirtieth.

CLARENCEUX DEPUTATION TO LANCASTER HERALD OF ARMES.

To all to whome this presente writinge shall come, William Camden Esquire, al's Clarencieux Kinge of Armes of the east, west, and south parts of the realme of England, from the river of Trent southward, greeting in our Lord God everlasting. Whereas our Sovereigne Lord Kinge James, the Kinges Ma^{tie} that now is, by his Highnes Letters Patents under the Great Seale of England, bearing date at Harfeild, the fifth daye of August, in the first yere of his Highnes reigne, hath constituted, deputed, ordeined, and appointed the sayd William Camden, by the name of his said welbeloved servaunt William Camden Esquire, alias Clarencieux Kinge of Armes in the said east, west, and south parts of the realme of England, from the sayd river of Trent southward, to visite all the sayd Province, and the parts and members thereof appertayning to the office and charge of the sayd Clarencieux Kinge of Armes, from tyme to tyme, as often and when as hee shall thinke most necessarie and convenient for the same ; and not onely to enter into all churches, castles, houses, and other places at his discretion, to peruse and take knowledg, surveye, and viewe of all manner of armes, cognizaunces, crestes, and other devises of armes, of all and singular his Highnes subjects, as well bodies polittique as others within the sayd Province, of what dignitie or degree, estate, or mysterie soever they bee, lawfully authorized to have, use, or beare any such armes, cognizances, crests, and other like devises, with the notes of their descents, pedegrees, and marriages ; and the same to enter of record in a register booke of armes, according to such order as is prescribed and sett forth in the

office, charge, and oath taken by his Highnes sayd servaunt at his creation and coronation; but also to correct, comptroll, and reforme all manner of armes, crests, cognizances, and devises, unlawfull or unlawfully usurped, borne, or taken by any manner person or persons within the same Province, contrarie to the due order of the law of Armes, and the same to reverse, pull downe, or otherwise deface at his discretion, as well in coate armes, helme, standards, pennons, and hatchments of tents and pavilions, as also in plate, jewels, paper, parchment, windowes, grave-stones, and monuments, or elsewhere wheresoever they bee sett or placed, whether they bee in sheild, schochen, lozenge, square, rondell, or otherwise howsoever, contrarie to the antiquitie and auncient lawes, customes, rules, priviledges, and orders of Armes; and further, his Highnes hath given and graunted to the said Clarencieulx full power and authoritie to reprove, controwle, and make infamous by proclamation to bee made at the assizes or generall sessions within the same his Province to bee had and kept, or at such other place or places as hee or they shall thinke most meete and convenient, all and all manner of person or persons that unlawfully and without just authoritie, vocation, or dewe calling, doe or have done, or shall usurpe or take upon him or them any manner of title, honour, or dignity, as esquire, gentleman. And likewise to reforme and controwle all such as at any funerall or interments shall use or weare any mourning apparell, as gownes, hoods, tippetts, or such like, contrarie to the order lynitted and prescribed in the tyme of the most noble Prince King Henrie, of famous memorie, the Seaventh, otherwise or in any other sort then to their estates and degrees doth or shall appertayne; and furthermore, his Highnes doth prohibite and forbid that no painter, glasier, gouldsmith, graver, or any other artificer, whatsoever hee or they bee, within the said Province of the said Clarencieulx, shall take upon them to painte, grave, glase, devise, or sett fourth by any wayes or meanes any manner of armes, crests, cognizances, pedegrees, or other devise appertayning to the Office of Armes, otherwise or in any other forme or manner then they may lawfully doe and shalbee allowed by the sayd Clarencieulx, his deputie or deputies, according to the auncient lawes and statutes of armes; and his Highnes doth forbid and streightly comaund all sheriffs, cōmissioners, arch-deacons, officialls, scriveners, clarkes, writers, or others, whatsoever they bee, to call, name, or write in any assize, sessions, court, and other open place or places, or else to use in any writing, the addition of esquire or gentleman, unless they bee able to stand unto and justifie the same by the law of Armes of his Highnes sayd Realme, or else to bee asserted thereof by advertisement in writing from the sayd Clarencieulx Kinge of Armes, his deputie or deputies, attorney or attorneyes. And furthermore, his Highnes doth straightly charge and comaund that no other person or persons shall intromitt or meddle in any thinge or thinges touching or concerning the Office of Armes, within the sayd Province, without speciall licence and authoritie of the sayd Clarencieulx, in writing, under the seale of the sayd office first had and obeyned from the said Clarencieulx: all the which sayd power, prebeminence, jurisdiction, and authoritie above recited, his Highnes, for himselfe, his heires, and successors, doth give and graunt to the sayd William Camden, al's Clarencieulx, during the naturall life of the sayd Clarencieulx, in as large and ample manner and forme in every thinge and thinges as any his predecessors, or any other bearing the name or title of Clarencieulx, have or had, did or might doe by

