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Preface.

THE County of Worcester appears to have been visited by the officers of the College of Arms on four several occasions, viz., in 1530 by Benolte, in 1569 by Cooke, in 1634 by St. George and Borough, and finally in 1682-3 by St. George or his deputies.

The only one of these Visitations which has yet appeared in print is the last, which was edited by Mr. W. C. METCALFE, and published in 1883.

As will be seen below, according to Add. MS. 19816, this county is said to have been "visited" in 1574 by RICHARD LEE, Portcullis, though this is scarcely probable, since the second Visitation took place only five years before that date.

No copies of the Visitations of 1530 and 1634 appear to exist outside the College of Arms. It is needful to mention this, as for a long time it was announced that the Visitations of 1569 and 1634 were among the prospective issues of the Society. As is well known, the records of the College of Arms are not available for publication, and this intention had consequently to be abandoned, for inquiry shewed that no copy of the latter is known to exist outside the College of Arms, although the statement is made by Sims in his well-known Manual, that the British Museum possesses such a transcript in the Additional MS. No. 19816. It is true that that volume is labelled "Visitation of Worcestershire 1634 and Arms 1574," but that has been done by the binder in evident error. The first portion is occupied with the "Visitation" of Norfolk in 1563, and a miscellaneous collection of pedigrees by Sir William Dethick. Folio 100 commences a collection, also separately folioed, of Worcestershire pedigrees, the first of which is the genealogy of Wheeler, the head of that family being Gilbert Wheeler, described as "of Droitwich 1634." The collection of pedigrees terminates with tricks of the arms of "Cratford 1634" on fo. 33, those of "Evett 1634," and a pedigree of Baker of Northfield, dated 20 June 1640, and attested by WILLIAM RYLEY, Lancaster; and finally, on fo. 37, with a pedigree of Vernon, with the date of 1634. None of the intervening genealogies bear any internal evidence that they are taken from that Visitation, as those of Wheeler and Vernon evidently are, and the manuscript is nothing more than a miscellaneous collection of Worcestershire pedigrees, most of which are accompanied by tricks of arms indifferently executed. This blunder of styling this collection the Visitation of Worcestershire in 1634, it will clearly be seen, has arisen from a careless examination of the manuscript.

Scarcely any dates appear in these pedigrees. There is on folios 1 and 2 a pedigree of Vincent anciently Lovell, in which Henry Vincent and Edward Vincent are respectively described as of London and Kinfare in 1612; and an entry on folio 15, relating to Andrews of Hambury (see p. 9, post), which is given below:

"Memorandum that I Humfrey Andrewes of Hunbury in the Countie of Worcester gent. doe promise and by these presents doe bynde myself to make proofe unto Mr Clarencieulx King of Arms for the bearing of these arms herein depicted at the feast of St Michael the Archaungell next following after the date hereof or after. In witness whereof I have sett hereunto my hand this 12th day of June in Anno Domini 1569.

"By me HUMFREY ANDREWES."

To these pedigrees there is an index, which is followed by a "Catalogue of the Gentry in the County of Worcester in 1669," or possibly 1660, for the handwriting is not quite clear.

On folio 45^b appears the following:

"The Visitation for Worcestershire, taken by RICHARD LEE, Gent., als. Portcullis, Marshall to Clarencieulx, Anno Dom. 1574."

After which comes a list of Worcestershire families, with references to their arms, which are tricked in the ensuing folios. This list we here reproduce:—

The present volume of Worcestershire pedigrees, issued to the members of the Harleian Society under the title of 'The Visitation of Worcestershire in 1569,' is the result of a careful collation of four manuscripts now preserved in the British Museum. They are in the Harleian Collection, and are respectively numbered 1043, 1352, 1486, and 1566.

The most reliable manuscript, which is in the handwriting of RICHARD MUNDY, the herald painter, appears to be the last, and is the only one which contains any memorandum to shew its purport. This memorandum occurs at the commencement, and is—

"The Vissitation of ye County of Worcester mad in Ano 1569 with many other pedigrees of ye same county transcript p' R. Mundy."

Harl. 1048 has, however, been selected as the basis of the present volume, as it probably more nearly represents the Visitation of 1569 than does Richard Mundy's book of "laboured" pedigrees. This manuscript is bound up with what purports to be a copy of the Cambridgeshire Visitation of 1619. It is written in a small running hand, with the addition of rough tricks of arms. The Worcestershire portion of the volume commences with what is clearly a list of the Sheriffs of that county, mostly undated, but which is brought down to the year 17 James I., i.e. 1619-20, which is evidently the date of the manuscript, some of the pedigrees being brought down to that year. It has not been thought necessary to print this rough list, as it is of little value as an authority.