force of any letters patents graunted by any of his Highnes predecessors, as of right hee or they ought or might have used to doe and exercise by force of his sayde office, with all manner of profitts, advantages, and emoluments thereunto belonging, as by the sayd recited letters patents, amongst other thinges, further power and authorittie thereby graunted and therein conteyned more at large it doth and will appeare. NOW KNOW YE, that the said William Camden, al's Clarencieulx, for divers good causes and considerations him thereunto moving, hath appointed, constituted, ordeyned, deputed, and made, and by theis presents doth appoint, constitute, ordeyne, depute, and make NICHOLAS CHARLES, al's Lancaster Herald, and his assignes, his true and lawfull marshall, deputie and deputies, attorney and attornyes, in and for the sayd office of Clarencieulx King of Armes, within the severall counties of Huntingdon and Cambridg, and not elsewhere, lawfully to doe, execute, exercise, performe, and finishe all and everie act, deed, thinge, and things whatsoever, needful, requiaite. or necessarie to bee executed, done, and performed, touching or concerning all or any the premisses before recited and mentioned or contained in and by the sayd recited Letters Patents, for and during one whole yeare now next ensuing, (if the sayd William Camden, al's Clarencieulx, shall so long live,) except only graunting and confirming of Armes and Crests; and also that the sayd Nicholas Charles, al's Lancaster, and his assignes, shall and may take and receive, to the use of the said William Camden, al's Clarencieulx, all fees, duties, profitts, and commodities whatsoever accrewing, cominge, growing, or arising unto the sayd William Camden, al's Clarencieulx, by vertue of the office aforesayd, by or uppon any Visitation or Visitations within the said counties of Huntingdon and Cambridg aforesayd, during and untill the nyne and twentieth days of September, which shalbee in the yeare of our Lord God one thousand sixe hundred and foureteene (except before excepted), in as ample manner and forme in all respects as the said William Camden, al's Clarencieulx, may, might, or could doe in any wise. In witnes whereof, the said William Camden, al's Clarencieulx, hath hereunto sett his hand and seale of his office aforesayd, dated the two and twentieth days of July, 1613, and in the eleaventh yeare of our sayd Sov'eigne Lord James, by the grace of God Kinge of England, Fraunce, and Ireland, Defendor of the Faith, &c. and of Scotland the sixe and fortieth.

THE PROCLAMATION FOR DISCLAYMING OF SUCH AS HAVE USURPED THE TITLE OF GENTLEMEN.

The King's Most Excellent Ma^{tie} being desirous that the nobility and gentry of this his realme should bee preserved in every degree as well in honor as in worship, and that every person and persons, bodyes corporate and others, should bee knowne in their estates and mysteries, without confusion and disorder, hath authorized mee, Lancaster Herald, as marshall and deputy to Clarenceux, Kinge of Armes of the south parts of this realme of England, not onely to visite all this sayd Province, to peruse and take knowledg, survey, and view of all manner of armes, cognizances, and crests, and other like devises, with the notes of the discenta, pedigrees, and marriages of all the nobility and gentry therein throughout conteyned, but also to reprove, controwle, and make infamous by proclamation all such as unlawfully and without just authority, vocation, or due calling, doe or have done, or shall usurpe or take upon them any name or title of honour or dignity, as esquire or gentleman, or other, as by his Highnes gracious Comission under the Greate Seale of England, more plainly may appeare. Know yee therefore that I, the said Lan-

caster Herald, for the accomplishment of his Ma^{ties} desire, and furtherance of his Highnes service that way, at this present making Survey within the county of Huntingdon, have found these persons whose names are hereunder written, presumptuously and without any good ground or authority to have usurped the name and title of gentlemen contrary to all right, and to the auncient custome of this land, and the usage of the law of armes; which name and title they are from henceforth no more to use or take upon them, upon such further paine and perill, as by the Earle Marshall, or his Ma^{ties} most honorable cōmissioners for the executing of the office of earl marshall of England, shalbee inflicted and layd upon them: whereof also I thought good hereby to advertise all other his Ma^{ties} good and loving subjects within the sayd county, that as they tender his Highnes pleasure and desire in this behalfe, they from henceforth shunne and avoyd the like, and forbear to use in any writing or otherwise the addition of an esquire or gentleman, unlesse they bee able to justifie the same by the law of armes and the law of the realme. WHEREAS by vertue of a cōmission under the Great Seale of England, you were warned by the bayliff of the Hundred of Normancrosse, to appeare before mee Lancaster Herald of Armes, at Stilton, where I satt in his Ma^{ties} behalf and service to register all the gentlemen of name and of armes within the sayd Hundred according to the tenour of his Ma^{ties} sayd Comission, and to disclayme all such as falsely and without good ground have usurped the name and title of gentlemen. Now forasmuch as you have made default of your appearance, to the hinderance of his Ma^{ties} service and contempt of the Great Seale of England, these are to cōmaunde you in his Ma^{ties} name, that you appeare personally on the first daye of November next ensuing the date hereof, before the Earle Marshall of England, there to aunswere your contempts; and hereof fayle you not, as you will forfeite tenne pounds the man unto the King's Ma^{tie}, or any other the perills that may ensue of any their contempts.