Harl. 1352 is a small quarto manuscript, labelled "Worcestershire, 1569," and bound up with tricks of the arms of the Oxford and Cambridge Colleges. The coats of arms are neatly tricked, usually at the foot of each page. The variations or additions found in this manuscript are indicated in the following pages by the use of parentheses ().

Harl. 1486 is a folio, bound up with the Visitation of Derbyshire in 1611. The handwriting is large and legible, but the tricks of arms are roughly executed. It is not apparently a manuscript of any great value. Such additions or variations as it contains are indicated by square brackets [].

The bulk of each pedigree is printed in this volume in roman type, and additions or variations, whether from Harl. 1043 or Harl. 1566, are given in italics. For typographical reasons this course seemed better than adopting the alternative of confining the use of roman or italic type to any particular manuscript, as in such case many pedigrees would have been printed wholly in the latter style. The student will have no difficulty in distinguishing in any pedigree from what manuscript the respective portions are taken. The pedigrees, for reasons of convenience, have been rearranged in alphabetical order, but the exact reference in each case is given.

In the Library of Queen's College, Oxford, is a manuscript copy of the Visitation of 1569, which does not appear to materially vary from viii PREFACE.

the present collection in the pedigrees which it contains; want of leisure, however, prevented the Editor from visiting Oxford for the purpose of collating this manuscript.

It may be as well to give the reference to the copies of this Visitation which are preserved in the College of Arms. They are respectively D 12 and G 9. The College also possesses another copy, with additions, in the Vincent MS. No. 115.

The irregular orthography has been retained, but usually no attempt has been made to indicate the variations in spelling between the different manuscripts, unless such refer to surnames. Every care has been taken to ensure accuracy, and in the slightest case of doubt the proof has been collated with the originals. Still it is too much to hope that no errors have crept in.

Useful as the present issue by the Harleian Society must be to students of Worcestershire family history, still it should be viewed as merely a rough guide, which cannot supersede the necessity of separate investigation. In this respect it is of course no better nor worse than many other manuscript volumes which are preserved in the Harleian Collection at the British Museum.

I have to acknowledge the willing assistance rendered me by Mr. J. Eedes, by whom the transcript for the press was made with his usual accuracy. I am indebted to my friend Mr. W. C. Metcalfe, the Editor of the 'Visitation of the County of Worcester in 1682-3,' for permission to reproduce the woodcuts of the seals belonging to the City of Worcester, and also those of Evesham and Kidderminster. The thanks of the Society are likewise due to the Town Clerk of Droitwich, who supplied an impression of the common seal of that borough, an engraving of which is also given.

Rules.

- 1. This Society shall be called the HARLEIAN SOCIETY.
- 2. It shall have for its chief object the publication of the Heraldic Visitations of Counties, and any manuscripts relating to Genealogy, Family History, and Heraldry, selected by the Council.
- 3. The Council shall consist of a President, nine Vice-Presidents, and twelve Members of Council, two of whom shall hold the posts of Secretary and Treasurer; and any four, including the Treasurer or Secretary, shall form a quorum. In case of equality of votes, the Chairman to have a casting vote. Any Candidate may be elected with the consent in writing of one Member of the Council, the Treasurer, and the Secretary.
- 4. Three Members of the Council shall retire in rotation annually, but shall be eligible for re-election.
- 5. The Annual Subscription shall be One Guinea, paid in advance, and due on the 1st day of January in each year; and new Members shall pay an Entrance Fee of 10s. 6d. in addition to their first Annual Subscription.
- 6. Members may at their option subscribe Two Guineas per annum, in which case they will be entitled to the publications of the Register Section of the Society.
- 7. The funds raised by the Society shall be expended in publishing such works as are selected by the Council; but no payment in money shall be made to any person for editing any work for the Society.
 - 8. One volume at least shall be supplied to the Members every year.
- 9. An Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of January every year, at such time and place as the Council may direct; and due notice shall be sent to the Members of the Society at least a fortnight previously.
- 10. No work shall be supplied to any Member unless his Subscription for the year be paid; and any Member not having paid his Subscription for two years, having received notice thereof, shall cease to belong to the Society.
- 11. No copies of the publications of the Society shall be supplied to persons not actually Members, and each Member shall be restricted to a single Subscription.
- 12. An account of the receipts and expenses of the Society to be made up to the 31st of December in each year, and published with a list of the Members and the Rules of the Society in the following Volume.
- 13. These Rules shall not be altered except at the Annual Meeting, and three clear weeks' notice must be given to the Secretary of any such intended alteration.

Report for the Pear 1887.

THE Council have to report that thirty-four new Members have joined the Society since the last Annual Meeting, and the name of one Member, which had been removed in error, has been restored to the Roll.

The Society has during the same period lost ten Members by death, twelve Members have resigned, and the name of one Member has been removed under Rule X.

In the Register Section there are sixteen new names, one name has been restored to the Roll; and there have been two deaths and two resignations.

The number of Members now on the Roll is three hundred and sixty-six, of whom one hundred and eighty-eight are subscribers to the Register Section. The Society is, therefore, numerically stronger, by twelve Members, than it was last year.

Volumes XXV. and XXVI. of the ordinary Publications, being the "Marriage Licences issued by the Bishop of London between 1520 and 1828," were issued to Members early in the year.

The "Visitation of Worcestershire in 1569," under the editorship of Mr. W. P. W. PHILLIMORE, is now in the Printers' hands, and will be the ordinary Publication for 1888.

The First Volume of the "Marriage Registers of St. George, Hanover Square," edited by Mr. Chapman, was issued early in the year, and forms Volume XI. of the Register Section.

For Volume XII., "The Registers of Stourton," the Members are indebted to the Editor, the Rev. John Henry Ellis, M.A., Rector of the Parish, who most generously placed the printed sheets at the disposal of the Society.

Volume XIII., which has also been issued, contains the "Marriage Register of St. James, Clerkenwell, from 1551 to 1754," under the editorship of Mr. R. HOVENDEN.

Another Volume of the "Marriage Registers of St. George, Hanover Square," is in the Press, and will form Volume XIV., and be the Publication of the Register Section for 1888.

The Retiring Members of the Council are Mr. LEVESON GOWER, Mr. Armytage, and Dr. Howard, who offer themselves for re-election.

The Audited Balance Sheet for the year 1887 is appended to this Report.

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Rules.

- 1. This Society shall be called the HARLEIAN SOCIETY.
- 2. It shall have for its chief object the publication of the Heraldic Visitations of Counties, and any manuscripts relating to Genealogy, Family History, and Heraldry, selected by the Council.
- 3. The Council shall consist of a President, nine Vice-Presidents, and twelve Members of Council, two of whom shall hold the posts of Secretary and Treasurer; and any four, including the Treasurer or Secretary, shall form a quorum. In case of equality of votes, the Chairman to have a casting vote. Any Candidate may be elected with the consent in writing of one Member of the Council, the Treasurer, and the Secretary.
- 4. Three Members of the Council shall retire in rotation annually, but shall be eligible for re-election.
- 5. The Annual Subscription shall be One Guinea, paid in advance, and due on the 1st day of January in each year; and new Members shall pay an Entrance Fee of 10s. 6d. in addition to their first Annual Subscription.
- 6. Members may at their option subscribe Two Guineas per annum, in which case they will be entitled to the publications of the Register Section of the Society.
- 7. The funds raised by the Society shall be expended in publishing such works as are selected by the Council; but no payment in money shall be made to any person for editing any work for the Society.
 - 8. One volume at least shall be supplied to the Members every year.
- 9. An Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of January every year, at such time and place as the Council may direct; and due notice shall be sent to the Members of the Society at least a fortnight previously.
- 10. No work shall be supplied to any Member unless his Subscription for the year be paid; and any Member not having paid his Subscription for two years, having received notice thereof, shall cease to belong to the Society.
- 11. No copies of the publications of the Society shall be supplied to persons not actually Members, and each Member shall be restricted to a single Subscription.
- 12. An account of the receipts and expenses of the Society to be made up to the 31st of December in each year, and published with a list of the Members and the Rules of the Society in the following Volume.
- 13. These Rules shall not be altered except at the Annual Meeting, and three clear weeks' notice must be given to the Secretary of any such intended alteration.

Report for the Pear 1887.

THE Council have to report that thirty-four new Members have joined the Society since the last Annual Meeting, and the name of one Member, which had been removed in error, has been restored to the Roll.

The Society has during the same period lost ten Members by death, twelve Members have resigned, and the name of one Member has been removed under Rule X.

In the Register Section there are sixteen new names, one name has been restored to the Roll; and there have been two deaths and two resignations.

The number of Members now on the Roll is three hundred and sixty-six, of whom one hundred and eighty-eight are subscribers to the Register Section. The Society is, therefore, numerically stronger, by twelve Members, than it was last year.

Volumes XXV. and XXVI. of the ordinary Publications, being the "Marriage Licences issued by the Bishop of London between 1520 and 1828," were issued to Members early in the year.

The "Visitation of Worcestershire in 1569," under the editorship of Mr. W. P. W. PHILLIMORE, is now in the Printers' hands, and will be the ordinary Publication for 1888.

The First Volume of the "Marriage Registers of St. George, Hanover Square," edited by Mr. Chapman, was issued early in the year, and forms Volume XI. of the Register Section.

For Volume XII., "The Registers of Stourton," the Members are indebted to the Editor, the Rev. John Henry Ellis, M.A., Rector of the Parish, who most generously placed the printed sheets at the disposal of the Society.
